



## Gottlieb Georgii of Württemberg, Germany, New Jersey, and Connecticut

## 1. Introduction

The descendants of Gottlieb Georgii have been described in a previous monograph: “The Daniel O’Connell Family of Southington, Connecticut” from the point of view of the O’Connell family. We will refer to this document as the “O’Connell History”. Gottlieb’s son, William August, married Daniel O’Connell’s daughter, Sarah. In this monograph, we wish to expand the family tree of Gottlieb to include his German ancestry.

The current history will be referred to as the “Georgii History”. Some of the material from the O’Connell History will be repeated for the purpose of continuity, but the emphasis will be on Gottlieb and his ancestors. New material concerning his life in the United States will also be included. Some of this new history will be concerned with his early life, and the life of his descendants in New Jersey.

## 2. Gottlieb: The Early Years

Gottlieb Georgii was born in the municipality of Plüderhausen in the Stuttgart administrative region of the German state of Baden-Württemberg on 12 March 1869. His parents were Jacob Friederich Georgii and Luise Wilhelmine “Elise” Ober. Jacob’s parents were Georg Christoph Georgii and Anna Maria Banzhaf.

On 12 January 1889, a boy is born to Luise Maria Ober in Leonberg, also within the Stuttgart administrative region of Baden-Württemberg. The boy is named Jacob Gottlob Ober. He is illegitimate and the father is not named. The witnesses to the baptism on 21 January 1889 are Jacob Georgii of Plüderhausen and Maria Ober. Luise Maria Ober will later marry Gottlieb Georgii. Her parents are Carl Gottlieb Ober and Anna Maria Georgii. Anna Maria is the daughter of Georg Christoph Georgii and Anna Maria Banzhaf. Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Maria Ober are first cousins.

Gottlieb Georgii arrived in New York City on 31 May 1893 and passed through Ellis Island. He travelled aboard the German Ship Bremen in compartment B, amidships, and gave his intended destination as New York City. His occupation is basket maker. Gottlieb was listed as 26 years old; he was therefore born about 1869. His family name is spelled “Georgi” in the passenger manifest.

Luise Ober, now listed as Louise Ober, arrives in New York on 26 October 1893 and passed through Ellis Island. She departed from Bremen, Germany, on the ship Aller. Her age is given as 26, yielding a birth year of about 1867.

Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Ober were married on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan, New York. According to the marriage certificate, both were living at 537 E 11 Street in Manhattan. He was 25 years of age and she was 26; both are single. The birth places and parent names are the same as given above. The marriage was performed by a minister, whose name appears to be Francis G. Schneider, who lives at 109 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. The witnesses were Ernst and Barbara Strecker.

On 29 January 1895, a child by the name of Gottlob Georgii arrives in New York and passes through Ellis Island. Gottlob is 6 years old (born about 1889) and is accompanied by a 21 year, 9 month, old woman by the name of Mina Ober. Mina would have been born in the 1873 to 1874-time frame. Gottlob Georgii is Jacob Gottlob Ober, soon to be known as Charles Georgii. A WWI draft card gives Charles birth date as 12- January 1889 in Germany. We believe that Mina Ober is the sister of Luise Maria Ober: Wilhelmina Magdalena Ober, born 10 March 1873 in Leonberg, Baden Württemberg, Germany.

The New York City directories for 1897 and 1898 show Gottlieb Georgii, a basket maker, living at 634 E. 13<sup>th</sup> St. Note that the family name is spelled Georgii and there are a number of directory entries with the family name Georgi. The 1900 census for Manhattan shows Gottlieb and Louisa living on Avenue A with three children. Louisa claims to have been married 12 years.

1. Georgii, **Gottlieb**: Head. Born March 1870 in Germany, age 30, married 12 years. Immigration: 1893, occupation: basket maker.
2. Georgii, **Louisa**: wife. Born September 1867, Germany, age 32, married 12 years, 3 children, 3 children living. Immigration: 1893.
3. Georgii, **Charles**: son. Born January 1888, Germany, age 11. Occupation: school.
4. Georgii, **William**, son. Born April 1895, New York, age 5.
5. Georgii, **Adolph**, son. Born December 1897, New York, age 2.

Note that the census states that the youngest son, Adolph, was born in 1897. Adolph's WWI draft card, filed in 1918, states that he was born on 25 December 1896. The New York City birth index states, in one case, that he was born on 23 December 1896. Another New York index states that he was born on the 25<sup>th</sup> of December 1896. Assuming Adolph knew his own birth date, we will place it on Christmas Day, 25 December 1896.

William Georgii was born with the name Wilhelm August Georgii on 30 April 1895 in Manhattan. According to the birth certificate, the address of the birth is W535 11<sup>th</sup> Street, which is also the residence of his parents Gottlieb and Louise Marie Georgii. William will marry Sarah O'Connell. Their marriage is discussed in the O'Connell History.

By 1902, Gottlieb Georgii is listed in the city directory for Passaic, New Jersey. He is a basket maker living on Van Dyke Avenue near Jordan Avenue. The same is true in 1904 and 1906, though the area he lives in is called Wallington. His family name is again spelled "Georgi".

A 1905 New Jersey census lists him as a basket maker living in Carlstadt, Bergen County. Since city directories are usually a little out of date, The Georgii family probably moved to Carlstadt in the 1904 to 1905 time frame. The family name is spelled "Georgi".

1. Georgi, **Gottlieb**, born March 1868 in Germany, age 37. He is an alien living in the U.S. 11 years. Occupation: basket maker. Can read, write, and speak English.
2. Georgi, **Louisa**, born September 1867, in Germany, age 37, Occupation: house work. Can read write, and speak English
3. Georgi, **Charles**, born January 1889 in Germany, age 16. Occupation: apprentice.
4. Georgi, **Willie**, born April 1895, New York, age 10.
5. Georgi, **Adolph**, born December 1896, New York, age 8.

The 1909 Carlstadt city directory shows Gottlieb Georgii as a brass worker who works across the river in New York. He lives at 114 1<sup>st</sup> street in Carlstadt. Also listed at that location is Charles, a driver.

Louisa Ober Georgii died on 27 January in East Rutherford (Carlstadt) New Jersey. She is buried in the Berrylawn Cemetery. Louisa was only 41 years old. The 1910 federal census for Carlstadt lists Gottlieb and his three sons living on Monroe Street. The census was taken on 23 April 1910. Note that the family name is spelled Georgi.

1. Georgi, **Gottlieb**, Head, age 42, widower. Born in Germany, immigrated 1880. Occupation: polisher at brass works.
2. Georgi, **Charles**, son, age 21, **born New York**. Occupation: driver of grocery wagon.
3. Georgi, **William**, son, age 15, born New York.
4. Georgi, **Eddie**, son, age 13, born New York.

On 23 May 1912, Gottlieb applied for a passport. The application was made in Hoboken, Hudson, New Jersey. The family name is spelled Georgi. The document states that he was born in "Briedehausen", Wurttemberg, Germany on or about 12 March 1869. He probably had a strong German accent, so Plüderhausen became Briederhausen. The application continues to state that he emigrated to the United States, sailing on board the EMS from Bremen on or about 30 May 1893; that he resided 19

years uninterruptedly in the United States from 1893 to 1912 at Carlstadt, New Jersey. He was nationalized as a citizen of the United States before the Open Court of Common Pleas at Hackensack, New Jersey on 22 September 1905. Hackensack is in Bergen County. Gottlieb further testifies that his permanent residence is Carlstadt with the occupation of “foundry”. He plans to go abroad temporarily and return within two years.

The physical description of Gottlieb is as follows: age 43; height 5 feet 10 inches; forehead high; eyes blue; nose small; mouth mustache; chin broad; hair blonde; complexion light; face oval.

There is a passenger record for the arrival of a Gottlieb Georgi in New York on 1 August 1912. This Gottlieb arrived aboard the ship President Grant, which had departed Cuxhaven Germany on 20 July 1912. The age is correct for our Gottlieb (43), but other information is difficult to read. It is possible that Gottlieb returned to Germany for a short visit shortly after he received his passport.

The year 1914 shows the first foray of the Georgii family into Southington, Connecticut. Gottlieb “Georgi” is listed as a farmer with a home at Wonx Spring Road. near Marion Avenue in Plantsville (a village within Southington). Boarding at the same location are Adolph and William Georgi. Adolph and William are employed by H.D. Smith and Company. This company are “manufacturers of carriage and bicycle forgings”; they are located on W. Main Street in Plantsville.

We lose track of Gottlieb until 1920. Adolph has moved to Bridgeport, Connecticut according to that town’s directories for 1916 to 1919, and his WWI draft card dated 1918. The 1916 directory shows Adolph Georgi as a machinist rooming at 576 Broad Street. The 1918 directory shows Adolph “Georgia” as a machinist rooming at 532 Carroll. The same is true in the 1919 Bridgeport directory.

Despite the name variations, we know that this is Adolph Georgii because of the information on his WWI draft card, issued on 5 June 1918. According to the draft card, Adolph Georgii, age 21, resides at 532 Carroll Avenue, Bridgeport, Connecticut. He was born on 25-December 1896 in New York City. The name of his employer is J. Hennessy and his place of employment is the Lake Torpedo Boat Company in Bridgeport. His father was born in Germany. Adolph lists his father, Gottlieb Georgii, as his nearest relative, indicating that he is not married. Gottlieb’s address is given as Plantsville, Connecticut. We assume this is the Wonx Spring Road, near Marion Avenue, home. Adolph’s physical description is given as tall, medium build, with blue eyes and light hair.

William Georgii’s draft card, issued 5 June 1917, shows him as being single and living at the Marion Avenue home. William August Georgii is 22 years old, and living on Marion Avenue in Southington, Connecticut. He is a natural citizen born 29-April 1895 in New York, New York. William is an electroplater, employed by the Rowe Calk Company in Plantsville. He claims a draft exemption based upon “defective vision”. His physical description is tall, medium stature, with blue eyes and light hair. We should also note that there is nobody with the name Georgii, or anything similar, in the 1917 Southington Directory. William appears in the 1920 Southington directory, after he has married. Gottlieb does not appear in that directory, though he does appear in a New York census.



Charles Georgii, first son of Gottlieb, has changed his last name to “George” by the time of his 1917 draft registration. Charles George was listed as 28 years old on 5 June 1917. He lives at 773 Hunterdon, Newark, New Jersey. Charles is a naturalized citizen born on 12 January 1889 in Leonberg, Wurttemberg, Germany. He is employed as a salesman by E. Braun in Newark. Charles has a wife and two children and claims a draft exemption based upon his need to support a family. Charles is of medium height, medium build, with blue eyes and light hair. The 1917 Newark city directory shows an Edward A. Braun wholesale cheese Salesman. This is probably who Charles worked for. Charles George is shown in the 1918 Newark directory as a salesman with a home at 773 Hunterdon.

Charles George married Anna Radke about 1912 in New Jersey. His brother, William, married Sarah O’Connell in 1919, Southington, Connecticut. We will look at these families in a later section. Now, we will focus on Gottlieb’s life.

### 3. Gottlieb, the Later Years.

The 1920 census shows Gottlieb Georgii in Ridgewood New York, a borough of Queens. He is 50 years old on the day the data was taken: 14 January 1920. On his birthday, 12 March, he will be 51. Gottlieb’s occupation is farmer and he owns a farm. One could assume that this farm is in Queens, where he is living, but it might be his farm in Plantsville, Connecticut. Gottlieb is listed as the head of a family located at 37 Mount Olivet Avenue. His wife is listed as Catherine Georgii. One might ask why Gottlieb would leave Plantsville and go back to the New York in order to marry a widow with three grown sons. One possibility is that they already knew each other.

The 1920 federal census contains the following information:

1. Georgii, **Gottlieb**, head, age 50, born Germany, immigrated 1892, naturalized 1900. Gottlieb owns his home and it is mortgaged.
2. Georgii, **Catherine**, wife, age 52, born Germany, immigrated 1888, naturalized 1900.
3. Krapf, Fred, stepson, age 30, single, born New York. Occupation: clerk, burial, at cemetery office.
4. Krapf, Edward, stepson, age 22, single, born New York. Occupation: florist, own business.
5. Krapf, Carl, stepson, age 18, single, born New York. Occupation: placer, insurance broker.

Clearly, Catherine was once married to a man by the name of Krapf. It is not clear how long her relationship with Gottlieb has been going on, or whether they are actually married. We find a clue in the WWI draft card for Edward Henry Krapf, dated 24 August 1918. Edward Henry was born on 13 July 1897 in Mospeth, Queens, New York. He lives at 37 Mount Olivet Avenue in Maspeth, Queens. This is the address where he is self-employed. The name of his nearest relative is Catherine Georgii, who lives at the same address. This information supports the claim that Gottlieb and Catherine are married. Edward’s physical description is given as: height tall, stature medium, eyes blue, and hair brown.

There is also a draft card for Fred A. Krapf signed 5 June 1917. Fred is 27 years old, born 2 November 1889 in Queens, New York. His address is 37 Mount Olivet, in Queens, a natural born citizen. He is single and a clerk employed by Manamacker at Aster Place in New York City. Fred is tall with a medium

build. He has grey eyes and light hair. Manamaker must be a misspelling because I can find no such place or person. We know that he worked as a clerk in a cemetery.

The earliest record we have of this Krapf family is an 1892 New York census for Newtown, a borough in Queens. The borough is now named Elmhurst. We learn that Catherine was originally married to Edward Krapf, laborer, born in Germany. Their first child was born in Germany. The information in this New York census is as follows:

1. Krapf, **Edward**, age 28, born Germany. Occupation: laborer.
2. Krapf, Catherine, age 24, born Germany.
3. Krapf, Frederike, age 4, born Germany.
4. Krapf, Frederick, age 2, born United States.

Edward was born about 1864 in Germany. He and Catherine had their first child, a daughter, in Germany in 1888, so we assume they were married there about 1887. Their son Frederick (Fred) was born in the United States about 1890 (2 November 1889 in Queens), so we assume they immigrated to New York about 1889. We have not found such an immigration record. We have not found a marriage record in Germany or the United States. We do find a birth record for Eduard Heinrich Krapf. He was born on 6 October 1863 and baptized 11 October 1863 in Schorndorf, Württemberg, Germany. Today, Schorndorf is located in the Rems-Murr-Krei, Stuttgart Region of Baden-Württemberg. This is the same region as Plüderhausen where Gottlieb was born. If this is the same Edward Krapf, it is possible they knew the Georgii family.

We cannot find a 1900 federal census showing the Krapf family. We know that Catherine's son, Carl, was born about 1902 in Queens., so Edward died sometime between then and 1910. The 1910 census shows Catherine as the head of the family. At that time, Gottlieb is also a widower in Carlstadt, New Jersey and is living with his three sons. The 1910 census for Queens, New York, shows the following:

1. Krapf, **Catherine**, age 43, head, widow, born Germany.
2. Krapf, **Frederick**, age 20, son, born New York, Single. Occupation: fireman at crematory.
3. Krapf, **Bertha**, age 18, daughter, born New York, single. Occupation: weaver at silk mill.
4. Krapf, **Edward**, age 13, son, born New York.
5. Krapf, **Charles**, age 9, son, born New York.
6. Krapf, Frederick, age 25, nephew, single, born New York. Occupation: laborer florist.

A new daughter, Bertha, has been added to the family while another, Frederike, has left. Frederike probably was married. Bertha probably was born after the 1892 New York census data was taken. We also see that a nephew is living with the family and contributing some income. The son named Charles is probably the one named Carl in all the other records.

The relationship between Gottlieb and Catherine does not seem to have lasted for very long because a 1924 city directory for Southington shows him and a wife named Dora living at the Wonx Spring Road address in Plantsville. No occupation is given. His son, William A. Georgii has been married to Sarah O'Connell. He is employed by the Stanley Rule and Level Company in Plantsville. William and Sarah live



at 951 South Main Street in Plantsville. They were married on 30 April 1919 in Southington and had two children by 1924: William Paul (22 June 1920) and Mary Louise (4 August 1923). It is probably fair to believe that Mary Louise was named after her grandmother Luise Maria Ober.

The same directory information is given for Gottlieb and William in 1926. In the 1920 directory, however, William and Sarah have moved to Marion Avenue near Wonx Spring Road, while Gottlieb and Dora live at Wonx Spring Road at the corner of Marion Avenue. Since Wonx Spring forks off of Marion Avenue, they may live in the same house or in two homes on the same property. William works at what is now called the Stanley Works, while Gottlieb is again described as a basket maker. The 1929 directory repeats the same information. The 1930 directory shows the same for Gottlieb, but William and Sarah have moved to 114 West Main Street in Plantsville. He is now described as a steel temperor, presumably at the Stanley Works.

The remainder of the children of William and Sarah have been born by 1931. Daniel Robert was born on 9 October 1925; Adolph was born 27 November 1926; David Stephen was born 27 March 1928. We know from other sources that a second daughter, named Catherine, was still born about 1930.

It should be noted that we have not found any information about Gottlieb's son Adolph after 1919, when he was living in Bridgeport, Connecticut.

The 1930 national census for Gottlieb Georgii shows that he and Dora live on Wonx Spring Road, and includes the following information:

1. Georgii, **Gottlieb**, head, age 61, married, born Germany. Age at first marriage: 25. Gottlieb owns his home, which is valued at \$4000. He immigrated in 1893 and has been naturalized. Occupation: basket maker, own business.
2. Georgii, **Dora**, wife, age 66, married, born Germany. Age at first marriage: 21. Immigrated in 1891 and naturalized.

Note that Gottlieb was 25 years old when he was first married. This is consistent with being married to Luise Maria Ober on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan. Dora is older than Gottlieb. She was born about 1864 and immigrated from Germany in 1891 at the age of 27. Since she was 21 at the time of her first marriage, so she was originally married in Germany in 1885.

Meanwhile, back in Queens, New York, Catherine is using the name Krapf again; she is still living with her three sons. A 1925 New York census for Ridgewood Borough, Queens, shows the Krapf family still living 37 Mount Olivet on 1 June. The census includes the following information:

1. Krapf, **Catherine**, head, age 57, born Germany. Lived 37 years in the United States. Citizen by marriage. Occupation: housework.
2. Krapf, **Fred**, son, age 35, born United States. Occupation: office clerk.
3. Krapf, **Edward**, son, age 27, born United States. Occupation: florist.
4. Krapf, **Carl**, son, age 23, born United States. Occupation: broker office.

There is similar information in the 1930 federal census for Queens. The family is still living at 37 Mount Olivet on 15 April. Catherine, called Katharina, is listed as mother of the head of the house (Fred). She owns the home; it is valued at \$5000. The remainder of the information is as follows:

1. Krapf, **Katharina**, mother, age 62, born Germany, widow. Immigration 1888; citizenship: alien.
2. Krapf, **Fred A.**, head, age 40, born New York, single. Occupation: clerk Lutheran cemetery office.
3. Krapf, **Edward**, son, age 32, born New York, single. Occupation: florist at florist shop.
4. Krapf, **Carl W.**, son, age 28, born New York, single. Occupation: clerk insurance broker office.

Gottlieb Georgii is found at the Wonx Spring address in a 1933 Southington directory. William and Sarah are living at 305 Bristol Street in Plantsville. He is a hardener at the Stanley Works. However, by 1936, Gottlieb and Dora have moved to the town of New Britain, Connecticut. New Britain borders Southington to the North, so it is not a big move. They have a home at 321 Park Street. The address is the same in 1937. Gottlieb is listed as a basket maker working at this address.

Gottlieb Georgii died on 22 January 1938 in Southington, Connecticut. Presumably, his actual home was still in New Britain. We have no more information concerning Dora.

We have no more information concerning Catherine Krapf, except for a death index entry for a Katherine Krapf, age 73 (born about 1868) who died 24 April 1941 in Queens, New York. We do not find her in the 1940 census. There is a record for Fred A. Krapf in that census. He is living at 6729 Metropolitan Avenue with his wife Louise. There is no other family. This information is confirmed by his 1942 WWII draft card. The complete address is 6729 Metropolitan Avenue, Maspeth borough, Queens.

#### 4. Gottlieb's Children: Adolph and William Georgii

We have no additional information concerning Gottlieb's son Adolph, except that he attended the wedding of William and Sarah O'Connell. The O'Connell family was the subject of the afore mentioned O'Connell history. William was born 30 April 1895 in Manhattan, New York. Sarah was born 27 December 1892 in Wareham, Massachusetts. William and Sarah were married in Southington, Connecticut, on 30 April 1919. At the time of the marriage, as recorded on the marriage license,

William was 24 years old, lived on Marion Avenue in Plantsville, and worked as a mechanic. Sarah was 26 years of age and lived on Curtiss Street in Southington.

Sarah is the daughter of Daniel John O'Connell and Mary McNamara, who were married in Fall River, Massachusetts on 3 October 1887. Daniel was born on 5 April 1855 in Halifax, Canada. His father, John Thomas, was a member of the British army and was stationed in Halifax at the time of Daniel's birth. The family eventually moved to Merthyr Tydfil, Wales. Mary was born in July 1856 in Merthyr Tydfil.

It appears that William's brother, Adolph, came from Bridgeport to be in the wedding party. He appears in a photo showing the two, plus Sarah and her sister Ellen O'Connell.

The 1920 federal census shows William and Sarah Georgii living at 131 West Main Street in Plantsville Village, Southington, Connecticut. William is a drop forger in an iron forging factory. William is listed as being born in New Jersey, instead of New York. The census data, taken on 3 January 1920, is as follows:

1. Georgii, William, head, age 24, born New Jersey, home rented. Occupation: drop forger, iron forging factory.
2. Georgii, Sarah, wife, age 27, born Massachusetts.

The 1920 Southington directory shows William living at 113 West Main Street, Plantsville, not 131 West Main. His occupation is listed as machinist at the Blakeslee Forging Company in Plantsville. Blakeslee does drop forging and makes carriage hardware. In the 1924 directory, William and Sarah have moved 951 South Main in Plantsville. He works at the Stanley Rule and Level Company. This is also true in 1926. The 1927 directory shows them moving back to Marion Avenue, near Wonx Spring Road, near Gottlieb and Dora. William is employed by the Stanley Works, which we assume is the old Stanley Rule and Level Company. The information is the same in 1929. By 1930, the Southington directory shows William and Sarah moving to 114 West Main Street and William working as a steel "temperer", presumably at the Stanley Works.

At the time of the 1930 federal census for Plantsville Village in Southington, Connecticut, taken on 21 April, William and Sarah are still living on Marion Avenue. All his living children are born by this time. A daughter named Catherine was still born around 1930. The census data is as follows:

1. Georgii, William, head, age 35, born New York. Rents home at \$17 per month. Married at age 24. Occupation: hardener at hardening factory.
2. Georgii, Sarah, wife, age 37, born Massachusetts.
3. Georgii, William, Jr., son, age 10, born Connecticut.
4. Georgii, Mary, daughter, age 6, born Connecticut.
5. Georgii, Robert, son, age 4 7/12, born Connecticut.
6. Georgii, Adolph, son, age 3 6/12, born Connecticut.
7. Georgii, David, son, age 2 1/12, born Connecticut.

The 1933, 1936, 1938 and 1940 Southington directories show that William and Sarah have moved to 305 Bristol Street in Plantsville. William is still a hardener at the Stanley Works. The 1940 federal census for Southington, dated 6 April, confirms the Bristol Street address. The remainder of the data is:

1. Georgii, William A., head, age 44, born New Jersey. Highest grade of school completed: 8. Occupation: hardness tester, hardware.
2. Georgii, Sarah A., wife, age 46, born Massachusetts. Highest grade: 8.
3. Georgii, William, son, age 19, born Connecticut. Highest grade: 8. Occupation: electrician, electrical equipment.
4. Georgii, Mary, daughter, age 16, born Connecticut. Highest grade: High school – 1<sup>st</sup> year.
5. Georgii, Robert, son, age 14, born Connecticut. Highest grade: 7.
6. Georgii, Adolph, son, age 13, born Connecticut. Highest grade: 6.
7. Georgii, David, son, age 12, born Connecticut. Highest grade: 6.

By 1945, the Georgii family has moved to 50 East Summer Street in Plantsville. This will be the final home for William and Sarah. The 1947 Southington directory shows that all of the Georgii boys are still in the Armed Services. The information in the 1947 directory is as follows:

1. Georgii, William A. (Sarah A.), hardener, Stanley Tools. Resides 50 East Summer Street, Plantsville.
2. Georgii, Adolph in U.S. Navy. Resides 50 East Summer Street.
3. Georgii, David, in U.S. Army. Resides 50 East Summer Street.
4. Georgii, Robert in U.S. Navy. Resides 50 East Summer Street.
5. Georgii, William (Dorothy F) in U.S. Navy. Resides corner of Buckland Street and Milldale Avenue, Plantsville.
6. Georgii, Dorothy F, machine operator Allied Control Company. Resides corner of Buckland Street and Milldale Avenue, Plantsville.

Note that William, Jr, has married “Dorothy F”. Dorothy F is Dorothy Fischer. They were married on 22 December 1945 in Southington. Before proceeding further, we give the full birth information for William and Sarah’s children:

1. William Paul Georgii, born 22 June 1920. Died 13 September 2003 in Southington, Connecticut. Married Dorothy Gertrude Fischer on 22 December 1945 in Southington. Dorothy was born on 21 March 1924 in Southington. She died 6 May 2003 in Southington.

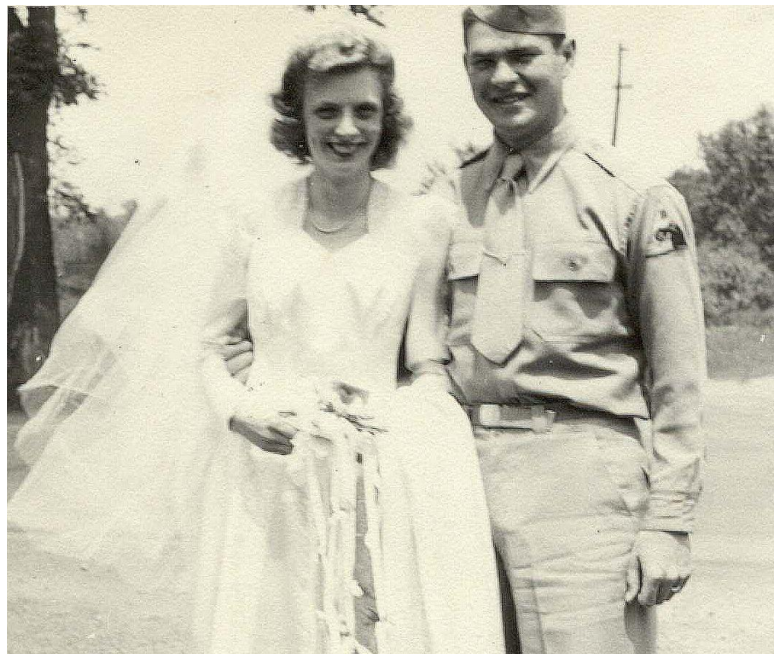


2. Mary Louise Georgii, born 4 August 1923 in Southington. Died 14 March 2018 in Middletown, Connecticut. Married Armand Arthur Messier on 31 May 1943 in Southington. Armand was born on 15 August 1922 in Bristol, Connecticut. He died on 30 November 1982 in Southington.
3. Daniel Robert Georgii, aka Robert or Bob, born 9 October 1925 in Southington. Died 1 December 1994 in Southington. Married Mary Elizabeth "Betty" Lockyer on 9 July 1952 in Southington. Mary died on 3 December 2013 in Hartford, Connecticut. Robert changed the spelling of his last name to "Georgie".
4. Adolph Georgii, born 27 November 1926 in Southington. Died 18 July 2005 in Bristol, Connecticut. Married Akiko Katsube on 30 March 1959. Akiko was born on 22 July 1932 in Wakayama, Wakayama, Japan. She died 26 January 1985 in Southington.
5. David Stephen Georgii, born 27 March 1928 in Southington.
6. Catherine Georgii, still born about 1930.

Mary Louise Georgii and Armand Messier were married on 31 May of 1943. He was inducted into the Army on 23 November 1942 and entered the Army on 8 December 1942. At that time, he was living at 211 Gridley Street in Bristol, Connecticut. Armand left for the European Theater on 12 September 1944. He gave his address as 50 East Summer Street, where his wife resided with her family. A son, named Michael, would be born on 25 January 1945. Armand returned to the USA on 13 October 1945, after being wounded in the battle of the Argonne Forest (Battle of the Bulge) on

Christmas day 1944. The 1946 Bristol directory shows them living at 211 Gridley. By 1947, they have moved to a 77 Lewis Street in Bristol. Armand is a machine operator at Wallace Barnes Company in Bristol; he had worked there as a die maker before entering the Service. Armand and Mary move to 296 Brook Street in Forestville, a village in Bristol.

In 1950, the family moves back to Southington. Armand and Mary buy the house on Curtis Street that Mary's Mother, Sarah O'Connell Georgii had grown up in. Armand was a foreman at Wallace Barnes in Bristol.

The 1955 Southington Directory shows that Daniel Robert "Robert" Georgii is married, but still in the Navy. He and Mary Elizabeth "Betty" have a home on the rear lot at 221 Meriden Avenue. William, Jr. now has a job as a signalman with the local railroad company (New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad). The remainder of the information is the same as 1947.

William August Georgii died on 19 September 1956 in Plantsville. He was 61 years old.

The 1961 Southington directory shows some interesting changes for the Georgii family. Daniel Robert's surname has been changed to "Georgie". He is still in the Navy and still resides at the rear of 221 Meriden Avenue. Adolph has a wife named Akiko and has moved to Long Beach,

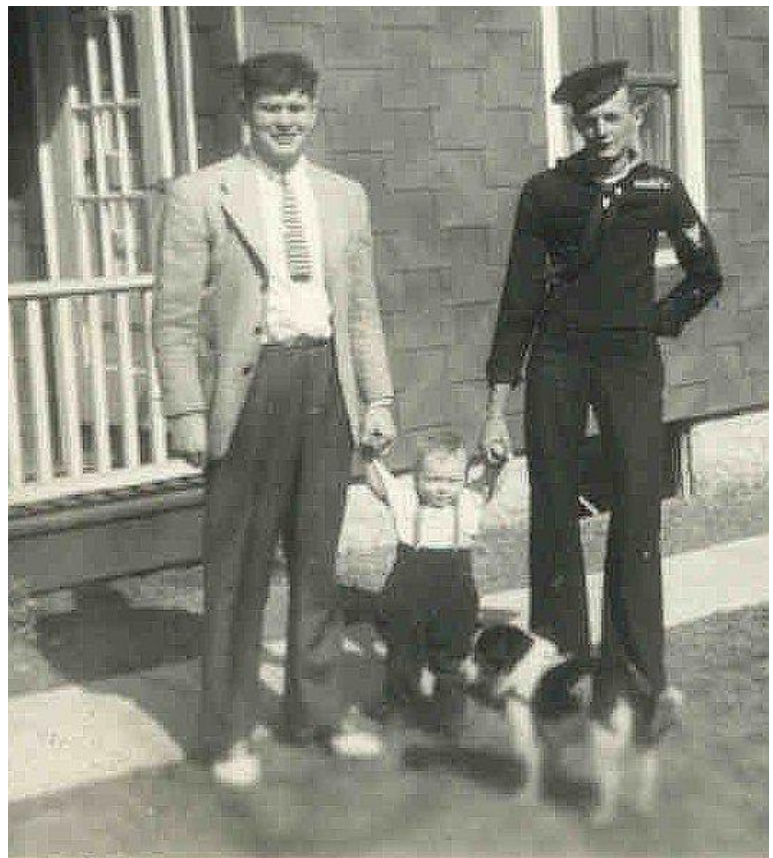


California. The 1961 Long Beach directory shows Adolph and Akiko living at 2440 Pacific Avenue. He is still in the Navy. Back in Southington, we find David still in the Army. His official residence is still listed at 50 East Summer Street, Plantsville, with his widowed mother Sarah A. Georgii.

The 1963 and 1964 San Diego, California directories show Adolph and Akiko living in National City. Adolph is still in the Navy. In 1963, their address is 1132 east 7<sup>th</sup> Street. In 1964, they have moved to 947 Melrose. Very little has changed in Southington, except that Daniel Robert is not listed as being in the Navy. Also, a person name Luigi Georgii has been added to the directory. Luigi is not related to the other Georgii families.

The 1965 Southington directory shows that Adolph and Akiko have returned. Adolph works as an accountant at Peck, Stow and Wilcox Company in Southington. The family lives on East Summer Street, next to the home of Sarah A. Georgii. They built their own house on Georgii property. David is still in the Army. William P. and Dorothy G. Georgii live at 785 Old Turnpike Road in Milldale (Southington). William is still a signalman with the railroad. Dorothy works as a florist with Fischer and Nyren, Inc. This is her family's business. Daniel Robert Georgie is employed at Peck, Stow and Wilcox, as is Adolph.

Sarah A. O'Connell died on 15 April 1984 in Southington. The 1983 Southington directory shows her living at 27 East Summer Street. We know she never moved out of her old home, 50 E. Summer, so the street numbers seem to have changed. Next door, at 21 East Summer, live the Adolph and Akiko Georgii family. Adolph is a stock clerk at the Board of Education. Their daughter, Lana, is also listed at the same address. David S. Georgii has retired from the Army and is living with Sarah. William and Dorothy have retired and live at 151 Scenic Drive. Daniel R. Georgie and Mary E. Georgie still live at 221 Meriden Avenue. He works at Pratt and Whitney Aircraft in Southington. Their two children are also listed at the same address. David Robert is in the Navy. Glynis Georgie is a student at Central Connecticut State College.

The 1983 Southington directory also shows Armand A. and Mary L. Messier still living at 120 Curtis Street. Armand has joined the Connecticut National Guard and works as a mechanic at the State Armory. He also has his own business, the Precision Grinding Shop, located in a garage at his home on Curtis Street.

## 5. Gottlieb's Children: Charles George

Charles Georgii remained in New Jersey after his father moved out of the state. He married Anna Radtke or Radke about 1912 or 1913. Anna was born on 26 December 1888 in Newark, New Jersey. Her father, Carl "Charles" Radtke, was born in Germany about 1856. Anna's mother, Augusta Kasilke, was born in Germany about 1860. The 1914 Carlstadt, New Jersey, directory shows Charles Georgii living at the same address as his father: 114 1<sup>st</sup> Street. He is employed as a driver.

His WWI draft card shows Charles George living at 773 Hunterdon Street in Newark, New Jersey. The card is dated 5 June 1917. He has a wife and two children. He was born 12 January 1889 in Leonberg, Württemberg, Germany; he is a naturalized citizen. His occupation is salesman employed by E. Braun in Newark. Charles asks for an exemption based upon need to support his family. Charles is of medium height and medium build. He has blue eyes and light hair.

The 1920 Federal census for Irvington, New Jersey, taken on 2 January, shows the Charles and Anna George family living at 28 Tremont Street. This is confirmed by the 1920 city directory for Irvington, which lists him as a salesman. They have two children. The data is as follows:

1. George, Charles, head, age 30, born Wurttemberg, Germany, rents home. Parents born Wurttemberg. Immigration year 1895, naturalized 1910. Occupation: Salesman cheese.
2. George, Anna, wife, age 31, born New Jersey. Parents born West Prussia, Germany.
3. George, Gladys, daughter, age 6, born New Jersey.
4. George, William, son, age 3 4/12, born New Jersey.

The 1930 Federal census for Maplewood, New Jersey, tells us that Charles and his family have moved to 12 Franklin Avenue. They have added a third child, Edward. Charles is the proprietor of a wholesale cheese business. This address and business are confirmed by the 1930 city directory. In the directory, he is known as Charles G. George. This would make sense as much as his middle name is Gottlob. It also helps to distinguish from several other men named Charles George. The 1930 census, dated 16 April, gives us the following information:

1. George, Charles, head, age 41, born Germany. Age at first marriage 23. Owns his home, valued at \$8000. Occupation: proprietor wholesale cheese.
2. George, Anna, wife, age 41, born New Jersey. Age at first marriage 23. Parents born Germany.
3. George, Gladys, daughter, age 16, born New Jersey, single.
4. George, William, son, age 13, born New Jersey, single.
5. George, Edward, son, age 8.

Charles and Anna George had three children. Their full names and birth information is as follows:

1. Gladys George, born about 1914, Irvington, New Jersey.
2. William Charles George, born 10 August 1916 in Newark, New Jersey. Died 1 November 2000, Lakehurst, New Jersey. Married Winifred A. Sink on 10 August 1939 in Newark, New Jersey.
3. Edward Frederick George, born 20 September 1920, Newark, New Jersey. Died 5 December 1998, Sea Girt, New Jersey.

The 1940 Federal census for Maplewood, New Jersey shows Charles and Anna George still living 12 Franklin Avenue. Two of their children, Gladys and Edward are living with them. The data, recorded on 13 April, contains the following:

1. George, Charles, head, age 51, born Germany. Owns house valued at \$4200. Highest grade education: 7. Occupation: wholesale distributor, cheese.
2. George, Anna, wife, age 50, born New Jersey. Highest grade education: 7.
3. George, Gladys, daughter, age 26. Highest grade education: high school 2 years. Occupation: file clerk, varnish company.
4. George, Edward son, age 19, born New Jersey. Highest grade education: high school 4 years.

Charles' son, William Charles George, married Winifred A. Sink on 9 September 1939 in Newark, New Jersey. They were married in the Kilburn Memorial Presbyterian Church. The handwritten record makes her last name look like "Link". At the time of the marriage, William was living at 12 Franklin

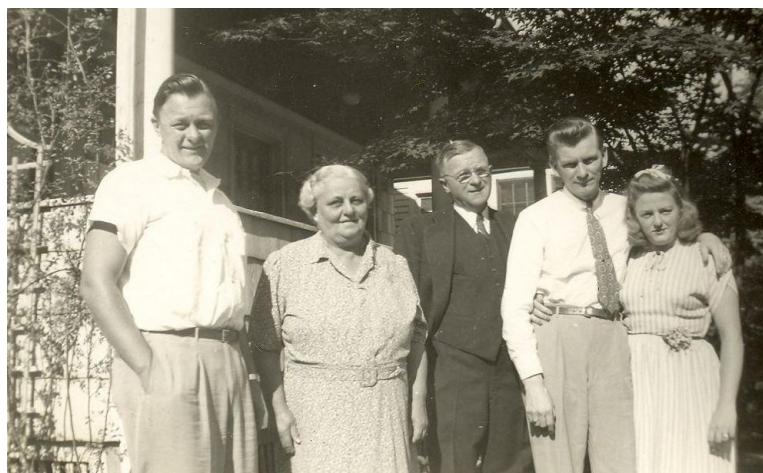


Avenue, Maplewood. Winifred was living at 61 Lindsley Avenue, Newark. Winifred is the daughter of Charles Sink, born April 1879 in Newark, and Beatrice Elizabeth Reed, born about 1895 in England. Charles' family name was originally "Zink". Charles' father, John (Johann) G. Zink was a cabinet maker born in Germany in February 1885. He arrived in New York in April 1881 and was naturalized 3 August 1886 in New York City. At that time, he and his family were living at 150 Forsythe Street, New York City. By 1897, the Zink family was living in Newark, New Jersey at 293 Springfield Avenue. The family appears in the 1900 National Census at 664 South 14<sup>th</sup> Street. In this census, Charles Zink is shown to be born in Germany in April 1879. This differs from all other records which state that he was born in New Jersey.

John was married to a German woman named Frederika, who was born September 1858. At the time of the 1900 census, they had been married for 22 years, or about 1878. This gives credibility to Charles being born in Germany, not New Jersey, given that they did not arrive until 1881.

William and Winifred George are listed in the 1940 National census as living in Elizabeth, New Jersey. They live in an apartment building at 1022 North Broad Street. The data is as follows:

1. George, William, head, age 23, born New Jersey. Education: high school 4 years.

2. George, Winifred, wife, age 21, born New Jersey. Education: high school, 4 years.

Occupation: typist, electric company.

The 1941 Elizabeth, New Jersey, directory shows William C. and Winifred A. living in apartment D7 at 1023 North Broad. He works as a clerk in Newark.

We have no further information about William and Winifred.

## 6. Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Maria Ober Genealogical Connection

We are going to begin describing the Georgii Ancestry. As stated in Section 1, Gottlieb and Luise Maria are first cousins. Even more, they are double first cousins (if that is a term), since each carries a half Georgii and half Ober genome. This is complicated enough to deserve a separate section before proceeding with the remainder of the ancestor tree. Note that the ancestor tree is not complete unless we give equal weight to both the Georgii and Ober branches.

**George Christoph Georgii** was born on 6 June 1801 in Steinreinach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He was the son of **Jacob Georgii** and **Clara Margareta Wagner**. On 28 November 1827, he married **Anna Maria Banzhaf**. Anna Maria was born on 16 October 1802 in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. She was the daughter of **Johann Georg Banzhaf** and **Margareta Nuding**. Two of their eight children are a son named **Jacob Frederick Georgii**, born 10 August 1838, and a daughter named **Anna Maria Georgii**, born 19 July 1845. All the children are born in Plüderhausen.

**On the Ober side, Johannes Ober** was born on 30 July 1805 in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. His parents were **Georg Martin Ober** and **Sibylla Jäklen**. On 4 March 1832, Johannes married **Frederika Christiana Biedermann**, born 19 May 1811 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Her parents were **Johann Jacob Biedermann** and **Christine Gottliebin Koslerin or Kohler**. They had fourteen children, all born in Leonberg. A daughter, **Luise Wilhelmina "Elise" Ober**, was born 16 July 1837. A son, **Karl Gottlieb Ober**, was born on 24 October 1841.

On 6 October 1863, **Jacob Frederick Georgii** married **Luise Wilhelmine Ober** in Plüderhausen. They had 16 Children, all born in Plüderhausen. Number eight child was **Gottlieb Georgii**, born 12 March 1869. Three of their children were born before they were married.

**Karl Gottlieb Ober** married **Anna Maria Georgii** on 14 October 1866 in Plüderhausen. They had eleven children, all born in Leonberg. The first child was a daughter named **Luise Maria Ober**, born 7 September 1867.

**Gottlieb Georgii** and **Luise Maria Ober** had a child named **Jacob Gottlob Ober**, born 12 January 1889. **Jacob Gottlob Georgii** became **Charles Georgii**. Gottlieb and Luise Maria were married on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan, New York, USA. They had two other sons. **William (Wilhelm) August Georgii** was born on 30 April 1895. Adolph Georgii was born on 25 December 1896. Both were born in Manhattan.

## 7. Direct Georgii Line Ancestors of Gottlieb Georgii

In this section, we look at Gottlieb's direct ancestors along the Georgii line. Chart 7-1 shows the relationship between Gottlieb and the oldest direct ancestor that we can confirm. In a later section, we will discuss the original line of Georgii ancestors that settled, first in Switzerland, and then Württemberg, Germany.

The relationship chart below, shows that Gottlieb's 3<sup>rd</sup>-great grandfather was **Johann Jacob Georgii** (aka Johann Jacob Georg). Johann Jacob was born on 11 March 1699 in Weisenbach, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He is the son of **Johann and Margareta Barbara Georgii** (aka Georg). We do not have information about these people. Johann Jacob married **Anna Marie Bentzlers** on 5 February 1726 in Gomadingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. We believe she was born 10 August 1714 in Nürtingen, Esslingen, Baden-Württemberg. That would make her 12 years old when married. Her parents were **Johann Jacob and Margareta Bentzlers**.

Johann Jacob and Anna Maria had a son named **Christoph Gottlieb Georgii (aka Christian Gottlieb)**. He was born 2 April 1740 in Löchgau, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. About 1770, Christoph Gottlieb married **Catherina Müller**, somewhere in the region of Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Caterina was the daughter of **Martin Müller and Anna Hab**. She was born on 7 July 1740 in Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. We know of 6 children born in various towns in the region of Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. The eldest was named Jacob. The list of known children is as follows:

1. **Jacob Georgii**, Born 16 September 1770 in Ofterdingen, Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He died 14 June 1843 in Adelberg, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. We will follow his line below.



2. **Thomas Georgii**, born 10 March 1775 in Donaueschingen, Schwartz-Baar-Kreis, Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg.
3. **Fidelis Georgii**, born 10 March 1777 in Eugen, Konstanz, Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg.
4. **Maria Ursula**

**Georgii**, born April 1779 in Horn Radolfzell, Konstanz, Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg. Died 28 July 1777 in Beiringen, Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg.

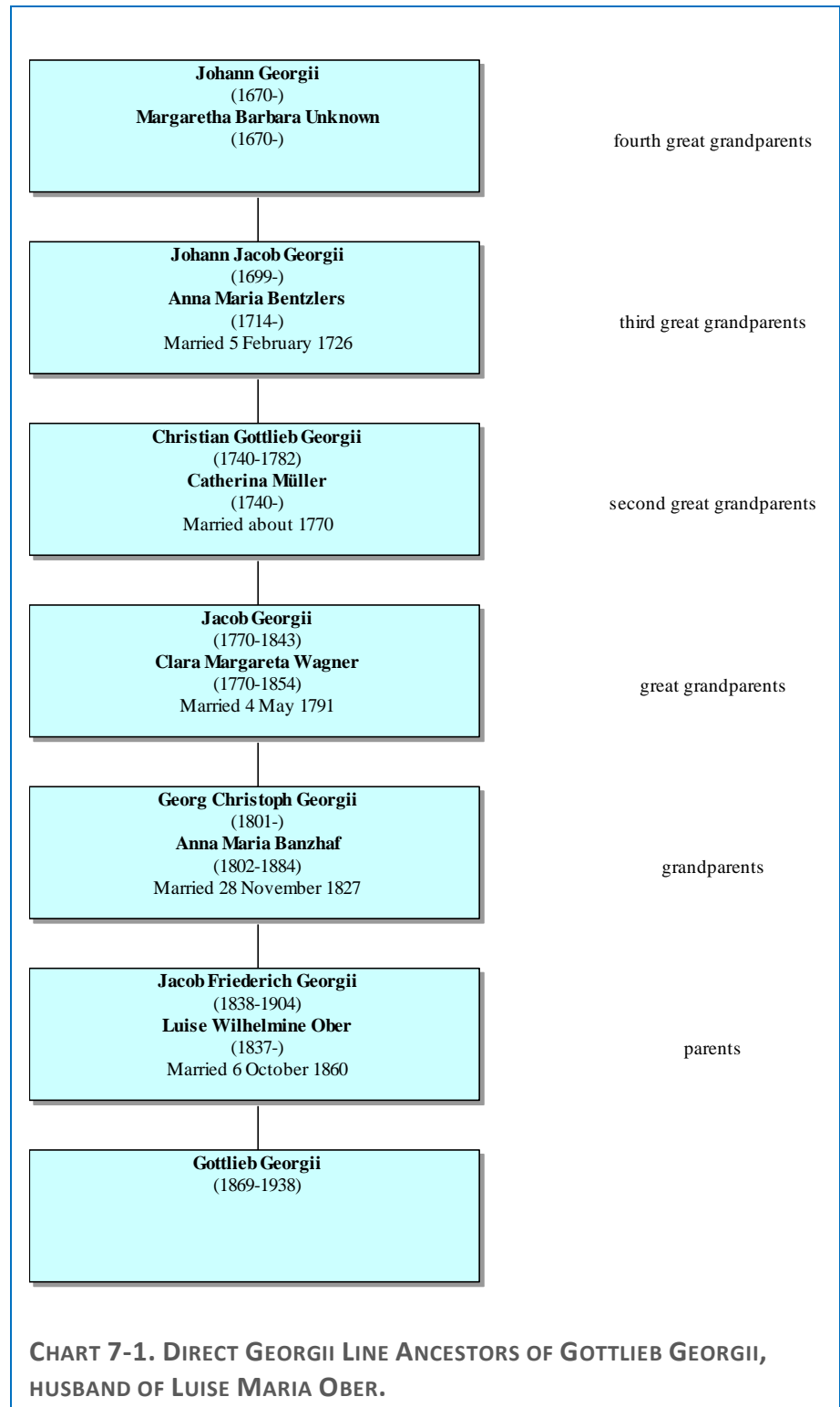
5. **Franciscus Antonia**

**Georgii**, born 6 May 1783 in Schlierbach, Schlierbach, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

6. **Joseph Jacob**

**Georgii**, born 6 August 1786 in Ilsfeld, Heilbronn, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

**Jacob Georgii** was born on 16 September 1770 in Ofterdingen, Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Jacob married **Clara Margareta Wagner** on 4 March 1791 in Adelberg, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in



that town on 16 June 1770 to Conrad and Catharina Wagner. Jacob died in Adelberg on 14 June 1843. Clara Margareta died there on 2 December 1854. We are aware of twelve children. The sixth child, George Christoph, will be in line to both Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Maria Ober, as discussed above. The twelve children are:

1. **Gottfried Georgii**, born 18 March 1792 in Miedelsbach, Schorndorf, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He died on 29 March 1835 in Adelberg.
2. **Johann Michael Georgii**, born 22 September 1793 in Adelberg. He died 15 April 1826 in Adelberg. On 25 October 1818, he married **Heinrica Catharina Häuslerin**. Heinrica Catharina was born 24 July 1789 in Steinenberg, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was the illegitimate daughter of **Christina Häuslerin**. They had two children: **Carl Wilhelm Georgii** (born 14 April 1818) and **Christoph Friedrich Georgii** (born 8 January 1820). Both children were born in Schorndorf, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. After Johann Michael died in 1826, Heinrica Catharina married **Jacob Friedrich Stirm** (aka **Jacob Friedrich Stürm**). He was born on 14 March 1801 in Schorndorf, the son of **Georg Friedrich Stirm** and **Christina Margarita Sherbart** (aka **Christina Margareta Schaubach**). She died on 2 February 1851 in Schorndorf.
3. **Conrad Andreas Georgii**, born 20 November 1795 in Adelberg.
4. **Catharina Margareta Georgii**, born 6 February 1797 in the Buhlbronn district of Schorndorf. She died 2 December 1875 in Adelberg. She married **David Reinhardt** on 10 November 1822 in Waiblingen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. David was born on 17 February 1788 in Waiblingen, the son of David Reinhardt and Eva Catharina Carlin. David died 23 January 1858 in Adelberg.
5. **Andreas Georgii**, born 25-March 1799 in Buoch, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died on 4 June 1828.
6. **Georg Christoph Georgii**, born 6 June 1801 in Steinreinach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died on 6 April 1858 in Plüderhausen. On 28 November 1827, Georg Christoph married **Anna Maria Banzhaf** in Adelberg. Anna Maria was born in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 16 October 1802, the daughter of **Johann Georg Banzhaf** and **Margareta Nuding**. Anna Maria died 16 October 1884 in Plüderhausen. George Christoph and Anna Maria had 13 children, most born in Plüderhausen. Two of these will marry into the Ober family, as described in the previous section, and lead to Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Maria Ober. These two children are **Jacob Friedrich Georgii**, born 10 August 1838, and **Anna Maria Georgii**, born 19 July 1845.
7. **Johann Georgii**, born 31 October 1803 in Steinreinbach. He died two years later on 11 November 1805 in Steinreinbach.
8. **Christiana Clara Georgii**, born 7 December 1804 in Adelberg. She died there, three months later, on 28 March 1806.
9. **Johann Jacob Georgii**, born 10 January 1807 in Adelberg. He died there, less than two months later, on 19 February 1807.

10. **Jacob Friedrich Georgii**, born 5 June 1808 in Adelberg. He died 26 April 1831 in Adeberg.
11. **Johann Georgii**, born 10-February 1811 in Adelberg. He died there on 16 March 1833.
12. **Elisabetha Clara Georgii**, born 12 March 1815 in Adelberg. She died two days later, on 14 March 1815.

**Georg Christoph Georgii** was born on 6 June 1801 in Steinenberg, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died on 6 April 1858 in Plüderhausen. On 28 November 1827, Georg Christoph married **Anna Maria Banzhaf** in Adelberg. Anna Maria was born in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 16 October 1802, the daughter of **Johann Georg Banzhaf** and **Margareta Nuding**. Anna Maria died 16 October 1884 in Plüderhausen. George Christoph and Anna Maria had 13 children, most born in Plüderhausen. As described in the previous section, their son **Jacob Friedrich Georgii** will marry **Luise Wilhelmina Ober**. Their son will be **Gottlieb Georgii**. Their daughter **Anna Maria Georgii** will marry **Carl Gottlieb Ober**. Their daughter **Luise Maria Ober** will marry **Gottlieb Georgii**. The children of George Christoph and Anna Maria are:

1. **Maria Margaretha Georgii**, born 6 August 1826 in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She will die on 5 February 1885 in Börtlingen, Göppingen, Baden-Württemberg. On 24 March 1858, an illegitimate child by the name of **Leonhard Christoph Georgii** was born to Maria Margaretha in Plüderhausen. About a year and a half later, on 2 October 1859, Maria Margaretha married **Michael Bantel** (aka **Michael Sautel** or **Michael Bartel**) in Börtlingen. Michael was born on 22 November 1822 in Oberurbach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on. Michael was the son of **Johann Bantel (Sautel)** and **Maria Catharina Bauder**. He died 27 December 1890 in Börtlingen. Michael was a widower at the time he married Maria Margaretha. About ten years earlier, on 16 January 1849, he married **Christina Jacobina Reyser** in Börtlingen. Christina Jacobina was born in Börtlingen on 17 June 1824, the daughter of **Albrecht and Anna Maria Reyser**. Michael and Christina had four children, all born in Börtlingen. The last child died at birth on 20 March 1859. The child was not given a name. Nine days later, on 29 March 1824, Christina Jacobina died.
2. **Johanna Maria Georgii**, born 11 December 1829 in Adelberg, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Johanna Maria died six days later, on 17 December 1829.
3. **Gottlieb Christoph Georgii**, born 31 March 1831 in Adelberg. He married **Maria Barbara Nuding** on 15 November 1859 in Plüderhausen. Maria Barbara was born on 8 December 1825 in Ulm, Stadtkreis, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Her parents were **Andreas Nuding**, born 11 December 1791, Plüderhausen, and **Anna Maria Birker** (aka, Birkein, Burkein, or Bicker) born 10 April 1798 in Plüderhausen. Maria Barbara previously had an illegitimate son by the name of **Johan Jacob Nuding**, born 19 April 1853 in Plüderhausen. Johann Jacob lived to marry and have a family. This cannot be said of the six children that Gottlieb Christoph had with Maria Barbara. **Johann Georg Gottlieb Georgii** Was born in Ulm on 1 September 1859. He died in Plüderhausen on 15 November 1863. **Johann Georg Georgii** was born on 30 Jun 1862 in Plüderhausen. He died there on 3 September

1862. **Johann Gottlieb Georgii** was born 29 September 1863 in Plüderhausen. He died 24 February 1864. Twin sons were born on 14 August 1865 in Schwäbisch Gmünd, Ostalbkreis, Baden-Württemberg. **Gottlieb Georgii** was baptized and died that day. He was buried on 16 August. **Johann Georg Georgii** died on 17 August and was buried on 19 August 1865 in Schwäbisch Gmünd. Four years later, **August Karl Georgii** was born four years later, on 25 August 1869 in Plüderhausen. He lived until 25 November.

4. **Magdelina Georgii**, born 24 February 1832 in Plüderhausen. She died 14 December 1906 in Plüderhausen. On 28 May 1860, she married **Johann Gottlieb Damson**, aka **Johann Gottlieb Dawson**. Johann Gottlieb was born 15 July 1818 in Plüderhausen. His parents were **Johann Gottlieb Damson** (born 9 November 1780 in Plüderhausen) and **Anna Maria Bachmüller** (born 21 September 1782 in Plüderhausen). Johann Gottlieb Damson had previously married and was the father of nine children, most of whom died shortly after birth. His previous wife was named **Charlotte Friederike Steinrock**. She was born on 27 November 1822 in Plüderhausen. Her parents were **Johann Georg Steinrock**, born 17 August 1777 in Plüderhausen, and **Rosina Seibold**, born 5 April 1786 in Plüderhausen. Charlotte Friederike died on 23 May 1859; her last child, unnamed, was born and died nine days earlier on 14 May. Magdalina and Johann Gottlieb Damson gave birth to four children, all in Plüderhausen. **Carl Friedrich Damson** was born on 30 July 1873. Gottlieb Damson was born 3 May 1875. Two daughters followed: **Anna Maria Damson** was born on 26 March 1877 and **Maria Damson** was born on 11 June 1880. Maria died two months later, on 9 August 1880. There were no more children because **John Gottlieb Damson** died on 19 October 1880 at the age of 62.
5. **Anna Maria Georgii** was born on 1 May 1833 in Plüderhausen. She died there thirteen days later, on 14 May.
6. **Johann Georg Georgii** was born on 26 April 1834 in Plüderhausen. He died there about seven months later, on 20 November.
7. **Anna Marie Georgii**, the second, was born on 27 August 1837 in Plüderhausen. She lived about three months, dying on 11 October 1837.
8. **Jacob Friedrich Georgii** was born on 10 August 1838 in Plüderhausen. He died 25 August 1904 in that town. He is the father of **Gottlieb Georgii**, the subject of this report. As noted in previous sections, he married **Luise Wilhelmina "Elise" Ober** on 6 October 1863 in Plüderhausen. By that time, they had three children. Their last child was born and died in 1880. We will list all the children below. Luise Wilhelmina was born on 16 July 1837 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Luise Wilhelmina died in Plüderhausen on 1 March 1913. Her father was **Johann Ober**, born 30 July in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Her mother was **Friederike Christiana Biedermann**, born 19 May 1811 in Leonberg.
9. **Anna Maria Georgii**, the third, was born 5 March 1840 in Plüderhausen. She died fifteen days later, on 19 March.

10. **Christoph Georgii** was, born 24 March 1841 in Plüderhausen. He died there on 28 November 1916. On 16 June 1868, he was married to **Catharina Wörhle**. Catharina was also born in Plüderhausen. She was born on 29 November 1845 and died there on 21 March 1916, about 8 months before her husband. Catharina was a daughter of **Matthäus Wörhl** (born 21 December 1814 in Plüderhausen) and **Friederike Schanbacher** (born 29 April 1841, also in Plüderhausen). Christoph and Catharina had five children, all born in Plüderhausen.
- (1) **Carl Gottlieb Georgii** was born on 17 February 1869. He married **Luise Sophie Schneider** on 26 March 1894. She was born there on 6 December 1871.
- (2) **Catharina Georgii** was born on 9 August 1870. She had an illegitimate child, **Marie Wilhelmina Georgii**, born 9 June 1892. Catharina later married **Johann George Stapp**. They were married 23 February 1897 in Plüderhausen.
- (3) **Christoph Wilhelm Georgii** was born 21 February 1872. He married **Ernstine Luise Beck** on 25 October 1900 in Alchwald, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born there on 13 January 1879.
- (4) **Karl Georgii** was born on 16 May 1875 in Plüderhausen. He married **Henriette Dorothea Kuhn** on 28 April 1900 in that city. She was born on 2 October 1872 in Metzingen, Reutlingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. Henriette Dorothea is the daughter of **David and Dorothea Kuhn**. Karl and Henriette Dorothea had seven children, most of whom died early. Karl died on 28 December 1950 in Ludwigsburg. Henrietta Dorothea died there on 20 March 1957.
- (5) **Maria Georgii** was born on 8 February 1878 in Plüderhausen. She married **Karl Ludwig Greiner** on 17 October 1907 in Plüderhausen. He was also born in that city, on 29 January 1883. Karl Ludwig was the son of **Johann Greiner** and **Christian Katharina Kerler**.
11. **Johann Georgii** was born on 17 September 1842 in Plüderhausen. He died three days later on 20 September.
12. **Anna Maria Georgii**, the third, was born on 13 October 1843 in Plüderhausen. She lived for about a year and a half, dying on 3 March 1845.
13. **Anna Maria Georgii**, the fourth and final, was born on 19 July 1845 in Plüderhausen. She died in Leonburg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg in May 1928. Anna Maria married **Karl Gottlieb Ober** on 14 October 1866 in Plüderhausen. Karl Gottlieb was born in Leonburg on 24 October 1841 in Leonberg. He was the son of **Johann Ober** (born 30 July 1805 in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and **Friederika Christiana Biedermann** (born 19 May 1811 in Leonberg). Anna Maria and Karl Gottlieb will have twelve children, all born in Leonberg.
- (1) **Luise Maria Ober** was born on 7 September 1867 in Leonberg. She will marry **Gottlieb Georgii** on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan, New York City, New York, USA. She will die on 27 January 1909 in East Rutherford, Bergen, New Jersey, USA. Gottlieb is the son of **Jacob Friederich Georgii** and **Luise Wilhelmina Ober**, as described previously. Gottlieb died in Southington, Hartford, Connecticut, USA on 22 January 1938, after marrying twice more in America. Since this entire history report is focused on Gottlieb and Marie Luise, we will not

discuss them here.

**(2) Gottlieb Wilhelm Ober** was born on 8 February 1869. He died at the age of seven on 30 March 1876.

**(3) Anna Maria Ober** was born on 10 May 1870.

**(4) Karl Wilhelm Ober** was born 3 January 1872. He died on 27 August 1942, at the age of seventy, in Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. It appears that Karl Wilhelm married a woman named Marie and had a daughter named **Luise Wilhelmina Ober**, born 15 May 1901 in Leonberg.

**(5) Wilhelmina Magdalena Ober** was born on 19 March 1873. We believe that she is the “Mina” Ober the accompanied **Jacob Gottlob “Charles” Georgii**, the oldest son of **Gottlieb Georgii and Luise Marie Ober** to New York. The pair arrived there on 29 January 1895 on the S.S. Friesland. Mina is described as a “maid servant and she is traveling with a six-year-old Gottlob Georgii. Mina’s age is 21 years, 9 months. This would give her a birth date of May 1873, which is very close to the birth of Wilhelmina Magdelina.

**(6) Gustav Adolf Ober** was born on 26 October 1874. On 14 November 1908, he married **Karolina Luise Baumgärtner, aka, Luisa Karolina Paumgertel**, in Aldingen, Tuttlingen Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in that town on 19 May 1879. Her parents were **Johann Gottlieb Baumgärtner** and **Margaretha Christina Klotz**. **Jacob Adolph Ober** was born 21 February 1876. We have no further information.

**(7) Jacob Adolph Ober** was born on 21 February 1876. We have no other information.

**(8) Anna Martha Ober** was born 16 July 1877. She had an illegitimate daughter, Martha Ober, on 6 December 1899 in Plüderhausen. Martha later migrated to Manhattan, New York, where she married **John Louis Blattler** on 6 April 1923. John Louis was born in Switzerland in 1888. They lived in Passaic County, New Jersey for several years. They both died in New London County, Connecticut.

**(9) Emilie Rosina Ober** was born on 23 January 1884. We have no further information. Note that this is seven years after Anna Martha. It is possible that some children are missing from the record.

**(10) Frieda Sophie Ober** was born on 1 May 1885. She gave birth to an illegitimate son on 1 December 1912 in her hometown of Leonberg. The boy was named **Hermann Gottfried Ober**.

**(11) Friederika Christine Ober** was born on 31 March 1886. She married **Wilhelm Roth** on 1 October 1908 in Gerlingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Wilhelm was born in that town on 29 May 1883. He was the son of **Johann Roth** (born 29 December 1843 in Leonberg) and **Johanna Friederike Krauss** (born 29 December 1883 in Leonberg). Wilhelm Roth and Friederike Ober had three children, all born in Gerlingen.

**(12) Emma Auguste Ober** was born on New Year’s day, 1 January 1890, in Leonberg. We have no other information.



**Jacob Friederich Georgii** was born on 10 August 1838 in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He died there on 25 August 1904. He married **Luise Wilhelmina Ober** on 6 October 1863 in Plüderhausen. Luise Wilhelmina was born on 16 July 1837 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She died in Plüderhausen on 1 March 1913. She is the daughter of **Johann Ober** (born 30 July 1805 in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and **Friederika Christianna Biederman** (born 19 May 1811 in Leonberg). Jacob Friederich and Luise Wilhelmina were the parents of 16 children. Most the children were born in Plüderhausen. The first three children were born out of wedlock before the marriage. We know that the second child was fathered by Jacob Friederich. The other two probably were.

1. **Adolph Friederich Ober** Was born out of wedlock to Luise Whilelmina on 31 July 1857. He married **Elizabetha Friedeike Fink** on 17 May 1886 in Plüderhausen. Elizabeth Friederike was born Zuffenhausen, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 17 November 1824. She was the daughter of **Christoph Fink** (born 31 January 1819 in Zuzenhausen, Rhein-Neckar-Kreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg) and **Elizabetha Friederike Widmann** (born 17 November 1824 in Zuffenhausen). Note that Adolph Friederich was eleven years younger than his wife. Since she was forty years old at the time of the marriage, it is possible she had a previous marriage.
2. **Jacob Gottlieb Georgii** was born out of wedlock to Jacob Friederich and Luise Wilhelmina on 3 March 1861 in Leonberg. He married **Anna Maria Thudium** on 26 April 1886 in Plüderhausen. Anna Maria was born Oberwalden, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She is the daughter of **Jacob Thudium** (born 10 April 1824 in Oberwalden) and **Christine Vetter** (born 10 January 1829 Wangen, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg). We believe they had 5 children, all born in Eislingen, Goppingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Anna Maria died there on 12 November 1918. Jacob Gottlieb died there, 17 years later, on 24 January 1935.
3. **Gottlieb Wilhem Johann Georgii** was born out of wedlock to Luise Wilhelmina on 25 August 1862 in Leonberg. He died in Leonberg three months later, on 24 November 1862.
4. **Gottlob Christoph Georgii** was born on 9 July 1864 in Plüderhausen. He died there on 2 April 1866.
5. **Carl Wilhelm Georgii** was born on 8 July 1865 in Plüderhausen. He died there two months later, on 5 September 1865.
6. **Luise Maria Georgii** was born on 30 May 1866 in Plüderhausen. She married **Gottfried Strecker** on there on 1 February 1894. Gottfried was also born in Calw, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg, Germany on 30 July 1866. He was the son of **Johann Jacob Strecker** (born 8 March 1829 in Großaspach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and **Ernestine Wilhelmina Schmidt** (born 17-April 1829 in Calw). Luise Maria and Gottfried had at least eight children, all born in Plüderhausen.
7. **Carl Gottlob Georgii** was born 1 July 1867 in Plüderhausen. On 7 April 1890 he married **Anna Maria Geiger** in Plüderhausen. She was born on 5 May 1864 in Hößlinswart, Rems-

Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. She is the daughter of Johann Geiger and Anna Maria Schoor. Carl Gottlob and Anna Maria had at least three children, all born in Plüderhausen.

8. **Gottlieb Georgii** was born on 12 March 1869 in Plüderhausen. This is the Gottlieb Georgii that is the focus of this history report. His life has been described in full in previous sections of this report. Gottlieb married **Luise Maria Ober** on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan, New York City, New York, USA. Luise Maria was born on 12 January 1867 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. She was the daughter of **Karl Gottlieb Ober** (born 24 October 1841 in Leonberg) and **Anna Maria Georgii** (born 19 July 1845 in Plüderhausen). Gottlieb's father (Jacob Friederich Georgii) and Luise Maria's mother (Anna Maria Georgii) are brother and sister. Gottlieb's mother, Louise Wilhelmine Ober, and Luise Maria's father, Karl Gottlieb Ober, were also siblings. Luise Maria died in East Rutherford, Bergen, New Jersey. Gottlieb died on 12 May 1938 in Southington, Hartford, Connecticut. After Luise died, Gottlieb either married or lived with a widow by the name of **Katherine Krapf** in Queens, New York. Krapf was the family name of her previous husband, **Edward Krapf**. Edward and Katherine were both born in Germany. Gottlieb later appears in Southington living with a woman named Dora. Dora is presumably a widow. She was born in 1864 in Germany. Dora died in October 1937 in Southington. Gottlieb had three children, all sons, by Luise Maria. The first was

**(1) Jacob Gottlob Ober**, later, in America, known as **Charles Georgii**. Jacob Gottlob Ober was born in Leonberg on 21 January 1889. After Gottlieb and Luise Maria were married in Manhattan, "Gottlob" Georgii was escorted to America on the Ship Friesland; he arrived at Ellis Island on 29 January 1895. Gottlob was age six. His escort was named Mina Ober, age 21 years, 9 months. This Mina would have been about May 1873. Luise Maria has a sister named Wilhelmina Magdalena Ober, who was born on 19 March 1873 in Leonberg. We believe that this is the Mina Ober that accompanied Gottlob, i.e., Charles. Charles Georgii changed his family name to Charles George. He will live in New Jersey for his entire adult life. He married Anna Radtke about 1912. They had three children born in Essex County, New Jersey.

**(2) William August Georgii** was born in Manhattan on 30 April 1895. He moved to Southington, Connecticut, where he married **Sarah O'Connell** on 30 April 1919. Sarah was born on 27 December 1892 in Wareham, Plymouth, Massachusetts. She was the daughter of **Daniel John O'Connell** (born 5 April 1855 in Halifax, Nova Scotia) and **Mary McNamara** (born in July 1856 in Merthyr Tydfil, Glamorgan, Wales). See the O'Connell History for the details. William August and Sarah had six children, all born in Southington (in Plantsville, a village within Southington).

**(3) Adolph Georgii** was born on 25 December 1896 in Manhattan. We know very little about Adolph. He was in Southington in 1914 and attended his brother William's wedding in 1919. During WWI, he worked at a defense plant in Bridgeport, Fairfield, Connecticut. We have no death date, but believe it was in Southington.

9. **Gotthilf Wilhelm Georgii** was born on 18 July 1870 in Plüderhausen. He died five months later, on 14 December 1870.
10. **Carl Wilhelm Georgii** was born on 14 July 1871 in Plüderhausen. He died there on 22 June 1895 at the age of 23. We have no other information.
11. **August Ernst Georgii** was born on 20 November 1872 in Plüderhausen. He died on 17 September 1905 in Bartenbach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. August Ernst was married twice. On 19 April 1897, he married **Johanna Martha Wild** in Eislingen, Goppingen, Baden-Württemberg. Johanna Martha was born in Eislingen on 20-September 1875. Her parents were **Heinrich Gottfried Wild** (born 4 December 1839 in Jebenhausen, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and **Margaretha Luise Stegmaier** (born 9 September 1844 in Eislingen). August Ernst had two children with Johanna Martha; both died at an early age in Eislingen. She died 27 September 1899 in Bartenbach. August Ernst then married **Magdalina Christina Straub**. They were married on 10 June 1901 in Börtlingen, Göppingen, Baden-Württemberg. Magdalina Christina was the daughter of Johann Georg Straub (born 12 January 1837 in Börtlingen) and Barbara Friederike Reik (born 29 July 1842 in Ebersbach, Goppingen, Baden-Württemberg). They had two children born in Ebersbach and Bartenbach.
12. **Johann Georg Georgii** was born on 21 October 1873 in Plüderhausen. He died there almost a month later, on 19 November 1873.
13. **Julius Georgii** was born on 28 August 1875 in Plüderhausen. He died about a month later, on 30 September 1875.
14. **Karl Ludwig Georgii** was born on 13 July 1877 in Plüderhausen. He died five months later, on 18 December 1877.
15. **Karl Ludwig Georgii**, the second, was born on 2 November 1878 in Plüderhausen. He married **Pauline Christina Schuppert** in the same town on 19 July 1904. She was born in Welzheim, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg on 22 April 1876. She was the daughter of **Konrad Schuppert** and **Karoline Daiss**.
16. **Marie Friederike Georgii** was born on 10 June 1880 in Plüderhausen. She died three months later, on 10 September 1880.

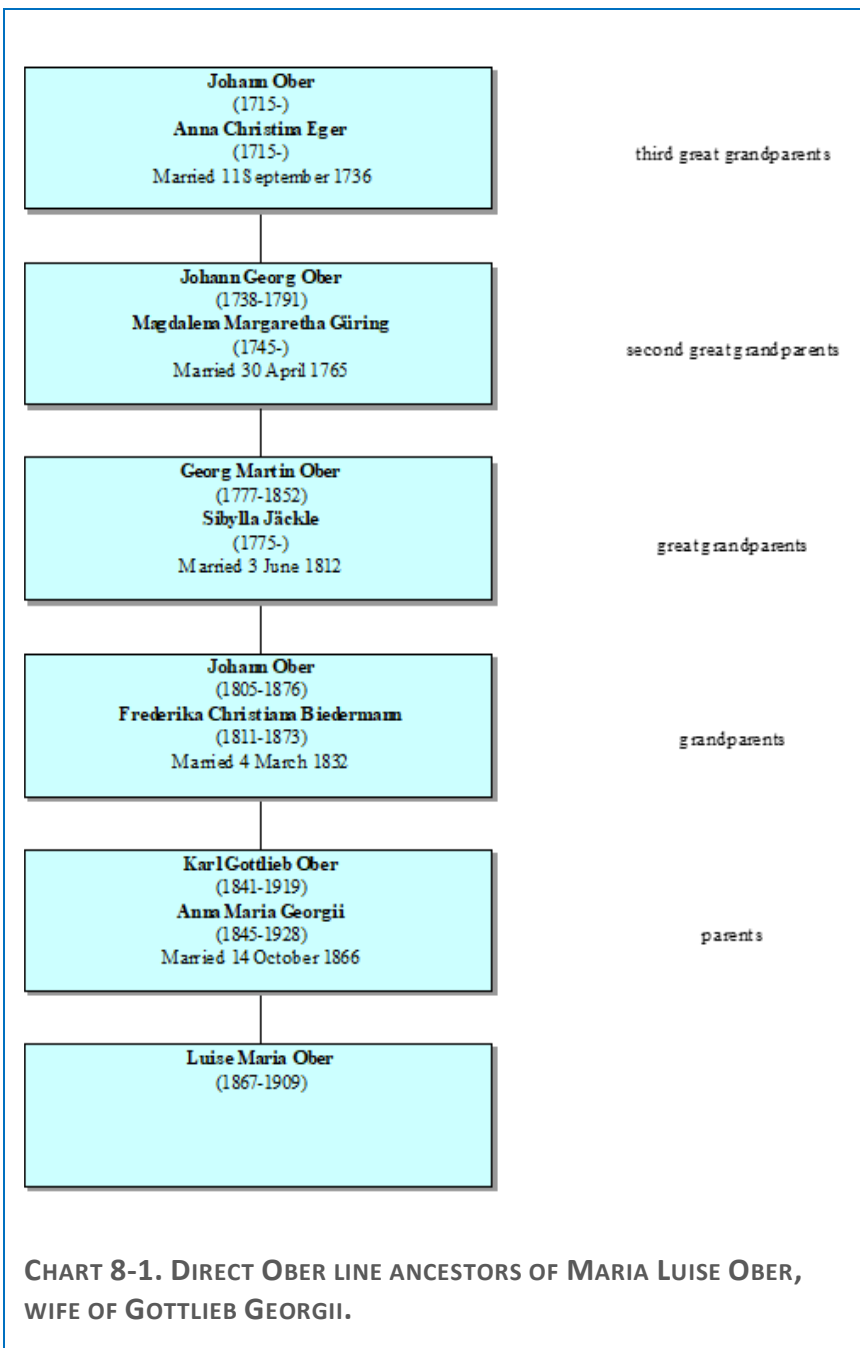
## 8. Direct Ober Line Ancestors of Luise Maria Ober

In this section, we trace the direct Ober line ancestors of Luise Maria Ober, the first wife of Gottlieb Georgii. Chart 8-1 shows the relationship between Luise Maria and the oldest ancestor that we can confirm.

**Johann Georg Ober** was born on 4 August 1738 in Besigheim, Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He is the son of **Johann Ober** and **Anna Christina Eger or Ege**, who were married in Besigheim on 11 September 1736. We have no further information, except that Anna Christina had a father named **Johann Jacob Eger**. On 30 April 1765, Johann Georg married **Magdelina Margaretha**

**Güring, aka Margaretha Magdalena Giring.** They were married in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, so it is possible she was born there around 1745. Her father was **Johann Georg Güring**. We have no further information. Johann Georg and Magdalena Margaretha had four children that we are aware of, though there probably were several more; all were born in Leonberg.

1. 1. **Johann Michael Ober** was born on 16 March 1766. He died in Leonberg on 4 August 1791. He married **Anna Maria Pfänder** on 27 October 1795 in Leonberg. She was born in that town on 21 March 1761, the daughter of **Hans Martin Pfänder** and **Agnes Baurer**. Hans Martin and Agnes were married in Beuren, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 29 April 1751. Johann Michael and Anna Maria had one child that we know of. **Johanna Catherina Ober** was born on 24 December in Leonberg. She died there on 23 March 1864. Johanna Catharina married **Joseph Friedrich Lehren**. He was born in Leonberg on 8 October 1796. They had twelve children.



2. **Katharina Barbara Ober** was born on 16 April 1773. She Died on 7 November 1842 in Leonberg. On 1 July 1804, she married **Johann Christoph Schultz**. He was born in Leonberg

on 11 August 1770, the son of **Johann Adam Schultz** and **Justina Gockels, aka Justine Gotelin**. Johann Christoph died 24 November 1844 in Leonberg. He and Katharina Barbara had 6 children, all born in Leonberg. Two children lived long enough to get married.

(1) **Georg Adam Schultz** was born on 15 May 1809. He died on 30 May 1865 in Leonberg. He married **Christina Sophia Stauch** on 15 November 1835 in Leonberg. She was born on 29 January 1816 in Leonberg. Her parents were **Christoph Jacob Stauch** (born 25 July 1776 in Leonberg) and **Anna Maria Ege** (born 23 December 1778 in Leonberg).

(2) **Justina Margaretha Schultz** was born on 17 February 1815. She died 30 January 1868 in Renningen, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Justina Margaretha married **Georg Michael Bötzel** on 4 September 1842 in Renningen. Georg Michael was born on 25 November 1813 in Renningen. He was the son of **Johann Gottfried Bötzel** (born 253 March 1796 in Renningen) and **Anna Maria Roth** (born 16 March 1778 in Renningen).

3. **Johann Bernhard Ober** was born on 3 February 1777. He was the twin to Georg Martin, described below. Johann Bernhard died at birth.
4. **George Martin Ober**, the twin, was also born on 3 February 1777, but lived to 11 May 1852; he died in Leonberg. On 3 June 1812, he married **Sibylla Jäckle** in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, where she was born on 25 January 1775.

**Georg Martin Ober** was born on 3 February 1777 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died there on 11 May 1852. George Martin married **Sibylla Jäckle** in Heimerdingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 3 June 1812. Sibylla was the daughter of **Johann Conrad Jäckle** ( born 9 October 1740 in Kirchheim unter Teck, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and **Anna Catherina Jäkleinin** (born about 1750 in Heimerdingen). George Martin and Sibylla had two children that we know of. Both children were born before marriage.

1. **N.N. Ober** was born in Leonberg in February 1803 and died there in April 1803.
2. **Johann Ober** was born in Heimerdingen on 30 July 1805. He died in Leonberg on 1 April 1876. On 4 March 1832, Johann married Friederika Christiana Biedermann in Leonberg. They had thirteen children, as described below. One daughter, Luise Wilhelmina Ober, became the mother of Gottlieb Georgii. A son, Carl Gottlieb Georgii, became the father of Luise Maria Ober, the wife of Gottlieb Georgii.

**Johann Ober** was born on 30 July 1805 in Heimerdingen. He died in Leonberg on 1 April 1876. Johann married **Friederika Christiana Biedermann** on 4 March 1832 in Leonberg. She was born there on 19 May 1811 She died in Leonberg on 4 September 1873. Friederika Christiana was the daughter of **Johann Jakob Biedermann** and **Christine Gottliebin Kohler**. Johann Jacob was born on 29 November 1767 in Leonberg and died there on 10 November 1842. He married Christine Gottliebin on 27 January 1793 in Leonberg. She was born in Leonberg on 3 October 1771. They had 7 children, all born in Leonberg. Christine Gottliebin died in Leonberg on 3 October 1829. She was followed 13 years later by Johann Jacob, who died there on 10 November 1842. Johann Ober and Friederika Christian Biederman had thirteen children, all born in Leonberg.

1. **Wilhelm Gottlieb Ober** was born on 5 October 1832. He died thirteen days later, on 18 October 1832.
2. **Johanne Friederike Ober** was born on 4 December 1833. She married **Johann Jacob Schöpfer** on 5 June 1865 in Obertürkheim, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He was born on 2 June 1838 in Obertürkheim. His father was **Hieronymous Schöpfer**, born 18 May 1805 in Obertürkheim. His mother was **Johanna Catharina Stumpp**, who was born in that town on 21 November 1805.
3. **Christian Friederich Ober** was born on 3 April 1835. He died in Leonberg on 11 October 1905. On 23 November 1862, he married **Anna Maria Stümpfler** in Owen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Anna Maria was born on 11 March 1840 in Owen. Her father, **Johann Jacob Stümpfler** was born 11 June 1809 in Kirchheim unter Teck, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Her Mother, **Anna Maria Fischäs**, was born 22 May 1802 in Kirchheim unter Teck. Johann Jacob and Anna Maria were married in Kirchheim unter Teck 11 January 1837. She had previously been married to **Jacob Hirsch**. They had married on 14 January 1829 in Kirchheim. Jacob was born in that town on 2 April 1798 and died there on 30 July 1833. Christian Friederich and Anna Maria had four children that we are aware of, all born in Leonberg.
  - (1) **Christian Gottlieb Ober** was born about two weeks after the wedding, on 9 December 1862.
  - (2) **Christian Friederich Ober** was born on 29 September 1866 and died three years later, on 17 September 1869.
  - (3) **Anna Maria Ober** was born on 16 August 1870. She died six years later, on 7 September 1876.
  - (4) **Caroline Luise Ober** was born on 5 August 1876.
4. **Kanabe Ober** was born on 30 July 1836. He died at birth.
5. **Luise Wilhelmina "Elise" Ober** was born on 16 July 1837. She died 1 March 1913 in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She married **Jacob Friederich Georgii** on 6 October 1863 in Plüderhausen. Jacob Friederich is the son of George Christoph Georgii and Anna Maria Banzhaf. The family was described in the previous section because one of the children is **Gottlieb Georgii**.
6. **Johann Martin Ober** was born on 4 November 1838. He died on 27 May 1906 in Wurmberg, Enzkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. On 8 October 1865, He married **Elisabeth Dorothea Flitsch** in Wurmberg. She was born there on 10 March 1839, the daughter of **Gottfried Flitsch** and **Johanne Stumpf**. Gottfried was born on 2 September 1802 in Wurmberg; he died there on 27 May 1906. Gottfried married Johanne on 28 November 1830 in Wurmberg, where she was born on 24 January 1810. Johanne died in Wurmberg on 22 September 1865. Johann Martin and Elisabeth Dorothea had eight children. After she died, he married **Emilie Sophia Wickel**, who was born on 14 August 1841 in Wurmberg. They were married on 18 October 1891 in that town. She was the daughter of Karl August Wickel and Karoline Friederike Katz. Johann Martin and Emilie Sophia had no children that



we know of. The children of Johann Martin Ober and Elisabeth Dorothea Flitsch are all born in Wurmberg.

**(1) Rosine Friederike Flitch, aka, Rosine Friederike Ober**, born 18 April 1863. She was born before the marriage. She married **Ernst August Därlhinger** in Pforzheim, Stadtkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. He was born there on 17 April 1855 to **Christian Därlhinger** and Katharina Hers.

**(2) Georg Gottfried Ober** was born on 29 April 1866. He died in Wurmberg on 20 November 1899. We have found no marriage record.

**(3) Catharina Ober** was born on 19 March 1868. She died about six months later, on 5 September 1861.

**(4) Luise Wilhelmina Ober** was born on 4 January 1870. She married **Karl Stopp** on 30 July 1892 in Niefern-Öschelbronn, Enzkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. Karl was born in Niefern on 1 November, the son of Johann and Magdaline Stopp.

**(5) Christian Friederich Ober** was born on 9 August 1873. He married **Elise Brand** on 14 November 1896 in Pforzheim, Stadtkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Pforzheim on 6 January 1872, the daughter of Christian Brand and Elise Klein.

**(6) Katharina Ober** was born on 15 March 1879. She died three days later, on 18 March 1879.

**(7) Jacob Ober** was born on 31 January 1881. He married **Gottliebin Rosine Reißer, aka, Gottliebin Rosine Rosser**, on 15 September 1906 in Pforzheim. She was born in Grunbach, Engelsbrand, Enzkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. Her parents were **Johann Georg Reißer** (born 25 July 1857 in Engelsbrand) and **Christiana Ernestine Mößner, aka, Christiana Ernestine Mossner** (born 14 April 1859 in Engelsbrand). We know of one child, Emilie Hedwig Ober, born 9 August 1910 in Pforzheim. She married **Karl Hans Karg, aka, Karl Xaver Karg**, on 17 October 1931 in Pforzheim. He died 26 July 1941 in Pforzheim. Karl was the son of **Karl Karg and Luise Braun**.

7. **Sophia Maria Ober** was born on 10 July 1840. She died nine months later, on 5-April 1841.
8. **Karl Gottlieb Georgii** was born on 24 October 1841. He died in Leonberg on 13 January 1919. He married **Anna Maria Georgii** on 14 October 1866 in Plüderhausen, as mentioned previously. She was born on 19 July 1845 in Plüderhausen, the daughter of **Georg Christoph Georgii** and **Anna Maria Banzhaf** (see Georgii line in previous section). Karl Gottlieb and Anna Maria will have two daughters who will be of interest to the American Georgii descendants. **Luise Maria Ober** will marry **Gottlieb Georgii**. **Anna Martha Ober** will be the ancestor of several Georgii cousins in the New Jersey and Connecticut region. See below.
9. **Karl Gottlob Ober** was born on 10 September 1845. He died about six months later, on 26 March 1846.
10. **Karolina Wilhelmina Ober** was born on 15 July 1847. Apparently, she had a child that died at birth on 22 September 1873. She then married a man with the family name Sigmund on 25 April 1875 in Leonberg. We have no further information.

11. **Sophia Maria Ober** born 4 March 1849. This is the second Sophia Maria. She lived to be seven years old, dying on 22 December 1856.
12. **Jacob Gottlob Ober** was born on 18 February 1851. He died in Leonberg 25 May 1915, after two marriages. The first marriage was to **Karziska Zürn, aka Franziska Zürn**, on 21 September 1880 in Leonberg. Karziska was born there on 26 February 1853, the daughter of **Johann Friederich Zürn** and **Maria Suzanna Geiger or Seifer**. We have a record for one child, **Anna Ober**, born 19 February 1876 in Leonberg. Karziska died there on 20 April 1893. The second marriage was to Caroline **Christiane Seuffer** on 12 November 1893 in Leonberg. She was born there on 30 April 1850, the daughter of **Johann Seuffer** and **Heinrike Katharina Wagner**. Caroline Christiane died in Leonberg on 11 June 1908. Jacob Gottlob was her second husband. On 3 December 1874, she had married **Johann Strübel** in Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He was born there on 10 February 1843; he died in Stuttgart on 30 March 1891. Johann was the son of **Georg Strübel** and **Suzanna Bosch**. We have no record of any children.
13. **David Wilhelm Ober** was born on 30 December 1852. He died in Großbottwar, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 17 April 1885. David Wilhelm married **Luise Christiana Baumann** on 10 September 1878 in Großbottwar. She was born on 23 October 1857 in Lippoldsweller, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Her father was **Johann Baumann**, born 16 September 1827 in Backnang. Johann married **Maria Luise Elser** on 14 July 1857 in Heutensbach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Marie Luise was born there on 13 August 1831. David Wilhelm Ober had five children. None lived long enough to marry.

**Karl Gottlieb "Gottlieb" Ober** was born on 24 October 1841 in Leonberg, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died there on 13 January 1919. He married **Anna Maria Georgii** on 14 October 1866 in her hometown of Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She died in Leonberg in May 1928. As mentioned previously, Anna Maria was the daughter of **Georg Christoph Georgii** and **Friederika Christiana Biedermann** (see previous section). Karl Gottlieb and Anna Maria will have twelve children, all born in Leonberg.

1. **Luise Maria Ober** was born on 7 September 1867. She died in East Rutherford, New Jersey, USA, on 27-January 1909. She married her first cousin, Gottlieb Georgii, on 12 May 1894 in Manhattan, New York, USA. Gottlieb was born on 12 March 1869, the son of Jacob Friederich Georgii and Luise Wilhelmina Ober. He died in Southington, Connecticut, USA on 22 January 1938. Before they were married, they Luise Maria gave birth to the first of three children, all sons, in Leonberg. Since most of this Georgii history is centered upon the lives of Gottlieb and Luise Maria, we will not detail their life in this section. The three sons are **(1) Jacob Gottlob Ober, aka Charles Georgii, aka Gottlob Georgii**, born 21 January 1889 in Leonberg. He died on 23 November 1955 in East Rutherford, Bergen, New Jersey, USA; he lived there under the name **Charles George**. Charles married **Anna Radtke, or Radke**, in 1912 somewhere in New Jersey. Anna was born in Newark, Essex, New Jersey on 26

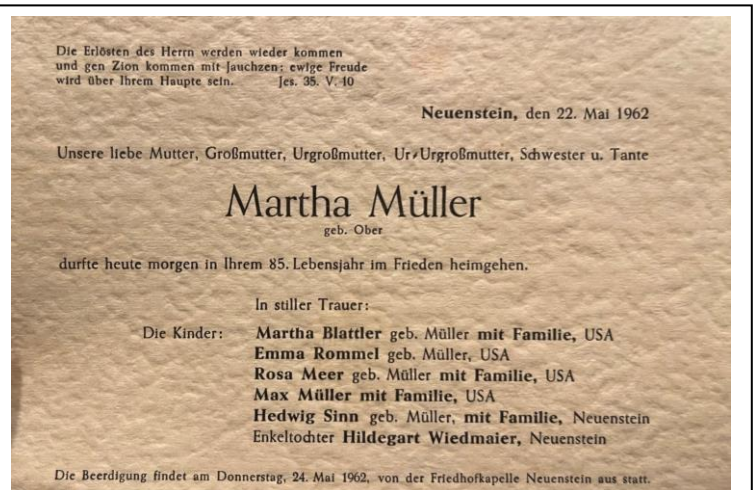
December 1888. Her parents, **Carl “Charles” Radtke** and **Augusta Kasilke** were born in Germany (possibly West Prussia). Anna died in Irvington, Essex, New Jersey in May 1872.

**(2) William August “Bill” Georgii**, born 30 April 1895 in Manhattan, New York, USA. He died in Southington, Hartford, Connecticut on 19 September 1956. He married Sarah O’Connell in Southington on 30 April 1919. She was born on 27 December 1892 in Wareham, Plymouth, Massachusetts, USA. Her father, **Daniel John O’Connell**, was born in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Daniel’s father, **John Thomas O’Connell**, was in the British army and was stationed there at the time; he was born in Port Talbot, Glamorgan, Wales in 1825. Daniel John died in Southington in 1925. Sarah’s mother, **Mary McNamara**, was born in Merthyr Tydfil, Glamorgan, Wales in July 1856.

**(3) Adolph Georgii** was born on 25 December 1896 in Manhattan. We do not have much more information about him.

2. **Gottlieb Wilhelm Ober** was born on 8 February 1869. He died at the age of seven in Leonberg, on 30 March 1876.
3. **Anna Maria Ober** was born on 10 May 1870. She died there at the age of six, on 7 September 1876.
4. **Karl Wilhelm Ober** was born on 30 January 1872. He died in Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 27 August 1942. He married **Maria Krageisen**, probably around 1900 in Leonberg. They had a daughter named **Luise Wilhelmina Ober**, who was born on 15 May 1901 in Leonberg.
5. **Wilhelmina Magdelina “Mina” Ober** was born on 19 March 1873. We believe that this is the “Mina” Ober that accompanied Gottlob “Charles” Georgii, the first son of Gottlieb and Luise Maria Georgii to Manhattan. The immigration through Ellis Island occurred on 29 January 1895 on the ship Friesland. We have found no further information.
6. **Gustav Adolf Ober** was born on 26-10-1874. He married **Karolina Luise Baumgärtner, or Karolina Luise Baumgärtner**, on 14 November 1908 in Aldingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in that town on 19 May 1879. Her father was **Johann Gottlieb Baumgärtner**, born 10 October 1844 in Aldingen. Her mother was **Christiana Margaretha Kloz**, born 4 August 1847 in the same town, where she married Johann Gottlieb on 14 November 1908.
7. **Jacob Adolf Ober** was born on 21 February 1876. We have no other information.

8. **Anna Martha “Martha” Ober** was born on 16 July 1877. She died on 22 May 1962 in Neuenstein, Hohenlohekreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. On 29 December 1900, She married **Albert Wilhelm Müller, aka Wilhelm Albert Müller**, in Leonberg. A year earlier, Anna Martha had given birth to a daughter named **Martha Ober** in Plüderhausen. Martha will emigrate to the United States and marry, as will her sister **Frieda Rosa Müller**. Albert was born in Jerichow, Jerichower Land, Saxony-Anhalt, Germany. The parents of Albert Wilhelm were **Otto Müller** and **Minna Scheer**. The children of Albert Wilhelm and Anna Martha are:

**(1) Martha Anna Ober, aka, Martha Anna Müller**, born 6 December 1899 in Plüderhausen. She died on 1 February 1976 in Lebanon, New London, Connecticut, USA. The ship manifest for the S.S. Olympic shows Martha arriving in New York on 4 April 1923. The ship had departed Cherbourg, France, on 28 March. Her occupation is listed as “domestic”. Her nationality is listed as German. Her last residence is listed as Switzerland. She gives the name Albert Muller of Stuttgart, Germany, as nearest relative or friend. Two days after arriving in New York, on 6 April 1923, Martha married **John Louis Blattler, aka Johann Luis Blättler**, in Manhattan. John Louis was born in Kerns, Obwalden, Switzerland on 21-February 1887, the son of **Melchior Blattler** and **Marie Ettlen**. He died in New London, New London, Connecticut on 7 July 1959. He had immigrated to Manhattan, New York City on 22 December 1922, also aboard the S.S. Olympic out of Cherbourg. It appears that John Louis had been in New York in 1910. A person listed as Johann Blatter arrived there on 4 March 1910 aboard the S.S. Chicago, out of Le Havre, Normandy, France. This person was 22 years old, was a resident of Kerns, Switzerland, and gave the Melchior family as a contact. In the 1922 manifest, “Johann Batter” gives his occupation as farmer, his languages as German and English, his nationality as Swiss, his race as German and his last residence as Giswil, Obwalden, Switzerland. On the same day that **John Blatter** arrived immigrated to New York, 22 December 1922, he declared his intention to become a citizen in the district court of New York. He declares that he arrived on or about 20 December 1922 aboard the S.S. Olympic. He declares that his last foreign residence was Switzerland, that he is 35 years old and was born in the canton of Obwalden, Switzerland on 21 February 1887. John Blatter is a



farmer with fair complexion. His height is 5 feet 3 inches; his weight is 165 pounds. John has brown hair and grey eyes. Martha Anna was not naturalized until 1 February 1945 when she was living in Norwich, New London, Connecticut. John and Martha had five children. All, except the last, were born in Passaic County, New Jersey. **Marie Martha Blattler** was born on 7 July 1923 in Patterson. She married **John T. Skulczyk**. **Frieda G. Blattler** was born on 14 November 1924 in Wayne, Passaic, New Jersey. She married **Elias William "Willie" Skulczyk**. These two men appear to be brothers. **Albert Charles Blattler** was born on 29 January 1926 in Wayne. He married a woman named Anna. **John Louis Blattler** was born on 11 May 1929 in Wayne. He married **Alice E. "Betty" Newton** in Montville, New London, Connecticut. **Cynthia Arlene Blattler** was born on 24 July 1934 in Northfield, Litchfield, Connecticut. She married **Elliot Arthur Dombroski** in Norwich.

**(2) Emma Augusta Müller** was born on 29 January 1901 in Burg bei Magdeburg, Jerichower Land, Saxony-Anhalt, Germany. She married **Ernst Gustav Rommel** sometime between 1930 and 1935, probably in New York City. We know from census data that Ernst and Emma Rommel were married and living in Ridgewood, Queens, New York in 1935 and 1940. They were still living there on 12 March 1945, when Emma was naturalized. By 1950, they had moved to East Lyme, New London, Connecticut. We do not know where Ernst and Emma Rommel died. We do not know exactly when Emma immigrated to the United States. Ernst Rommel was in Brooklyn, New York in June 1925. He was born on 3 April 1899 in Owen, Esslingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. According to a New York census taken that year, Ernst was living with his aunt Frieda Rommel, his sister Frieda Maria, and brother Karl Edouard (Carl Edward). They lived at 369 Manahan St. According to this census, Aunt Frieda had been in the US for 35 years. She was 56 years old and born in Germany. Karl (Carl) had been here 2 years, Ernst 7 months, and Frieda 2 weeks. We know that Ernst's parents were born and died in Owen, Esslingen, Baden-Württemberg, Germany, but were married in Allegheny City, Allegheny, Pennsylvania, USA on 25 March 1893. This is consistent with Aunt Frieda being here for 35 years. Ernst returned to Germany for a short time, returned on 8 October 1926 on the SS Albert Ballin. His intention was to stay permanently. His occupation is tinsmith. His local contact is Aunt Frieda Rommel, living at 369 Manahan St. His German contact is his father, Georg who lives in Owen; this would be a reference to Johann Georg Rommel, born 26 December 1869 in Owen. He went by the name John G. Rommel on his wedding records. Aunt Frieda was a widow in the 1950 census. We suspect that her husband was Johann (John) Rommel. When Karl first arrived in New York on 21 October 1923 aboard the SS Hansa, his contact was John Rommel of Brooklyn. The parents of Ernst, Frieda and Karl were Johann Georg (John George) Rommel a blacksmith, and Wilhelmina Dorothea Rabel. We mentioned the Allegheny wedding above. Wilhelmina has a previous connection with Pennsylvania. She had visited in 1889, along with her sister Rosina Frederika. On 5 September 1889, they arrived at New York City on the SS Rotterdam from Rotterdam. Their occupation was listed as cook and their destination was Pittsburg, Pennsylvania. Wilhelmina is 18 years old; her sister, listed as Fredericka, is 17 years old.

Three years later, both Wilhelmina Rabel and Johann George Rommel arrive in New York City aboard the SS Columbia. The date is 20 December 1892. Wilhelmina lists her destination as Pittsburg. Georg, a blacksmith, lists his destination as Brooklyn. Both are listed as US citizens. They will be married three months later in Alleghany City, an area north of Pittsburgh. Georg and Wilhemina will give birth to three children in Pennsylvania. They then appear to return to Owen, Germany where they have three more children, including Ernst Gustav.

**(3) Frida Rosa “Rose” Müller** was born on 15 August 1905 in Leonberg. Rose died in December 1986 in Damarest, Bergen, New Jersey, USA. She married **Paul Meer**, probably in New Jersey, about 1927. She and Paul had a son, **Paul Meer, Jr.**, born on 13 June 1928 in Wyckoff, Bergen, New Jersey. We have not found an immigration record for Rose. Her husband, Paul Meer, was born in Griswil, Obwalden, Switzerland, on 17 February 1898. Note that Obwalden is the same Swiss Canton from which **John Blatter**, the husband of Martha Anna, came. According to a February 1923 travel record, Paul Meer was to travel to the United States on the S.S. Pittsburgh out of Cherbourg, France. His birthplace is Griswil, Switzerland and his current residence is Bowil, Bern, Switzerland. His occupation is listed as “mechaniker” or mechanic. His purpose was to visit, not emigrate. The ship manifest for the Pittsburgh shows that this Paul Meer left Cherbourg on 14 February 1923 and arrived in New York City on 26 February 1923. He is listed as an unmarried mechanic, age 24, whose country of origin is Switzerland. The ultimate destination is Madison, Dane, Wisconsin. This might have been the wrong Paul Meer. A 1924 city directory for Harrison, Hudson, New Jersey shows a Paul Meer working as a machinist. He resides at 311 Davis Avenue. The next record we have is the 1930 census for Wyckoff, New Jersey. He is married to Rose [Müller] and has a son named Paul, as noted above. He is 32 years old and born in Switzerland. She is 24 and born in Germany. His first marriage was at age 29; her first marriage was at age 22. They rent a home on Wyckoff Avenue for \$35 per month. This would appear to be the first marriage for each of them. Paul is a machinist at an airplane company. The 1940 census for Midland Park, Bergen, New Jersey shows Paul working as a machinist at Wright Aeronautical Corporation in Woodbridge. The family lives at 426 Godwin Avenue in Midland Park. This information is the same in the 1960 city directory.

**(4) Wilhelm Max Müller** was born on 14 May 1907 in Leonberg. He died on 22 June 1994 in Fresno, Fresno, California, USA. He arrived in New York on aboard the Ship Stuttgart on 12 November 1927 using the name Max Mueller. In the United States, he went by the names “Max”, Max Wilhelm, or Max William. Max was listed as a laborer, age 20, on the ship record. His destination is listed as Patterson, New Jersey. His contact is John Blatter, husband of his sister Martha Anna (see above). John and Martha live in Patterson. Max declares that this is a permanent move to the United States. On 15 September 1927, Max marries Katharina Rehs in Ridgewood, Bergen, New Jersey. Katharina was born in Einöd, a village in Homburg, Saarpfalz, Saarland, Germany on 18 September 1906. Katharina arrived in New York on 21 November 1926 aboard the ship Berlin. She is a single woman age 20

years. Her German relative is listed as Franz Rehs, her foster father. Her destination is Jersey City, New Jersey, where lives her Uncle Josef Reiss. Katharina's occupation is listed as cook. Max is listed as a chauffeur in 1933 and 1936 naturalization papers. The live in New Jersey (Hillside and Irvington, respectively). The 1940 and 1950 censuses show him as a machine operator Fort Lee and Ridgefield. By the time Katharina dies, 5 May 1984, they are living in Tuscon, Pima, Arizona. According to her obituary, Max had been working at Intermountain Aviation and Evergreen Maintenance Center, Inc. Intermountain Aviation is known to have been a CIA operation during the Vietnam War era. They operated out of Marana Army Air Field near Tuscon. Max Mueller died on 22 June 1994 in Fresno, Fresno, California. Max and Katharina had two children, both born in New Jersey. Richard Max Mueller was born on 21 September 1937; he died in Fresno, California in August 2021. Edith K. Mueller was born about 1942.

**(5) Mina Hedwig Müller** was born on 20-September 1913 in Leonberg. She died on 31 July 1970 in Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Mina Hedwig married **Eugen Löffler** in Leonberg on 28 January 1935. He was born on 12 January 1910 in Bad Rappenau, Heilbronn, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany He died in 1938 in Leonberg. Eugen was the son of **Martin Löffler** and **Christina "Lina" Mugele**. Martin was born on 4 August 1880 in Bad Rappenau. He married Christina there on 24 February 1906. She was born in Kesselfeld, Hohenlohekreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, on 15 February 1880. We believe that Eugen and Mina Hedwig had two or three children. One of these was a daughter named **Helga Ursula Löffler**, who lived in New Jersey for a time. We have a record of Helga Ursula arriving in New York via Lufthansa Airlines on 19 February 1959. Her birth date is given as 18 November 1939. Her birthplace, and permanent residence, is Neuenstein, Germany. Her United States address is given as 426 Godwin Avenue, Midland Park, New Jersey. This is the address of her aunt Frida Rosa [Muller] Meer (see above). Mina Hedwig remarried on 29 March 1948 in Neuenstein, Hohenlohekreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Her second husband was **Wilhelm Schneider Sinn**. He was born on 18 March 1910 in Neuenstein. There is no record of a previous wife. Wilhelm was the son of Albert Sinn and Emma Flack.

Following are some photos related to the Ober-Muller family. The hand-written comments might be from Martha Ober-Müller, who married John Blatter in New York and who lived in New Jersey and Connecticut. They might also be from her mother Anna Martha [Georgii] Ober for her daughter. Note that grossmutter and grossvater translate to grandmother and grandfather. Tante and onkel are aunt and uncle (although the person writing on the photos uses the abbreviation "u." for uncle).

Some members of the Ober-Müller family. Grossmutter and Grossvater Ober are sitting near the front. These would be Karl Gottlieb and Anna Martha [Georgii] Ober. Grossmutter Müller, on the far right, would be Minna [Scheer] Müller, the wife of Otto Müller. The older children appear to be those of Gottlieb and Anna Maria, but much guesswork is involved. All were born in Leonberg, Germany. In the back row, Adolph might be Gustav Adolph Ober, born 26 October 1874. Jacob may be Jacob Adolf born 21 February 1876. Wilhelm may be Gottlieb Wilhelm, born 8 February 1869. The woman next to him, called Rosa Ober might be Emily Rosina, born 23 January 1884. The young girl in the front may be Emma Auguste Ober, born 1 January 1890. Behind her, is Aunt Frida, who may be Frieda Sophie Ober, born 1 May 1885.

One of the daughters of Karl Gottlieb and Anna Maria Ober was Martha Anna Ober. She was born in Leonberg, Germany, on 16-Jule 1877. Martha Anna married Albert Wilhelm Müller on 29 December 1900 in Leonberg. Three of their daughters moved to the United States, as noted above. The first was Martha Anna Ober-Müller, born 6 December 1899 in Plüderhausen. The second was Frida Rosa "Rose" Müller, born 15-August 1905 in Leonberg. Another sister was Emma Augusta Müller, born 29-january 1901 in Burg bei Magdeburg, Germany. Martha emigrated to New York, arriving on 4 April 1923. Her

previous residence was Switzerland. Two days after arriving, she married John Blatter in Manhattan. John was born in Kerns, Switzerland on 21 February 1887. His birth name is Johann Luis Blattler. They moved to New Jersey and then to New London,

Connecticut. We do not know when Rose emigrated, but she married another Swiss resident, Paul Meer, probably around 1927 in New York or New Jersey. They had a son named Paul, who was born on 13 June 1928 in Wyckoff, New Jersey. Paul was born in Griswil, Switzerland on 17 February 1898. Emma emigrated to New York City sometime between 1930 and 1935. She married Ernst Gustav Rommel and they lived in Queens until at least 1945, when Emma was naturalized. The 1950 census shows them living in East Lyme, New London, Connecticut. The accompanying photo shows the three sisters Martha, Rose and Emma taken in 1966.

The photo to the right shows the Paul Meer family: Paul and Rose Müller Meer, Paul, Jr., and a young girl that we have not identified. The photo was taken in 1945, presumably in Midland Park, New Jersey.

## 9. Georgii in German History

### Introduction

We can trace the direct ancestors of Gottlieb Georgii back to Johann and Margaretha Barbara Georgii. They were probably born around 1670 in what now is known as the German state of Baden-Württemberg, Germany. The Georgii family has documented roots that go back much farther. It turns out that the Georgii family emigrated from Switzerland. The original family, who may have gone by the name Georgii or Schorsch, came from the northern Italian region of Lombardy. The names Schorch, Jörg, Georgi and Giorgi all are equivalent to the name George in English. They became the family names Georgii, Schorsch, etc.

The following information is taken from books and articles written in German. In most cases, they are written in the archaic German of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. This, plus the use of military, royal, and civilian titles, makes the translations difficult. One also must remember that the map of Europe was quite different at the time of the early Georgii family from what it is today. For much of the history to make sense, the reader needs to have knowledge of such things as the Holy Roman Empire and the Thirty Years War. The goal of this section is simply to name a few notable members of the Georgii family throughout German history. I was able to snatch a few relevant facts from the books and produce a translation for each person that makes some sense. The reader can “Google” most city and territory names encountered below.

I wish I knew how the Gottlieb branch of the Georgii family fits in with the individuals outlined below. We do know that the Württemberg Georgii families all extend from this Italian-Swiss heritage. There is another Georgii family in northern Germany which extends from Russian-Polish roots. I know very little about them.

All the books that I referenced can be downloaded from Google Books. If anyone can give me better translations, I would appreciate the help. I hope my family members will enjoy what little I have accomplished here. Think of it as a few minutes of entertainment and a short journey into the past.

Since the first edition of this history, I have expanded upon the information about the descendants of some of the Georgii family members described below. One discovery was that several Georgii descendants moved to the United States in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. A few might even be considered pioneers of the Western frontier (what we now refer to as the Midwest). Others came later and became prominent in their Midwest communities. They married into families that had originally moved westward from New York and other states on the Eastern Seaboard. I found these stories to be fascinating. I hope the reader feels the same.

### Early Georgii Family

In the year 1298, a family by the name of Georgii, or Giorgi, or Schorsch emigrated from Pavia, in Lombardy, Northern Italy, to Splügen in Grisons, Switzerland. Grisons is the German name for the area; it is called Graubünden in Switzerland. This information comes from the 1837 handwritten records of Colonel von Schorsch, who died in Andeer in Grisons, Switzerland at the age of 75 years [Ref. 2].



Though now a canton in Switzerland, it was not a member of the Swiss Confederacy at the time. It was still part of the Holy Roman Empire. Graubünden translates to “Grey League”; it was part of a confederacy of three leagues. The name came from the color of the clothes worn by the residents of the area.

By 1325, Georg Georgiis had moved his family to Rheinwald in Graubünden. Rheinwald is a valley running East-West. For centuries, the Georgii family held respected state offices in Valtellina, Switzerland, or distinguished themselves in military service, and were involved politically in the region. The region, generally referred to as Raetia or Rhaetia, was a province of the Roman Empire and included parts of Switzerland, Bavaria, Lombardy, and Württemberg.

There were several wars involving religion (Protestant - Catholic) and control of the passes in Graubünden. Georg von Georgii, Governor of Graubünden, was a minister in the signing of the Second Müsso War Peace treaty in 1531. Another of these wars was called the Bündner Wirren (1618 – 1639). In 1622, there was a treaty involving Austria. Ritter (Knight) Georg von Georgii was sent as an envoy to the court of Archduke Ferdinand to sign on behalf of the high court of Rheinwald and Shams, Grisons. A later treaty was signed by Ritter Georg von Georgii and Ritter Jörg von Schorsch.

### **Georg Georgiis**

By 1325, moved from Splügen to Rheinwald, Graubünden, Switzerland. He is the origin of Georgii and Schorsch families in Germany and Switzerland.

### **Georg von Georgii, Governor**

In 1531, Governor and Minister of Graubünden, Switzerland, in the signing of the second Müsso war peace treaty with Johann Jacob de Medices. Shortly after, became envoy to Archduke Ferdinand of Austria.

### **Georg von Georgii, Knight**

Ritter (Knight) Georg von Georgii signed the January 1622 treaty ending the Bündner Wirren. Representing the districts of Rheinwald and Shams in Graubünden.

### **Johann von Georgii**

Minister of Graubünden for the signing of the Mailänder Kapitulates (Milan Capitulation) of 1639. Governor of Valtellina, Graubünden, Switzerland from 1647.

### **Cyriacus Jörg**

Born about 1540, Untermäiselstein, Bayern (Bavaria), Germany; died 18 March 1608, Strasbourg. Parents were Johann Jörg and Maria Anna Hermann. Married, first, Anna Schmidt in Strasbourg on 23 January 1570. She died in or before September 1571 after giving birth to Cyriacus Jörg. Married, second, Agnes Wild in Strasbourg on 16-September 1571. She was born about 1544 in Offenburg, Baden-Württemberg. Her father was Martin Wild. Cyriacus and Agnes had five children. She died in Strasbourg on 26 February 1628. The children, all born in Strasbourg, are:

- (1) Johann Conrad, (born 1572);
- (2) Susanna, born 1573;
- (3) Maria, born 1574;
- (4) Ursula, born 17 May 1577; and
- (5) **Martin Georgii**, born 12 December 1582 (**see below**).

Straßburg (Strassburg) was then part of Württemberg, Germany but is now part of the Alsace region of France and is spelled Strasbourg.

**Martin von Georgii**, Son of Cyriacus, Jörg

Born 12 December 1582 in Strasbourg; died 26 January 1658 in Strasbourg. He changed his last name from Jörg to Georgii. He married Martha Stock, who was born 21 February 1591 in Strasbourg. She was the daughter of Daniel Stock and Maria Eschlar. Martin and Martha had three children that we are aware of. They were all born in Strasbourg. **(1) Jacob Simon Georgii** was born on 16 May 1629. He married Eve Johanna Stenger in Strasbourg on 6 October 1657 (**see below**). **(2) Martha Georgii** was born on 4 April 1633. She married Johann Georg Heckler in Strasbourg. **(3) Johann Martin Georgii** was born about 1640. We have no further information about him. Martha Stock Georgii died on 21 September 1672 in Strasbourg. Martin may have married Anna Wagner before he married her. We have found no record of children by Anna.

**Jacob Simon von Georgii**, son of Martin.

A Württemberg Bailiff.

Born 16 May 1629 in Strasbourg; died 1 December 1702 in Hornberg, Germany. Jacob Simon married Eva Johanna Stenger on 6 October 1657 in Strasbourg. She was born on 30 October 1630 in what is now Diemeringen, Alsace, France (then part of Germany). Her parents were Samson Stenger and Maria Elisabeth Beuschel. Eva Johanna died in Esslingen on 27 December 1700. Jacob Simon and Eva Johanna had seven children, all born in Strasbourg.

- (1) **Johann Martin "Hans" Georgii**, born 7 July 1658; died 20 April 1738 in Bad Urach. Married Catherina Margaretha Kiefer on 9 October 1688 in Pforzheim (**see below**).
- (2) Maria Johanna Georgii, born 28 December 1659; died in Strasbourg on 1 December 1665 at age 5.
- (3) Jacob Simon Georgii, born 30 April 1662; died 11 November 1737 in Ansbach, Bavaria, Germany. Married Maria Dorothea Heinold on 8 August 1693 in Ottengen, Bavaria. She was born 9 May 1667 in Balgheim, Bavaria. She died 26 December 1758 in Ansbach.
- (4) **Samson Georgii**, born 18 February 1664; buried 4 June 1724 in Stuttgart. Samson was married twice. He married Rosemunda Jacobea von Rothe on 21 May 1695 in Neuffen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 28 September 1677 in Neuffen; she was the daughter of David von Rothe and Anna Justina Jäger. Simon and Rosmunda had five children before she died in Hornberg on 19 June 1706. Samson then married Sophia Justina Schmidlin in Hornberg on 9 August 1707. She was born in Markgröningen on 4 July 1683, the daughter of Johann David

Schmidlin and Maria Judith Stockmayer. Samson and Sophia Justina had four children before she died in Backnang on 9 September 1754 (**see below**).

(5) Maria Martha Georgii, born 5 May 1667; died in November 1745 in Stuttgart. She married Johann Philipp Datt on 1 July 1704 in Esslingen. Johann Philipp was born there on 29 October 1654, the son of Johann and Anna Elisabetha Datt. Johann Philipp died on 28 February 1722 in Stuttgart. Their three children were all born there: Johann Philipp (born 16 August 1706), Johanna Elisabetha (born 22 January 1708) and Philipp Jacob (born 22 October 1709).

(6) Johanna Elisabetha Georgii, born 25 July 1670; died 22 December 1737 in Königsbronn, Baden-Württemberg. She was married three times, at least according to several published family trees. While there is evidence that all three spouses existed, we have found no evidence of the actual marriages. The first marriage is to Heinrich Osten, baptized 23 December 1667 in Erfurt, Thuringia, Germany. They were supposedly married on 4 May 1691 (Strasbourg?). The second marriage is to Johann Michael Erhardt, sometime between 1712 and 1715. He was born on 15 May 1659 in Wildberg, Baden-Württemberg. He died 8 February 1724 in Stuttgart. Finally, she was married to Johann Christoph Aulber. He was born 29 January 1675 in Waiblingen, Baden-Württemberg. He died on 2 June 1743 in Königsbronn.

(7) Anna Catherina Georgii, born 19 January 1672; died 27 October 1757 in Stuttgart. She married Johann Conrad Rößler, aka, Johann Conrad Roessler, on 21 April 1696 in Esslingen. Johann Conrad was born in Hoheneck, Baden-Württemberg, on 3 May 1669. His parents were Johann Conrad Roessler and Christiana Elisabetha Schmidlin. He died on 3 March 1718 in Stuttgart. Johann Conrad and Christiana Elisabetha had four children, all born in Schorndorf: **(1)** Sibylla Catherina (born 28 January 1699), **(2)** Henrica Juliana (born 21 October 1700), **(3)** Emanuel Benjamin (born 7 April 1703) and **(4)** Christiana Friederica (born 22 August 1706).

### **Johann Paul von Georgii**

In 1703, a Major; high criminal judge of Valtellina, Switzerland in 1713. Envoy to renewed Mailander Kapitulates 1726; president of syndicators and Baliff of Maiendfeld, Graubünden, Switzerland in 1733.

### **Johann Martin “Hans” von Georgii**, son of Jacob Simon.

Baliff of Margraviate of Baden until defeat by French in 1689, when the region was taken over by France (including Strasbourg). Governor of Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg.

Born 7 Jul 1658, Strasbourg; died 20 Apr 1738, Bad Urach. Married Catherina Margaretha Kiefer on 9-October 1688 in Pforzheim, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Graben, Baden-Württemberg, on 10 September 1670, the daughter of Erhard Kiefer and Susanna Maria Däkher. She was buried on 24 December 1730 in Bad Urach. Johann Martin and Catharina had eight children, all born in Bad Urach, except for one.

(1) Jacob Simon Georgii, born 8 March 1698; died 1764 in Feuerthalen, Zurich, Switzerland. Married Anna Catharina Anhorn von Hartweis.

(2) Jacob Erhard Georgii, born 11 March 1691 in Lorch, Baden-Württemberg.

(3) **Friedrich Heinrich Georgii**, born 23 December 1692; died 28 August 1755 in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. Married Maria Magdalena Zeller on 18 September 1714 in Tübingen (**see below**).

(4) **Johann Eberhard Georgii**, born 10 December 1694; died 20 June 1772 in Ludwigsburg. Married Catharina Magdalena Wolff about 1723 in Baden-Württemberg (**see below**).

(5) Jacob Simon Georgii, baptized 8 March 1698.

(6) **Erhard August Georgii**, baptized 22 July 1700; buried 13 July 1742 in Tübingen. Married Anna Christiana von Weltz on 11 April 1742 (**see below**).

(7) **Philipp Anton Georgii**, born 22 May 1702; died 7 October 1771 in Bad Urach. Married Susanne Margaretha Fischer on 18 February 1727 in Tübingen (**see below**).

(8) **Friedrich Carl Georgii**, aka, Carl Friedrich Georgii, born 23 August 1704; died 28 August 1749 in Tübingen. Married Rosina Elisabetha Unfried about 1730, probably in Markgröningen, Baden-Württemberg, her birthplace (**see below**).

**Samson von Georgii**, son of Jacob Simon von Georgii

Born 18 February 1664 in Strasbourg, Bas Rhin, Alsace, France; buried 4 June 1724 in Stuttgart. Samson was married twice. He married Rosemunda Jacobea von Rothe on 21 May 1695 in Neuffen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 28 September 1677 in Neuffen; she was the daughter of David von Rothe and Anna Justina Jäger. Simon and Rosmunda had five children before she died in Hornberg on 19 June 1706.

(1) David Samson Georgii, born 28 September 1697 in Neuffen; died 29 May 1756 in Backnang, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg. He married Rosina Catharina Pezoldt on 6 October 1722 in Kusterdingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 22 December 1704 in Baiersbronn, Freudestadt, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg, the daughter of Jacob Rudolph Pezholdt and Regina Catharina Unknown. She died 28 April 1754 in Backnang. David Samson and Rozina Catharina Georgii had 10 children, all born in Enzweihingen, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

(2) Friedrich Jacob Georgii was born on 5 January 1699 in Neuffen. He was buried about a year later in Hornberg, Ortenaukreis, Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg, on 6 February 1700.

(3) **Johann Heinrich Georgii** was born on 19 January 1700 in Neuffen; he died on 13 September 1736 in Stuttgart. He married Maria Margaretha Wucherer. We have no information concerning the marriage. Maria Margaretha was born on 10 February 1714 in Nördlingen, Donau-Ries, Swabia, Bavaria, Germany, the son of Adam Friedrich Wucherer and Regina Barbara Wechsler (**see below**).

(4) Ernst Jacob Georgii (baptized 7 January 1703)

(5) Maria Elisabeth Georgii (baptized 22 April 1705).

Samson then married Sophia Justina Schmidlin in Hornberg on 9 August 1707. She was born in Markgröningen on 4 Julz 1683, the daughter of Johann David Schmidlin and Maria Judith Stockmayer. Samson and Sophia Justina had four children before she died in Backnang on 9 September 1754.

(6) Maria Juditha Georgii (baptized 28 June 1708 in Hornberg).

(7) Johann David Georgii (baptized 26 June 1709 in Nürtingen).

(8) Sophia Juliana Georgii (baptized 4 June 1710 in Backnang).

(9) Johann Christian Georgii (baptized 15-July 1716 in Stuttgart).

**Friedrich Heinrich von Georgii**, son of Johann Martin.

Political Consultant.

Born 23 December 1692, in Bad Urach; died 28 Aug 1755 in Tübingen. Married Maria Magdalena Zeller on 18 September 1714 in Tübingen. She was born in that town on 9 July 1690, the daughter of Johann Zeller and Christiana Dorothea Bardili. Johann and Christiana Dorothea were married in Tübingen on 25 May 1689. Friedrich Heinrich and Maria Magdalena von Georgii had six children.

(1) Friederika Dorothea Georgii, baptized 30 July 1715 in Stuttgart; died 16 January 1787 in Stuttgart. She married Adam Heinrich Wickersreuter on 9 October 1715 in Tübingen. Adam Heinrich is the son of Johann Philipp Weikersreuter and Maria Barbara Camerer, aka, Regina Barbara Camaerer. Adam Heinrich and Friederika had four children: **(1)** Maria Philippina, (baptized 15 May 1743, Frankfurt), **(2)** Eberhard Heinrich (baptized 13 July 1745, Stuttgart), **(3)** Maria Dorothea (baptized 3 March 1747, Stuttgart), **(4)** Charlotta Hedwig (baptized 8 August 1752, Stuttgart).

(2) Johann Friedrich Georgii, baptized 15 October 1716 in Stuttgart; died 8 January 1778 in Tübingen. Married Sibylla Catherina Bichlers on 7 February 1764 in Tübingen.

(3) Christian Ludwig Georgii, baptized 23 November 1717 in Stuttgart.

(4) Ferdinand Gottfried Georgii, baptized 27 June 1719, in Tübingen; died 11 November 1792 in Stuttgart. He married Friederika Barbara Böhm (or Bohner) on 11 May 1747 in Tübingen. She was born in Stuttgart on 19 May 1729, the daughter of Egidii Böhm. Ferdinand Gottfried and Friederika Barbara had one child: Eberhardina Heinricha Georgii was baptized on 18 April 1749 in Stuttgart. She died there on 18 May 1753 at the age of four.

(5) Charlotta Sophia Georgii, baptized on 8 March 1721 in Tübingen; buried there on 5 March 1722.

(6) **Christian Heinrich Georgii**, born 9 May 1722 in Tübingen; died 20 March 1794 in Bittenfeld, Baden-Württemberg. He married Maria Friederika Keppler on 11 August 1750 in Bittenfeld (**see below**).



**Johann Eberhard von Georgii**, son of Johann Martin.

Württemberg State Minister.

Born 21 Dec 1694 in Bad Urach; died 20 Jun 1772, in Ludwigsburg. Married Catharina Magdalina Wolff about 1723 in Stuttgart. She was baptized on 1 May 1695 in Stuttgart, the daughter of Johann and Anna Maria Wolff. Johann Eberhard and Catharina Magdalina had four children.

(1) **Christian Eberhard Georgii**, born 18 November 1724 in Stuttgart; died 20 June 1772 in Ludwigsburg. Married Heinricha Dorothea Mauchard on 2 May 1752 in Tübingen (**see below**).

(2) Ulrica Eberhardina Georgii, born 1 July 1727 in Stuttgart; died 7 April 1728 in Ludwigsburg.

(3) Eberhard Gottlob Georgii, born 30 January 1730 in Ludwigsburg.

(4) Eberhard Lebreicht Georgii, born 1 May 1732 in Ludwigsburg.

**Johann Heinrich Georgii**, son of Samson.

Born 19 January 1700 in Neuffen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; buried 14 September 1736 in Stuttgart. He married Maria Margaretha Wücherer; we have no wedding information. Margaretha was born in Nördlingen, Donau-Ries, Swabia, Bavaria, the daughter of Adam Friedrich Wücherer and Regina Barbara Wechsler. She died on 22 February 1790 in Wasungen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thüringen, Germany. Johann Heinrich and Maria Margaretha Georgii had four children.

(1) **Eberhard Heinrich Gottlob Georgii** was born on 12 November 1733 in Ludwigsburg, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; he died on 13 July 1817 in Wasungen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thüringen, Germany. He married Elisabetha Sophia Ernestina Heusinger; we have no marriage information. She was born on 24 October 1754 in Meiningen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thüringen, the daughter of Christian Wilhelm Heusinger and Elisabetha Christiana Luisa Meder. Eberhard Heinrich Gottlob and Elisabetha Sophia Ernestina Georgii had one child that we are aware of. (1) **Philipp Jacob Georgii** was born on 12 October 1780 in Meiningen; he died on 1 December 1855 in Schalkau, Sonneberg, Sachsen-Meiningen, Thuringia, Germany. He married Agnes Hagar Natmessnig. We have no marriage information. She was born 26 December 1785, probably in the state of Thuringia, Germany. She died 19 January 1867 in Schalkau. Philipp Jacob and Agnes Hagar Georgii had two children (**see below**).

(2) Henrietta Margaretha Georgii, baptized 21 January 1735 in Stuttgart, along with twin Johanna Maria. We have no further information.

(3) Johanna Maria Georgii, baptised 21 January 1735 in Stuttgart, along with twin Henrietta Margaretha. We have no further information.

(4) Magdalena Margaretha Sophia Georgii baptized 20 April 1736 in Stuttgart. We have no further information.

**Erhard August von Georgii**, Son of Johann Martin.

General Council of Imperial Free City of Ravensburg.

Born 22 Jul 1700, in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg; buried 13 Jul 1742 in Tübingen, Baden-

She married George Heinrich Müller about 1779, possibly in Maulbronn, Baden-Württemberg. Georg Heinrich was baptized on 23 August 1750 in Stuttgart. She was born there on 26 August 1735, the daughter of Johann Reinhard Rohers and Everhardina Louisa von Keller (**see below**).

(5) Philippina Antonia Georgii, baptized 8 September 1733. We have no further information.

**Philipp Anton von Georgii**, son of Johann Martin.

Württemberg Councilor and Bailiff.

Born 22 May 1702 in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg; died 7 October 1771 in Bad Urach. He married Susanna Margaretha Fischer on 18 February 1727 in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. She was baptized in that town on 8 February 1710. Her parents, Johann Georg Fischer and Maria Susanne Bayer, were married there on 17 July 1708. Philipp Anton and Susanna Margaretha had three children, all born in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg.

(1) Maria Friederike Georgii, born 8 March 1735; died 12 May 1814 in Ulm, Baden-Württemberg. She married Wilhelm Gottfried von Moser on 19 July 1757 in Bad Urach. He was born in Tübingen on 27 November 1729, the son of Johann Jacob von Moser and Friederike Rosine Vischer. Johann Jacob died on 31 January 1793 in Ulm. He and Maria Friederike had six children: **(1)** Johanna Friederike von Moser, born 30 April 1758 in Stuttgart; died 20 October 1830 in Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. **(2)** Johann Philipp von Moser, born 29 March 1760 in Ulm; died 27 November 1760 in Ulm. **(3)** Frierich Wilhelm von Moser, Baptized 24 December

1761 in Bad Urach; died 6 January 1795 in Ulm. **(4)** Eberhardine Dorothea von Moser, born 30 July 1763 in Ulm; died 1764. **(5)** Philippine von Moser, born 30 July 1763 (twin to Eberhardina Dorothea). **(6)** Beate Wilhelmina von Moser, born 27 October 1764 in Babanhausen, Hesse, Germany; died 26 August 1820 in Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg.

(2) Johann Philipp Georgii was born on 7 April 1737 in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg. Married Johanna Friederike Wächter, date unknown. She was baptized on 3 September 1748 in Stuttgart. She was the daughter of Franz Carl Wächter and Catherina Elisabetha Oslander, who were married in September 1730 in Markgröningen, Baden-Württemberg. Johanna Friederike died on 3 February 1748 in Stuttgart,

(3) Philipp Heinrich Georgii was born 22 July 1741; he died 19-12-1753 in Bad Urach.

**Friedrich Carl von Georgii, aka Carl Friedrich von Georgii**, son of Johann Martin.

Württemberg Governor.

Born 23 August 1704 in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg.; died 28 August 1749 in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. He married Rosins Elisabetha Unfried, aka Unfrid or Nufried, on 23 April 1729 in Markgröningen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in that town on 10 August 1709. She was the daughter of Johan Jacob Unfried and Maria Auguste Kerner, who were married in Bietigheim, Baden-Württemberg on 22 June 1706. Friedrich Carl and Rosina Elisabetha Georgii had six children, born in Bad Wildbad and Sindelfingen, Baden-Württemberg.

(1) Maria Friederika Georgii was born on 15 November 1731 in Bad Wildbad.

(2) Johann Friedrich Georgii was born on 24 December 1732 in Bad Wildbad. He died after four months on 18 April 1733.

(3) Eberhard Friedrich Georgii was born on 1` May 1738 in Bad Wildbad; he died 23 October 1808 in Bad Urach, Baden-Württemberg. He married Anna Maria Rau on 22 November 1763 in Bad Urach, where she was baptized 9 September 1744. Her parents, Stephan Rau and Anna Maria Haberlin, were married in Bad Urach on 9 June 1700. They had one child. Johann Carl August was born on 28 February 1773 in Bad Urach. Anna Maria died a year later on 20 May 1774.

(4) Johann Christoph Georgii was baptized on 12 October 1739 in Sindelfingen, Baden-Württemberg.

(5) Friedrich Carl Georgii was born on 21 October 1741 in Sindelfingen; he died in Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg on 17 February 1810. He was married twice; each wife was named Johanna Catharina. He married Johanna Catharina Ritter on 1 February 1773 in Stuttgart. She was born there on 17 December 1753. She was the daughter of Johann Friedrich Ritter and Juliana Catharina Spelter, who were married in Stuttgart on 17 May 1746. Friedrich Carl and Johanna Catharina Ritter had one child. Their daughter Johanna Friederika Georgii was born in the Stammheim district of Ludwigsburg on 15 January 1774. She lived about seven months and

died on 4 August 1774. Unfortunately, Johanna Catharina Ritter, the mother, had already died on 3 May 1774.

The second wife was Johanna Catharina Pregizer. Johanna Catharina Pregizer was a widow. She and Friedrich Carl were married on 22 September 1774 in Stammheim. She was born in Mössingen, Baden-Württemberg, on 28 July 1739. Her parents were Christian Ulrich Pregizer and Maria Veronika Urisberger. Johanna Catharina Pregizer first married Christian Wilhelm Frommann on 22 November 1763 in Bondorf, Baden-Württemberg. **Christian Heinrich von Georgii, son of Friedrich Heinrich.**

Born 10 May 1722 in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg; he died on 20 Mar 1794, Bittenfeld, Baden-Württemberg. On 11 August 1750, he married Maria Frederika Keppler in Bittenfeld. She was baptized in Murrhardt, Baden-Württemberg, on 23-October 1724, the daughter of Tobias Friedrich Keppler and Maria Regina Kraft. They had been married on 31 October 1719 in the Weilimdorf district of Stuttgart. She died in Murrhardt on 27 November 1802. Christian Heimrich and Maria Friederika Georgii had eight children. She married David Friedrich Hermann on 15 August 1775 in Aldingen, Baden-Württemberg. He was born there on 7 June 1742, the son of Christoph Friedrich and Magdelina Sibylla Hermann. David Friedrich Hermann was buried on 3 May 1778 in Ludwigsburg. David Friedrich and Eberhardina Friederika Hermann had two children. **(1)** Friederika Sophia Christiana Hermann was born on 21 August 1776 in Nagold; she died on 12 December 1844 in Stammheim, Baden-Württemberg. She married Carl August Gauss on 15 January 1804 in Murr, Baden-Württemberg. He was born on 28 October 1771 in Sindelfingen, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Johann Andreas Gauss and Christiana Margaretha Gruneisens. They were married in Sindelfingen on 16 November 1769. Carl August died on 11 October 1842 in Stammheim. **(2)** Charlotta Louisa Dorothea Hermann was born on 30 January 1778 in Nagold; she died on 9 July 1859 in Ludwigsburg. She married Friedrich Ludwig Wibbelink, aka Friedrich Ludwig Wibbekink, on 10 June 1798 in Degerloch, Baden-Württemberg. He was born on 7 January 1767, the son of Friedrich Wilhelm Wibbelink and Maria Rosina Ditting. Friedrich Ludwig Wibbelink died on 28 December 1819 in Ellwangen, Baden-Württemberg.

(2) **Friedrich Heinrich August Georgii** was born on 10 September 1752; he died on 20 February 1834 in Degerloch, Baden-Württemberg. He was married twice. On 31 October 1782, he married Elisabetha Johanna Fischer in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Degerloch on 31 August 1761, the daughter Elias Gottfried Fischer and Johanna Elisabeth Hosch. Friedrich Heinrich August and Elisabetha Johanna Georgii had 11 children before she died in Degerloch on 30 September 1808. He then married the widow Wilhelmina Sophia Banger (born Wilhelmina Sophia Seeger) on 11 February 1812 in Grossbottwar, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Hopfigheim on 22 April 1757. Friedrich Heinrich August and Wilhelmina Georgii had no children (**see below**).

(3) Johann Christoph Wilhelm Georgii was born on 9 March; he died On 11 July 1822 in Bad Boll, Baden-Württemberg. On 5 October 1784 he married Christiana Catharina Binder (location unknown). She was born in Pfaffenhofen, Heilbronn, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, the daughter of Christoph Friederich Binder and Elisabetha Barbara Zaissler, aka, Elisabetha Barbara Jaissle. Johann Christoph Wilhelm and Christiana Catharina Georgii had three children that we are aware of, all born in in Schützingen, Illingen, Enzkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. **(1)** Friederika Wilhemmina was born on 27 January 1786. On 6 January 1806, she married Maxilian Ludwig Gottlieb Wöflin in Murr, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurtemberg. This was his second marriage. On 16 October 1800, he had married Rosina Friederika Plebst. Rosina died 29 June 1804 in Asperg, Ludwigsburg after giving birth to a daughter Henrietta Louisa Friederika Charlotta (31 August 1802, Asperg). Maxililian Ludwig Gottlieb and Friederika Wilhelmina Wöflin had two children born in Asperg: Charlotta Mathilda (7 May 1813) and Maxamilian Wilhelm Ludwig (15 February 1815). Maximilian Ludwig Gottlieb died seven months before his last child was born: 9 July 1814. Friederika Wilhelmina died in 1833 in Asperg. **(2)** Sophia Christiana Elisabetha, aka Christiana Elisabetha, was born on 28 January 1788. She married Johann Jacob Maier on 23 April 1822 in Schnaitheim, Heidenheim, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurtemberg. He was born on 3 April 1786. We have no further information. **(3)** Christiana Wilhelmina, aka Wilhelmina Christiana, was born on 11 November 1793. She married Christian Ferdinand Ludwig Dorn on 24 October 1819 in Unterensingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He was born in Nabern, Kirchheim unter Teck, Esslingen, Baden-Württemberg on 8 June 1786, the son of Carl Friederich Dorn and Jacobine Magdelina Eccard. Christiana Wilhelmina died on 22 April 1854 in Nürtingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Carl Ferdinand Ludwig died three years later, 21 April 1857, in the same town.

(4) Clara Regina Magdelina Georgii was born on 2 August 1755; she died a year later, on 26 July 1756.

(5) Jacob Friederich Christian Georgii was born on 19 March 1757; he died on 11 July 1812 in Bad Urach, Reutlingen, Baden-Württemberg. We have no further information.

(6) Regina Magdelina Georgii was born on 4 November 1758. We have no further information.

(7) Christiana Regina Georgii was born on 2 August 1760. We have no further information.



(8) Catharina Friederika Charlotta Georgii was born on 18 October 1763 in Bittenfeld, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; she died on 6 October 1849 in Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She married Benjamin Eberhard Finck (or Finckh or Finkh) on 6 September 1785 in Stuttgart. He was born in Stuttgart, the son of Benjamin Finck and Agnes Felicitas Catharina Dobles (or Doblin). Benjamin and Agnes were married on 11 May 1745 in Untertürkheim, Stuttgart. Benjamin Eberhard Finck died on 19 September 1817 in Heutensbach, Allmersbach im Tal, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Colonel in Dragoons of Degenfeld; Duchy of Württemberg, General; city commander of Stuttgart. Born 18 November 1724 in Stuttgart; died 15 October 1796 in Stuttgart. Baden-Württemberg. He married Heinrica Dorothea Mauchart, or Mauchard, on 2 May 1752 in Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Stuttgart about 22 January 1726, the daughter of Burckard David Mauchart and Anna Maria Zeller. Burkhard and Anna Maria were married on 5 October 1723 in Tübingen. Christian Eberhard and Heinrica Dorothea Georgii had four children. All, but one, were born in Stuttgart. Note that the name Mauchart will appear again. Burkard David and Anna Maria Mauchart have a son named **David Mauchart**. David and his wife Hedwig Dorothea Hoffmann will have a son named **Immanuel David Mauchart**. David will marry two daughters of **Heinrich August von Georgii (see below)**.

(1) Wilhelmina Eberhardina Maria Georgii was born 3 December 1754 in Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

(2) **Eberhard Friedrich von Georgii** was born on 18 January 1757 in Stuttgart. He died on 13 April 1830 in Stuttgart. On 29 August 1782, he married Louisa Frederika Mörikes in Korwestheim, Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg (**see below**).

(3) Eberhard David von Georgii was born on 28 July 1764 in Balingen, Zollernalbkreis, , Baden-Württemberg. We have no more information.

(4) Eberhardina Dorothea Georgii was born on 13 February 1766 in Stuttgart. She married Gottlieb Heinrich Rieger, or Ringer, on 15 February 1790 in Stuttgart. He was born on 6 October 1755 in Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Carl Heinrich Rieger and Maria [Dorothea or Sophia] Beata Bischoff.

**Heinrich August von Georgii**, son of Erhard August.

Württemberg Special Superintendent.

Born 22 Jul 1732, in Ravensburg, Ravensburg, Baden-Württemberg; died 31 July 1797 in Backnang, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg. He married Maria Friederike Rohers on 17 August 1762 in Köngen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Marie Friederike was the daughter of Johann Reinhard Rohers and Eberhardina Louisa von Keller. Johann Reinhard and Eberhardina Louisa were married on 27- November 1731 in Weil der Stadt, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Johann Reinhard was born on 18 February 1704 in Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; he died on 12

October 1774 in Köngen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Eberhardina Louisa was baptized on 29 April 1705 in Köngen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Heinrich August and Maria Friederike von Georgii had seven children, all born in Bad Urach, Reutlingen, Baden-Württemberg.

(1) Johann Philipp August von Georgii was born on 6-July 1763 in Bad Urach. On 6 July 1809, he married Maria Cleophe Christine Gottliebin Schmidt in Stuttgart, Stadtkreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 20 October 1781 in Kaiserslautern, Urban district, Rhineland-Palatinate, the daughter of Ludwig Benjamin Martin Schmidt and Charlotte Juliana Luise Engelbach. Ludwig Benjamin and Charlotte Juliana were married on 15 February 1776 in Homburg, Saarpfalz, Saarland, Germany.

(2) Eberhardina Friederike Georgii was born on 19 August 1764 in Bad Urach. We have no more information.

(3) **Eberhard Heinrich von Georgii** was born on 2 September 1765 in Bad Urach. He died in Stuttgart on 26 May 1841. He married Heinricha Dorothea von Wider on 12 July 1787 in Ludwigsburg, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg (**see below**).

(4) Ludwig Friederich von Georgii was born on 30 October 1769 in Bad Urach. He was buried there on 22 June 1777.

(5) Charlotte Friederike Heinricha von Georgii, born 20 November 1772 in Bad Urach; died 21 July 1799 in Nürtingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She married **Immanuel David Mauchart** on 30 May 1793 in Backnang, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg. Immanuel David was born on 20 December 1734 in Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. He is the son of David Mauchart and Hedwig Dorothea Hoffmann, who were married 5 October 1762 in Tübingen. David Mauchart is the son of Burckard David Mauchart, who had a daughter named Heinricha Dorothea. As noted above, married **Christian Eberhard von Georgii**. Immanuel David Mauchart remarried after his wife, Charlotte Friederike died in 1799 at the age of 26. He married her sister, named Johanna Christina von Georgii, on 6 May 1800 in Backnang (see below). Immanuel David and Charlotte Friederike had three children, one of whom survived childhood. All were born in Nürtingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. **(1)** Friederika Dorothea Charlotte Mauchart was born on 7 April 1794; she died on 23-8-1823 in Nürtingen. She married Samuel Benjamin Härlin on 1 May 1815 in Neuffen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Samuel Benjamin was born on 18 January 1786 in Weilheim unter Teck, Esslingen, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Georg Friedrich Härlin and Magdalena Sibylla Burk. Samuel David died on 10 May 1865 in the city of Stuttgart. **(2)** Karl David August Mauchart was born on 18 October 1795. He died at the age of 2 on 29 March 17908. **(3)** Gottlob Friedrich Ludwig Mauchart was born on 3 February 1798. He also died at the age of 2 on 12 April 1800 in Nürtingen.

(6) Johanna Christina von Georgii was born on 30 December 1774 in Bad Urach; she died 17 May 1828 in Nürtingen. On 16 May 1800, she married Immanuel David Mauchart, the widower of her older sister, Charlotte Friederike (see above). Immanuel David died in Nürtingen on 6

February 1826. Johanna Christina bore five children to Immanuel David. Only one child survived childhood. **(1)** Hermann David Heinrich Mauchart was born on 15 June 1801 in Nürtingen. He died a few months later, on 30 November 1801. **(2)** An anonymous child was born on 20 November 1802 in Nürtingen. **Eberhard Heinrich Gottlob Georgii**, son of Johann Heinrich, Baptised 12 November 1733 in Ludwigsburg, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; died 13-7-1817 in Wasungen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thuringia, Germany. He married Elisabetha Sophia Ernaestina Heusinger. We have no marriage information. She was born on 24 October 1754 in Meiningen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thuringia, the daughter of Christian Wilhelm Heusinger and Elisabetha Christiana Luisa Meder. Eberhard Heinrich Gottlob and Elisabetha Sophia Ernestina Georgii had one child. **(1) Philipp Jacob Georgii** was born on 12 October 1780 in Meiningen. He married Agnes Hagar Natmessing. We have no marriage information (**see below**).

**Friedrich Heinrich August von Georgii**, son of Christian Heinrich. Born 10 Sep 1752 in Kusterdingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg; died 20 Feb 1834, Degerloch, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. On 31 October 1783, he married Elisabetha Johanna Fischer in Degerloch. She was born in Degerloch on 31 August 1761, the daughter of Elias Gottfried Fischer and Johanna Elisabetha Hosch, who were married on 18 August 1755 in Tübingen. Elias Gottfried was born 11 January 1725 in Tübingen. Johanna Elisabetha was born 31 August 1731 in Bad Urach, Reutlingen, Baden-Württemberg. Elisabeth Johanna died on 30 September 1808 in Degerloch. Friedrich Heinrich August then married Wilhelmina Sophia Seeger. They were married on 11 February 1812 in Grossbottwar, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurtemberg. She had previously been married to two men: Gottlieb Friedrich Bangers (13 June 1783 in Beilstein, Heilbronn, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg) and Wilhelm Gottfried Esenwein (17 April 1785 in Stuttgart). She was born 22 April 1757 in Höpfigheim, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, the daughter of Johann Jacob Seeger and Anna Sophia Essich. (1) Elisabetha Friederika Augusta Georgii was born 16 August 1784 in Haubersbronn; she died 30 August 1849 in Hagelloch, Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. On 16 August 1806, she married Karl David Pfister in Stuttgart. Karl David was born on 15 March 1779 in Tübingen.

His parents, Franz Karl Pfister and Maria Magdalena Dubois were married on 8 June 1779, after the birth of Karl David.

(2) Christian Gottfried August von Georgii was born on 10 December 1785 in Haubersbronn. He died in Degerloch on 13 February 1813. We have no further information.

(3) **Carl August von Georgii** was born on 22 June 1787 in Haubersbronn. He died in Esslingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 28 February 1826. He married Karolina Friederika Sick on 10 September 1821 in Esslingen (**see below**).

(4) Wilhelm August von Georgii, born 15 July 1789 in Haubersbronn. He Died in Tübingen on 15 November 1819. He married Wilhelmina Carolina Rosina Hölder on 14 January 1817 in Degerloch, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Wilhelmina was born on 14 January 1793 in Ruit, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, the daughter of Christoph Benedict Hölder and Christiana Magdalena Rumpel. Christoph Benedict and Christiana Magdalena were married on 6 October 1772 in Höfingen, Boblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Christoph Benedict had been married for about two years to Veronica Friederika Vogels. That marriage occurred in Plüderhausen, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 5 August 1770. Wilhelm August and Wilhelmina Carolina Rosina had three children. All were born in Tübingen. **(1)** Wilhelm Adolph Georgii was born on 11 October 1817, along with his twin **(2)** Carl Ottmar Georgii. Carl Ottmar died about five months later, on 26 March 1718. We have no further information about Wilhelm Adolph. **(3)** Wilhelm August Georgii was born 14 July 1818. He died 2 1/2 years later, on 13 January 1821.

(5) **Ferdinand Christian August von Georgii** was born 24 January 1791 in Haubersbronn. He died in Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. He married Christiana Augusta Dreiss in Degerloch on 16 October 1820. She was born in Calw on 28 March 1790 and died there on 5 January 1864. Christiana Augusta was the daughter of Christian Carl Dreiss and Maria Barbara Reisig, who were married in Calw on 13 May 1783. Ferdinand Christian August and Christiana Augusta had five children, all born in Calw (**see below**).

(6) Christina Augusta Georgii was born on 25 March 1792 in Haubersbronn; she died on 27 April 1861 in Stuttgart. On 10 September 1811, she married Friedrich Christoph Benedict Hölder in Stuttgart. He was born on 19 May 1781 in Gültlingen, Wildberg, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Christoph Benedict Hölder and Christiana Magdalena Rumpel. He died on 17 April 1854 in Stuttgart. Christoph Benedict and Christiana Magdalena Hölder were married on 6 October 1772 in Höfingen, Boblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Friedrich Christoph Benedict and Christiana Hölder had at least five children. **(1)** Emilie Hölder was born on 19 June 1812 in Warkworth, Northumberland, North East, England, but baptized on 9 July 1812 in Stuttgart. We have no further information. **(2)** Emil August Hölder was born on 4 July 1813 in Stuttgart. He died at the age of 14, in Stuttgart, on 29 August 1827. **(3)** Franziska Hölder was born in January 1815 in Nürtingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He died three months later, on 6 April 1815. **(4)** Hermann Friedrich Hölder was born on 17 October 1819 in

Stuttgart. He married Eugenia Luisa Sophis von Schultheiss on 12 August 1847 in Stuttgart, She was born on 9 July 1823 in Ulm, Stadtkreis, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. Her parents were Carl Friedrich von Schultheiss and Henrietta Regina Magdalena Wachsler. We have no further information. **(5)** Wilhelm Carl Christian Hölder was born on 25 August 1821. He died less than a year later, on 17 June 1822.

(7) Charlotta Sophia Augusta Georgii was born on 28 January 1794 in Haubersbronn. She died about three months later, on 26 April 1794.

(8) **Heinrich August von Georgii** was born on 31-3-1795 in Haubersbronn; he died on 27 June 1855 in Esslingen. On 12 February 1821, he married Julia Gerber in Stuttgart. They had ten children (**see below**).

(9) Gottlob August Georgii was born on 29 January 1797 in Haubersbronn. He died three days later, on 1 February 1797.

(10) Ludwig Friedrich August Georgii was born on 20 April 1798 in Degerloch, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; He died in Stuttgart some time on 22 October 1857. He married Henrietta Hartmann on 11 July 1826 in Degerloch. Henrietta was born in Stuttgart on 5 April 1807, the daughter of Christian Heinrich Hartmann and Catherina Magdalena Rosina Koch. She died on 29 April 1892 in Stuttgart. Her parents were married in Stuttgart on 2 February 1802. Ludwig Friedrich August and Henrietta Eva Georgii had 3 children. **(1)** Eugenia Georgii was born on 13 February 1829 in Botnang, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; she died in Stuttgart on 17 October 1912. She married Friedrich Ludwig Emil Andler on 15 May 1855 in Gaisburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He was born in Calw, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg on 17 March 1822, the son of Rudolph Friedrich Wilhelm Andler and Charlotta Elisabetha Gmel. He died on 5 February 1862 in Crailsheim, Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Rudolph Friedrich Wilhelm Charlotta Elisabetha were married on 19 April 1814 in Eningen, Reutlingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. **(2)** Maria Georgii was born on 19 March 1831 in Botnang; she died 17 November 1907 in Stuttgart. She married Julius von Hölder, about 1850, in Stuttgart. Julius was born on 24 March 1819 in Stuttgart; he died there on 30 August 1887. He is the son of Eberhard Ludwig von Hölder and Henrietta Eva Hartmann. Eberhard Ludwig is first cousin to Wilhelmina Carolina Rosina Hölder. Wilhelmina married an uncle of Maria: Wilhelm August Georgii (see above). **(3)** Paul Georgii was born on 18 April 1838 in Gaisburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; he died on 18 August 1885 in Winnenden, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. On 22 August 1867,, he married Henrietta D'Ambly (or Ambly or Dambly). She was born on 2 March 1849 in Berg, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was the daughter of Carl D'Ambly and Anna Görtz, who were married in Winterbach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

(11) Wilhelmina Augusta Georgii was born on 6 November 1799 in Degerloch. She died at the age of 1, on 3 September 1800.



**Eberhard Friedrich von Georgii**, son of Christian Eberhard.

Lawyer and professor; Royal Württemberg Upper Tribunal President; Württemberg ambassador to Radstadt Peace Conference, Radstadt, Salzburg, Austria.

Born 18 Jan 1757, Stuttgart; died 13 Apr 1830, Stuttgart. He married Luisa Friederika Mörike on 29 August 1782 in Kornwestheim, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born in Ludwigsburg on 24 February 1762, the daughter of Johann Gottlieb Mörike and Friederika Charlotta Brener. Eberhard Friedrich and Luisa Friederika Georgii had three children, all born in Stuttgart. **(1)** Eberhard Friedrich Georgii was born on 23 January 1789 and died on 11 May 1790. **(2)** Eberhardina Luisa Georgii was born on 12 March 1791 and died on 1 December 1792. **(3)** An unnamed child was born and died on 26 March 1796. We do not know when Luisa Friederika died, but Eberhard Friedrich Georgii remarried. On 7 April 1812, he married Charlotta Luisa Friederika Able, the daughter of Ludwig Heinrich Able and Johanna Amilie Möricke. She was born on 22 June 1784 in Unterschwandorf, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. She died on 28 September 1871 in Stuttgart. We have no record of any children. Johanna Amalie Mörike is the sister Luisa Friederika Mörike, the first wife. There is no record of any children.

**Eberhard Heinrich von Georgii**, son of Heinrich August.

Auditor General Royal Wurttemberg Army; Upper Tribunal Director, Württemberg.

Born 2 Sep 1765, Bad Urach, Reutlingen, Baden-Württemberg; died 26 May 1841, Stuttgart. He married Heinricha Dorothea von Wider on 12 July 1787 in Ludwigsburg, Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 16 February 1769, the daughter of Jacob Heinrich Wider and Elisabetha Zain. Jacob Heinrich and Elisabetha Wider were married on 15 May 1764 in Ludwigsburg. Eberhard Heinrich and Heinricha Dorothea had three children, all born in Ludwigsburg.

**(1) Eberhard Heinrich Georgii** was born on 9 May 1788 in Ludwigsburg; he died on 4 November 1852 in Stuttgart. He married Johanna Wilhelmina Dörtenbach on 10 October 1811 in Calw. They had eight children. One was a son, Otto Alphons, that emigrated to the United States (**see below**).

**(2) Henrietta Carolina Georgii** was born on 25 February 1791 in Ludwigsburg; she died on 26 January 1849 in Tübingen. Henrietta Carolina married Carl August David Stölin 28 January 1823 in Neuenbürg, Enzkreis, Enzkreis, Baden-Württemberg. Carl August was the son of August Friedrich Jonathan Stölin and Catherina Barbara Braun. He was born in Knittlingen, Enzkreis, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg on 20 September 1783. His parents were married there on 22 June 1761. Carl August David Stölin died in Laubach, Geißen, Geißen, Hess, Germany on 5 April 1836. Carl August David and Henrietta Carolina Stölin had four children. **(1)** Carl Eberhard Friedrich Georgii was born 26 November 1824 in Neuenbürg. He married Christiana Carolina Mathilda Mehl on 22 April 1856 in Kirchentellinsfurt, a section of the city of Tübingen. She was born in Tübingen on 23 February 1833, the daughter of Immanuel Gottlieb Mehl and Wilhelmina Friederika Lussier. **(2)** An unnamed baby was born and died on 27 December 1825 in Neuenbürg. **(3)** Emil Stölin was born on 22 November 1827 in Bad Teinach-Zavelstein, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. He died in Tübingen on 24 February 1849 at the age of 21. **(4)**

Henrietta Christiana Wilhelmina Stölin was born on 9 May 1830 in Schweindorf, Neresheim, Ostalbkreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. She married Rudolph Heinrich Laupp on 7 May 1850 in Tübingen. He was born in that city on 24 August 1818, the son of Jacob Heinrich and Luisa Friederika Laupp.

(3) Amalia Luisa Georgii was born on 19 August 1795, but died shortly after, on 12 October 1795.

### **August Eberhard von Georgii**

Austrian Brigade General in Mantua, Lombardy, Italy; Fortress Commandant of Gaeta, Lazio, Italy. Born 27 July 1768, Montbéliard, France (part of Württemberg, at the time); died in Mantua and buried there 9 Mar 1826.

### **Carl Gottlob von Georgii**

Captain in Koseritz Regiment.

Born 1771, from Saxon line; captured by Russians 1812, died of effects of hunger and cold.

### **Philipp Jacob Georgii, son of Eberhard Heinrich Gottlob**

Born 12 October 1780 in Meiningen, Schmalkalden-Meiningen, Thuringia, Germany; died 1 December 1855 in Schalkau, Sonneberg, Sachsen-Meiningen, Thuringia. He married Agnes Hagar Natmessnig, possibly in Schalkau or Meiningen. She was born on 26 December 1789, possibly in Schalkau; she died in Schalkau on 19 January 1867 in Schalkau. Philipp Jacob and Agnes Hagar Georgii had one child.

(1) **Theodore Constantin Julius Georgii** was born on 9 March 1827 in Schalkau; he died on 3 December 1899 in Reutlingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg. On 11 July 1850, he married Anna Julia Georgii, a distant cousin (**see below**).

### **Carl August von Georgii, son of Friedrich August von Georgii.**

District Judge, Esslingen.

Born 27 Jun 1787 in Haubersbronn, Schorndorf, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurtemberg; died 28 February 1826 in Esslingen, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Wurtemberg. He married Carolina Friederika Sick on 10 September 1821 in Esslingen. Carolina Friederika was born on 4 January 1793 in Stuttgart, the daughter of Johann Friedrich Sick and Johanna Wilhelmina Dobel. She died in Esslingen on 15 March 1824, two days after the birth of her second child. Carl August died two years after his wife. Carl August and Carolina Friederika Georgii had two children, both born in Esslingen.

(1) **Julius Friederich August Georgii** was born on 28 July 1822 in Esslingen; he died on 29 July 1884 in Washington DC, USA. He married Anna Maria Friederika Herwegh on 30 October 1853 in Ramsey, Anoka, Minnisota, USA (**see below**).

(2) Wilhelmina Luisa Friederika Ida Georgii was born on 26 February 1824 in Esslingen; she died on 16 August 1880 in Metterzimmern, Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg. She married Carl Gottlob Weinschenk on 24 April 1849 in Stuttgart. He was born on 5 December 1817 in Bietigheim, Ludwigsburg, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Johann Michael Weinschenk and Rebecca Christiana Raiherr. We have no record of children.

**Eberhard Heinrich von Georgii**, son of Eberhard Heinrich.

Estate owner and head of the "Calwer Haus in Stuttgart".

Born 9 May 1788 in Ludwigsburg, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; died 4 Nov 1852 in Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. He married Johanna Wilhelmina Dörtenbach on 10 October 1811 in Calw, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. She was born on 2 December 1793 in Calw, the daughter of Georg Christoph Mose Dörtenbach and Eva Maria Vischer. Johanna Wilhelmina Died on 28 April 1875 in Stuttgart. Eberhard Heinrich and Johanna Wilhelmina von Georgii had eight children, all born in Calw.

(1) Paul Georg Eberhard Georgii was born on 15 August 1812 in Calw; he died on 22 November 1889 in Stuttgart. He married Anna Francisca Lipp on 18 September 1855 in Calw. She was born in Horb am Neckar, Freudenstadt, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg on 27 July 1836, the daughter of Franz Josef Lipp and Eleonore Erath. Anna Francisca died on 16 February 1889 in Stuttgart. We have no record of any children.

(2) Maria Henrietta Georgii was born on 6 September 1816 in Calw. She died there about a year and a half later, on 24 June 1818.

(3) Eduard Wilhelm Eberhard Georgii was born on 15 January 1818. He died there about two weeks later, on 30 January 1818.

(4) **Emil Wilhem von Georgii-Georgenau** was born on 1 December 1820 in Calw; he died in Stuttgart on 23 December 1894. On 3 May 1847, he married Emilie Sophia von Gärtner in Stuttgart (**see below**).

(5) Maria Wilhelmina Mathilda Georgii was born on 25 September 1822 in Calw; she died on 2 March 1891 in Stuttgart. On 15 April 1858, she married Carl Freiherr von König in Cannstatt, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Carl was 53 years old at the time, having married Elisabetha Friederika Bühler on 20 June 1826 in Stuttgart. Elisabetha Friederika died on 19 July 1845 in Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. Carl Freiherr was born on 20 July 1804 in Westheim, Weissenburg-Gunzenhausen, Bavaria, Germany. He was the son of Ludwig Reinhard von König and Maria Dorothea Scheiden, who were married in Bernbach, Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. Maria Wilhelmina and Carl Freiherr had one child. **(1)** Wilhelmina Charlotta Maria Paulina von König was born on 29 January 1859 in Bad Cannstatt, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.; she died 19 August 1918 in Stuttgart. Wilhelmina Charlotta Paulina married Adolf Graf von Normann-Ehrenfels on 22 May 1877 in Stuttgart. He was born in Ellwangen, Ostalbkreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 8 May 1842; he died on 18 July 1911 in Stuttgart. He is the son of Friedrich Ferdinand Graf von Normann-Ehrenfels and Friederika Mathilda Paulina Amelia von Schütz-Pflummern, who were married in Hohenstein, Rheingau-Taunus-Kreis, Darmstadt, Hesse, Germany.

(6) Wilhelm Hermann Georgii was born on 28 April 1824 in Calw. He married Carolina Ottilia Kuhn on 29 September 1855 in Stuttgart. She was born on 2 May 1833 in Stuttgart, the daughter of August Friedrich Kuhn and Emilia Christiana Müller.

(7) Alphons Georgii was born on 1 March 1828 in Calw; he died on 2 January 1888 in Stuttgart. We have no more information.

(8) **Otto Alphons Georgii**, born 11 March 1828 in Calw. Appears to be the twin of Alphons, but born nine days later. Sometimes believe to be the Otto Georgii that moved to the United States, married Friederika Jäger, and settled in Ohio and Wisconsin. However, we believe that the Otto Georgii that did this was the son of Ferdinand Christian August (**see below**).

**Ferdinand Christian August von Georgii**, son of Friedrich Heinrich August.

Born 24 January 1791 in Haubersbronn. He died in Calw, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. He married Christiana Augusta Dreiss in Degerloch on 16 October 1820. She was born in Calw on 28 March 1790 and died there on 5 January 1864. Christiana Augusta was the daughter of Christian Carl Dreiss and Maria Barbara Reisig, who were married in Calw on 13 May 1783. Ferdinand Christian August and Christiana Augusta had five children, all born in Calw.

(1) Ferdinand August Georgii was born on 29 July 1821 in Calw. On 4 May 1847, he married Christiana Schnauffer in Calw. She was born in Calw on 22 March 1828, The daughter of Johann Christian Schnauffer and Johanna Friederika Dreiss. Johanna Friederika Dreiss is a daughter of Christian Carl Dreiss and Maria Barbara Reisig. Ferdinand Christian Georgii therefore married a niece of his mother. Ferdinand August and Christiana Georgii had two children, both born in Stuttgart. **(1)** Emma Georgii was born on 24 November 1849. She married Johann Friedrich Kalmbach (or Calmbach) 11 June 1872 in Grömbach, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg. **(2)** Julie Mercedes Georgii was born on 6 February 1849.

(2) Emma Georgii was born on 24 June 1826 in Calw. According to many family trees, she died on 19 March 1863 in Saginaw, Saginaw, Michigan, USA. We have not seen a record of that death. Emma married Eduard Maximilian Zeller on 28 April 1851 in Brooklyn, New York City, USA. He was born on 28 March 1822 in Stuttgart. He returned to Germany and died in Stuttgart on 7 September 1903. They had two children, both born in Brooklyn. **(1)** Emma Zeller was born on 3 May 1853 in Brooklyn. She returned to Germany, where she married Ludwig Wilhelm Mertz on 29 May 1877 in Stuttgart. She died in Mannheim, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg on 4 May 1943. Ludwig Wilhelm was born in Aalen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 1 March 1849, the son of Anton Mertz and Sibylla Elisabetha Arnold. Anton and Sibylla Elisabetha Merz were married in Aalen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg. **(2)** Max Eduard Zeller was born in May 1855 in Brooklyn; he died on 10 January 1922 in Nieder-Ingelheim, Rhineland-Palatinate, Germany. He married Elise Stumpp on 24 May 1888 in New Brighton, Staten Island, New York City, New York. She was born in Germany in 1861. Elise died in the year 1943 in Wiesbaden, Darmstadt, Hesse, Germany. Max and Elise Zeller had 2 children, born in Brooklyn. Max worked there as a wholesale drug merchant. Margarite Zeller was born February 1889. Walter Edward Max Zeller was born in Brooklyn on 23 November 1890.

(3) Emil Georgii was born on 23 April 1828 in Calw. He died on 15 April 1902 in Calw. Emil married Paulina Friederika Güntter on 16 June 1853 in Stuttgart. She was born there on 3 June

1834, the daughter of Gottlieb Friederich Güntter and Heinrika Luisa Link. Emile and Paulina Friederika had five children, all born in Calw. **(1)** Otto Georgii was born on 16 August 1855; he died on 2 September 1885 in Calw. He married Christiana Catharina Schuster on 29 January 1884 in Calw. She was born on 13 November 1863 in Deufringen, Böblingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; she died on 19 July 1933 in Calw. Christiana Catharina was the daughter of Johann Friedrich Schuster and Heinrika Reichert, who married in Möhringen, Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 13 January 1863. After Emile died, Christiana Catharina married Hermann Friedrich Wagner on 11 July 1889 in Calw. **(2)** Ferdinand Emil Georgii was born on 21 December 1858; he died on 21 September 1922 in Stuttgart. He married Mathilda Julia Margaretha Ostermayer on 1 August 1893 in Stuttgart. She was born on 16 June 1863 in Weilheim an der Teck, Esslingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg; she died 14 November 1946 in Stuttgart. Mathilda Julia Margaretha was the daughter of Eduard Leberecht Ostermayer and Maria Luisa Adelina Heldbeck. **(3)** Fanny Georgii was born on 16 February 1862. She died about a year later, on 8 April 1863. **(4)** Paul Georgii was born on 3 July 1865 and died on 28 March 1866. **(5)** Julius Georgii was born on 13 June 1871 and died on 11 November 1871.

**(4) Otto Georgii**, a twin to Emil, was born on 24 April 1828 in Calw. Moved to the United States and married Friederika Jäger (Yager) 25 April 1850 in Ottawa County, Ohio (**see below**). Sometimes confused with **Otto Alphons Georgii**, born 24 April 1828 in Calw. That Otto was the son of the **Eberhrd Heinrich von Georgii** that was born on 9 May 1788 in Ludwigsburg (**see above**).

**(5) Otillia August Georgii** was born 2 November 1835 in Calw; she died 23 January 1900 in Stuttgart. On 3 June 1856, she married Ludwig Schaller in Calw. Ludwig was born on 15 March 1824 in Grossaspach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Ludwig Friedrich Schuller and Maria Margaretha Schwartz. Ludwig Friedrich and Maria Margaretha were married in that town on 15 August 1822. Ludwig and Ottilia Augusta Schaller had 2 children. **(1)** Maria Adelheid Thusnelda Schaller was born on 3 February 1862 in Stuttgart. She married Otto von Fischer on 24 August 1886 in Stuttgart. Otto was born on 14 May 1858 in Ulm, Stadtkreis, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg, the son of Otto Christian von Fischer and Emma Josephina Antonia Linder. Otto Christian and Emma Josephina Antonia von Fischer were married in Stuttgart on 8 July 1851. Otto and Maria Thusnelda von Fischer had 2 children, both born in Stuttgart: Georg Friedrich Fischer (born 1 June 1887) and Emma Luisa Fischer (born 12 August 1889). **(2) Emil Schaller** was born on 19 April 1857 in Grossaspach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg; he died in Grossaspach, Rems-Murr-Kreis, Baden-Württemberg on 13 June 1921. Emil will marry **Anna Julia Thusnelda Georgii**, daughter of **Theodor Immanuel Heinrich Georgii** and Maria Stockmayer on 5 May 1881 in Esslingen (**see below**). Emil and Anna Julia are second cousins, descended from Friedrich Heinrich August Georgii. Anna Julia Thusnelda was born on 16 August 1858 in Esslingen; she died 10 October 1920 in Weinsberg, Heilbronn, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg.

(6) Clara Agnes Georgii was born on 18 October 1860 in Neuwirthshaus. She died in Mainhardt, Schwäbisch Hall, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg on 28 February 1862 at the age of 1.

(7) Otto Julius Martin Georgii was born on 19 March 1862 in Neuwirthshaus. We have no further information.

(8) Agnes Rosalia Julia Georgii was born on 11-September 1864 in Neuwirthshaus. We have no further information.

(9) Emil Carl Eduard Georgii was born on 6 July 1868 in Neuwirthshaus. He died at the age of 21 in Tübingen, Tübingen, Baden-Württemberg, on 14 January 1890.

**Otto Alphons Georgii**, son of Eberhard Heinrich

Born 11 March 1828 in Calw.

This Otto Georgii is sometimes confused with the **Otto Georgii** that settled in Ohio and Wisconsin (**see below**). The two were born about a month apart in Calw. We have no further information.

**Otto Georgii**, son of Ferdinand Christian August.

Town Treasurer, Postmaster, USA

Born 24 April 1828 in Calw; died 10 December 1888 in Prairie du Chien, Crawford, Wisconsin, USA. He married Paula Friederika "Friederika" Jäger (Americanized to Jaeger or Yager) in Ottawa County, Ohio on 25 April 1850. She was born on 8 April 1834 in Baden-Württemberg, Germany, the daughter of Johann Jacob Friedrich "Frederick" Jäger and Luisa (Louisa) Ungar. She died on 16 December 1867 in Prierie Du Chien.

Frederick and Louisa were married on 19 April 1830 (or 16 May 1830, depending upon which document you believe) in Oberroth, Neu-Ulm, Schwaben, Bavaria, Germany. Frederick was a physician. According to "The Commemorative Biographical Record of the Counties of Sandusky and Ottawa Ohio", 1896, Dr. Frederick immigrated, with his two eldest sons, in 1843. He located in Albany, New York. His wife and the remainder of the family joined him in the next year. In the Fall of 1845, they moved to Woodville, Sandusky, Ohio. In 1866, the family moved the Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin. After about 2 years, the family moved to Elmore, Ottawa, Ohio. Both Frederick and Louisa died there in 1878. He died on 2 September 1878 and he died on 13 December 1878.

We have the following reference to Otto Georgii in Story of the Maumee Valley, Toledo, and the Sandusky Region (see Reference 5). In chapter XCI, "Ottawa County", we have the following description of the settling of Salem Township.

#### SALEM TOWNSHIP

Salem township wherein is located Oak Harbor, was organized in 1839 as a part of Sandusky County, contains 17,721 acres, and is consequently one of Ottawa County's largest townships. While the soil is mostly heavy clay, agriculture in all its branches is successfully carried on.

Outside of Oak Harbor, among the earliest settlers of the township were: David Gordon, farmer, who located in section three in 1831; Charles Wheeler, from Connecticut, section eight in 1837; John Reed, who settled in section three in 1838.

In 1848 Charles Maeulen, Rudolph Georgii, Otto Georgii and Charles Franck, came from Esslingen, Germany, and purchased wood lands in the vicinity of Oak Harbor for five dollars per acre, cleared the timber and established homes. The nearest market was Sandusky City, reached by canoe and the nearest mill was Woodville, twelve miles away.

Otto and Rudolph Georgii are first cousins. Charles Maeulen (Mäulen) and Charles Franck may be related, but we do not know. **Rudolph Heinrich Immanuel Georgii (see below)** is the son of **Heinrich August von Georgii (see above)**. Otto and Rudolph are the grandsons of Freidrich Heinrich August and Elisabetha Johanna Fischer.

Otto and Friederika Georgii had 7 children. All but the first were born in Prairie du Chien.

(1) Emilie Georgii was born on 15 November 1851 in Ohio; she died on 30 April 1905 in Knoxville, Knox County, Tennessee. Emilie was married twice. The first husband was Edmund Remi Bertholet. They were married in Prairie du Chien on 20 October 1868. He was born in August 1846 in Vouziers, Ardennes, Grand Est, France; he died on 27 May 1878 in Faribault, Rice, Minnesota; he was buried in Prairie du Chien. Edmund Remi was the son of Nicholas and Constance Lucille Bertholet (unknown maiden name). Both were born in Paris, France. Both died in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Nicholas died on 26 October 1892; Constance Lucille died on 22 July 1898. Edmund and Emilie Bertholet had two children, both born in Prairie du Chien. **(1)** Gustavus R. Berthelot was born in October 1870 he died in Walla Walla, Walla Walla, Washington on 8 March 1924. He married Myrtle Sutton on 28 August 1895 in St. Paul, Ramsey, Minnesota. Myrtle was born on 30 March 1869 in Albert Lea, Freeborn, Minnesota, the daughter of Steven S. Sutton and Mary L. Bernis. She died in Walla Walla on 13 May 1950. Steven was born in July 1825 in Romulus, Seneca, New York. Mary was born about 1835 in Ohio. We do not know where, or when, they were married. **(2)** Carolyn Constance Bertholet was born on 22 April 1874 in Prairie du Chien; she died on 31 December 1954 in Fostoria, Seneca, Ohio, USA. Carolyn Constance married Fred Mead Hopkins on 25 October 1899 in Crawford County, Wisconsin. Fred was born in Epworth, Dubuque, Iowa on 12 July 1875, the son of Timothy Mead Hopkins and Augusta Amelia Brown. Timothy Mead and Augusta Amelia were both born in Ohio. Timothy was born on 17 December 1835; Augusta Amelia was born on 17 December 1843 in Parkman, Geauga County. They were married on 17 December 1863 in Geauga County, Ohio.

Emilie's second husband was William Carl Zieprecht (or Ziepprecht). They were married on 13 April 1881 in La Crosse, La Crosse, Wisconsin. He was born on 30 September 1827 in Darmstadt, Darmstadt, Hesse, Germany. He died on 8 June 1909 in Dubuque, Iowa. Emilie and William Carl had one child. **(1)** Carl William Zieprecht was born on 15 March 1882 in Prairie du Chien; he died in October 1966 in Dubuque, Iowa. He married Mary Katherine Glab on 25 November 1908 in Chicago, Illinois. She was born in Dubuque on 28 December 1881, the

daughter of Nicholas Glab and Mary Homan. Nicholaus and Mary Glab were married in Dubuque on 4 May 1880. When Mary died on 5 September 1908, Nicholaus married Sarah Elisabeth "Sadie" Deggendorf. They were married in Chicago on 10 February 1908. Nicholaus died on 22 May 1915 in Dubuque. We do not know when Sarah died.

(2) Ottilia Luisa Georgii was born on 14 September 1854 in Prairie du Chien; she died on 10 April 1940 in Hibbing, St. Louis, Minnesota. She was married twice. She married Max Löper (Loeper) in 1872, probably in Prairie du Chien. Max was born about 1842 in Germany; he died 16 August 1876 in Prairie du Chien. Max and Ottilia Luisa had one child. **(1)** Addie Wilhelma Loeper was born on 19 January 1876 in Prairie du Chien; she died on 20 August 1960 in Hibbing. Addie married Joseph Vaclav Beran on 19 June 1918 in Prairie du Chien. Joseph Vaclav was born in Oberlin, Lorain, Ohio on 20 March 1887; he died in Hibbing on 3 February 1955. His parents, Johann (John) Beran and Mary Ann Dremsa were born in "Bohemia", which we would now call the Czech Republic. Both died in Turtle Lake, Barron, Wisconsin. John died on 10 January 1935; Mary Anne died on 27 February 1933. Both Oscar and Caroline Jane were born in New York.

(3) Antoinetta Emma Wilhelmina "Nettie" Georgii was born on 10 May 1856 in Prairie du Chien; she died in the same town on 9 November 1939. She married Charles Oscar Sprague on 25 December 1876 in Crawford County, Wisconsin (probably Prairie du Chien). Charles Oscar was also born in Prairie du Chien, the son of Oscar B. Sprague and Caroline Jane Dennis. He died from an accidental fall on 25 January 1909; he was buried in Prairie du Chien. Oscar and Caroline Jane Sprague were born and married in New York. Both died in Wisconsin, probably Prairie du Chien. Oscar died in 1870, while Caroline Jane died in Prairie du Chien on 23 September 1887. Charles and Nettie Sprague had two children. **(1)** George Holmes Sprague was born in La Crosse County, Wisconsin on 23 May 1885; he died in Illinois in November 1966. He married Catharina Mathilda 'Katherine' Noehring on 17 October 1912 in Chicago, Illinois. Katherine was born in Chicago on 11 January 1886. Her father, John Matthew Henry 'Henry' Noehring (Johann Mathieu Henry Nöhring) was born in Germany. His mother, Louisa Hammer Baker was born in December 1850 in Chillicothe, Ross, Ohio. Her parents were born in Germany. **(2)** Charlotte Ottilie Sprague was born on 28 December 1887 in Wisconsin; she died in Chicago on 8 October 1918. Charlotte married Ralph Norton Conklin on 9 November 1912 in Chicago. He is the son of Charles Philip Conklin and Kate Amanda Shaw, born in Coldwater, Branch, Michigan on 17 June 1879. Ralph died in Coldwater on 15 August 1965, at the age of 86. Charles Philip and Kate Amanda Conklin were married in Coldwater on 9 November 1876. Charles was born in Norwalk, Huron, Ohio and Kate Amanda was born in Fulton County, New York.

(4) Otto Georgii was born in 1858 in Prairie du Chien; he died on 18 May 1933 in Elmore, Ottawa, Ohio. He married Emily H. "Emma" Rice on 16 April 1884 in Ottawa County, Ohio (probably Elmore, Ottawa, Ohio). Emily was born on 26 August 1862 in Elmore; she died 17 September 1953 in Port Clinton, Ottawa, Ohio. Her father was Early Rice, born about 1830 in Ohio. Her mother was Harriet A. Hull, born December 1830, also in Ohio. Harriet's name was



Harriet A. Wight at the time she married Early. She had previously been married to Alvin Wight. She and Alvin were married 9 November 1854 in Ottawa County, Alvin died on 27 March 1857 in Elmore. Harriet married Early Rice on 5 April 1860 in Ottawa County. Otto and Emily Georgii had one child. **(1)** Fredrika Georgii was born in Elmore on 8 May 1885; died 3 November 1952 in Washington, D.C. She married John Edwin Pafenbach on 17 April 1906 in Elmore. John Edwin was also born in Elmore, on 4 March 1880. His father Henry C. Pfaffenbach was born in Germany; the name was Americanized to Pafenbach. John Edwin died in Cleveland, Cuyahoga, Ohio on 23 March 1938. His father was born in Dankerode, Hersfeld-Rotenburg, Kassel, Hesse, Germany in December 1852. His mother was Eva Luella Gasser, born 16 May 1858 in Elmore. She died in Elmore on 26 January 1885. Eva's father, John Gasser, was born in Bern, Switzerland Her mother, Mary L. Shepherd, was born in Leesville, Carroll, Ohio. John and Mary Gasser were married on 2 May 1849 in Gypsum, Portage Township, Ottawa, Ohio.

After Eva Luella Paffenbach died in 1885, Henry married Mary Abigail "Abbie" Reynolds. Abbie was born in Elmore on 21 October 1860; she died in Toledo on 6 June 1931. Abbie's parents, Richard Reynolds and Laura Jane Marion, were both born in Ohio.

John Edwin and Frederika Pafenbach had one child, a daughter named Helen Emily, born 1910 in Harris, Ohio.

(5) Wilhelmina "Minnie" Georgii was born in February 1860 in Prairie du Chien; she died in Toledo, Lucas, Ohio on 18 January 1932. She married Edward Adorno Powers on 2 May 1883 in Ottawa County. Edward was born in Woodville, Sandusky, Ohio on 7 April 1861, the son of Charles H. Powers and Lydia Ann Banks. Charles H. Powers was born on 3 June 1819 in Canaan, Columbia, New York. Lydia Ann Banks was born on 24 August 1829 near Niagara Falls, Ontario, Canada. Her father and mother were born in New York and moved to Ohio after a short stay in Nagara. Edward and Wilhelmina Powers had 4 children. **(1)** Charles Adorno Powers was born on 25 March 1885 in Genoa, Ottawa, Ohio. He was married and divorced twice, dying 9 November 1960 in Venice, Los Angeles, California. Charles Adorno married Nellie C. Myers on 20 December 1906 in Ottawa County, Ohio. She had been born in Ohio on 18 August 1886. Nellie and Charles had no children. They divorced sometime between 1910 and 1920 Nellie did not remarry, dying 9 March 1967 in Toledo, Ohio. She was buried in Genoa, Ottawa, Ohio.

Charles Adorno then married Charlotte May Gerhard, whose maiden name was Charlotte May Chapman. They were married on 3 November 1912 in Los Angeles, California. Charlotte May had previously married Hans Weiskirch Gerhard on 3 November 1912 in Los Angeles. They had several children before being divorced on 4 October 1920 in Oakland County, Michigan. Hans then married a woman by the name of Beatrice. Hans died on 22 June 1950 in Brooklyn, New York. Charlotte May died in Los Angeles on 10 May 1970. **(2)** Helen Gertrude Powers was born on 2 August 1887 in Clay Center, Ottawa, Ohio; she died on 24 January 1982 in Perrysburg, Wood, Ohio. She married Galen Ford Bowman on 1 January 1912 in Ottawa County. Galen Ford was born on 16 November 1886 in Kansas, Senica, Ohio; he died in Toledo, Ohio on 1

September 1959. Galen's father was David Edward Bowman, born 14 March 1857 in Sterretts Gap, Perry, Pennsylvania. His mother was Elva A. Garn, born 29 January 1864 in Gibsonburg, Sandusky, Ohio. Galen and Helen Powers had three children, all born in Toledo: Helen Margaret Bowman (15 December 1912 – 23 June 1935, Toledo), Sarah Jane Bowman (18 February 1916 – 19 August 1991, Pinehurst, Moore, North Carolina), Harriet Ann Bowman (2 July 1919 – 28 June 1977, Toledo). **(3)** Alice Permelia Powers was born on 7 November 1892 in Genoa, Ottawa, Ohio; she died on 13 February 1986 in Denver, Denver, Colorado. She married Charles Tracy LaCost on 15 September 1913 in Genoa. He was born on 23 August 1891 in Bryam Williams, Ohio; he died on 27 May 1979 in Denver. His father was Charles Truman LaCost, born 21 October 1867 in Farmer Township, Defiance, Ohio. His mother was Grace W. Wilcox, who was born in Huron, Erie, Ohio on 1 September 1869. Charles Tracy and Alice Permelia LaCost had three children, all born in Toledo, Ohio: Joanne LaCost (10 June 1914 – 5 July 1990, Colorado), Aileen P. LaCost (26 August 1917 – 15 December 2006, Glen Cove, Nassau, New York), Sylvia Mae LaCost (11 February 1921 – 13 September 1979, Denver, Colorado). **(4)** George Gillard Powers was born on 19 October 1897 in Port Clinton, Ottawa, Ohio; he died in Toledo on 14 November 1971. He married Bessie J. Sampson (or Samson) on 18 March 1922 in Lucas County, Ohio. After Bessie died on 9 October 1934, George married Theresa Ponka Recht. George and Theresa were married on 24 November 1939 in Toledo. Theresa's biological parents are Wilhelm J. "William" Recht and Hedwig A. Rosemond, both of whom were born in Germany. When Hedwig died about 1921, Theresa was adopted by Albert Johann "John" Ponka and his wife Martha Rosemond. We assume that Hedwig and Martha Rosemond were related. George Gillard and Bessie Powers had three children, all born in Toledo: Edward Adorno Powers (23 March 1923 – 6 August 2008, San Antonio, Texas), George Robert "Bob" Powers (15 April 1926 – 27 November 2007, Perrysburg, Wood, Ohio), Nancy Kathryn Powers (29 December 1929 – 26 September 2001, Athens County, Ohio).

**(6)** Julia Elizabeth Georgii was born on 5 December 1862 in Prairie du Chien; she died on 26 October 1935 in Knoxville, Knox, Tennessee. She married Charles Adelbert Nickerson on 29 June 1886 in Prairie du Chien. Charles Adelbert was born on 4 November 1862 in Seneca, Crawford, Wisconsin, the son of Marcus Franklin Nickerson and Margaret Porter. Marcus Franklin was born on 17 January 1838 in Sandgate, Bennington, Vermont; he died on 15 May 1918 in Prairie du Chien. He was the son of William Stoddard Nickerson and Julia Catherine Tainter. William Stoddard was born on 6 May 1806 in Manchester, Bennington, Vermont; he died in Prairie du Chien on 8 February 1868. Julia Catherine was born in Sandgate on 7 August 1914; she died in Seneca on 5 August 1893. William Stoddard and Julia Catherine Nickerson were married on 12 November 1835 in Sandgate.

Marcus Franklin was married twice. The first marriage was to Margaret Porter. They were married on 10 October 1858 in Crawford County, Wisconsin. She was born in McConnelville, Morgan, Ohio, on 26 April 1841. She died on 3 November 1874 in Seneca, Crawford, Wisconsin. He then married Bertha Walker. They were married on 15 July 1877 in Crawford County. Bertha

Elizabeth was born in Pennsylvania in February 1834, the daughter of John and Margaret Walker. She had previously been married to John Peters, who had been born in England about 1831. They had been married in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on 17 April 1854.

Margaret Porter was the daughter of John Porter and Priscilla L. Beal. John was born in County Down, Ireland on 13 January 1813. Priscilla was born in Wellsville, Columbiana, Ohio, on 15 September 1814. They were married in Morgan County, Ohio on 7 April 1836.

Charles Adelbert and Julia Elizabeth Nickerson had 3 children. **(1)** Charles Harvey "Harvey" Nickerson was born on 1 April 1888 in St. Paul, Ramsey, Minnesota; he died on 11 December 1958 in Knoxville, Knox, Tennessee. He married Alberta B. Greenwood around 1911 in Tennessee. She was born in Kentucky on 8 September 1887; she died in Knoxville on 17 July 1986. Her father was Albert Greenwood, who was born in Montreal, Canada on 18 July 1858; he died in Knoxville on 18 September 1945. Her mother was Anna Bissett, who was born 29 September 1863 in Pennsylvania. She died in Knoxville on 17 November 1941. Albert and Anna Greenwood were married in 1886 in Maysville, Mason, Kentucky. We have no record of any children. **(2)** Margaret Emilie Nickerson was born in St. Paul, Minnesota on 2 December 1890; she died in Naples, Collier, Florida on 14 September 1987. She married Richard C. Patterson on 26 January 1914 in Toledo, Ohio. He was born on 12 July 1880 in Indiana. He died in Knox County, Tennessee on 29 August 1976. We have no further information. **(3)** Marcus Franklin Nickerson was born on 23 June 1892 in Knoxville, Tennessee; he died there on 27 June 1967. Marcus Franklin married Anna Elizabeth Mary. She was born in Knoxville, Tennessee on 4 August 1898 and died there on 14 December 1994. They were married about 1921 in Tennessee and had at least 3 children. Anna Elizabeth Mary is the daughter of Joseph Frederick Mary and Mary Corner Dawson, both born in Tennessee.

**(7)** Caroline Gertrude "Carrie" Georgii was born on 9 April 1865 in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin; she died on 15 February 1913 in Toledo, Ohio. She married Homer Alvin Eoff on 30 May 1888 in Ottawa County, Ohio. Homer Alvin was born in Elmore, Ottawa, Ohio on 25 June 1863; he died in Toledo on 6 August 1909. He was the son of Eli Eoff and Mary G. White. Eli Eoff was born on 28 February 1824 in Oneonta, Otsego, New York; he died in Toledo on 7 June 1909. Mary White was born in 1833 in Hamilton, Madison, New York. Eli and Mary Eoff were married in Ottawa County on 14 August 1862. Homer Alvin and Carrie Eoff had one child. The 1900 census shows that their daughter was adopted. More specifically, Nellie is declared to be the adopted daughter of the head of the household (Homer). It appears, that Nellie was the illegitimate daughter of Carrie Georgii and that she was adopted by Homer Eoff after he married Carrie. **(1)** Nellie Georgii Eoff was born on 20 September 1896 in Toledo, Ohio; she died on 6 April 1981 in Iona, Iona, Michigan. Nellie was married four times. She first married William Henry Brown on 19 November 1914 in Oberlin, Lorain, Ohio. At that time, both of her parents had died, and she had recently turned 18. Nellie was the recipient of a large inheritance, about \$250,000. After a divorce around 1920, she married Frank Orin Barden, Jr. She did this on 18 June 1921 in Detroit, Wayne, Michigan. They were divorced on 29 January 1936 in Wayne County, Michigan. She

then married Fredrick E. Nisula on 17 February 1951 in Detroit. She finally married Lawrence N. Pierce in Farmington, Wayne, Michigan on 25 February 1962.

William Henry Brown was born on 10 September 1889 in Meade Center Township, Meade, Kansas. He was the son of Henry Wilts Brown and Lillian Cerethia Blood. Henry Wilts was born on 14 February 1863 in Findlay, Hancock, Ohio. Lillian was born in Iowa on 28 July 1888. They were married on 28 July 1888 in Ohio. William Henry Brown would marry twice after divorcing Nellie Georgii Eoff. He first married Lelah Asire. Lelah had previously been married to Judd D. Asire. Her maiden name was Lelah Sheats. She was born on 24 January 1890 in Hancock County, Ohio, the daughter of Oscar Jaqua Sheats and Abbie Hatfield. They were both born and married in Ohio. Judd and Lelah Sheats were married on 14 June 1911 in Wood County, Ohio. William Henry and Lelah Brown were divorced. He married Evelyn Ann Seay on 19 October 1926. She was born on 10 November 1900 in Amherst County, Virginia. She was the daughter of Robert Lee Seay and Vernie Irwin Coffey, who resided in Buena Vista, Amherst, Virginia at the time of her birth. She died in Buena Vista on 16 August 1966. William Henry died in Buena Vista on 28 August 1957.

Frank Orin Barden, Jr was born on 3 September 1899 in Sturgeon Bay, Bliss, Emmet County, Michigan. He was the son of Frank Orin Barden and Mabel Gertrude Quigley, who were married in 1896 in Nunica, Ottawa, Michigan. After divorcing Nelle Georgii Eoff, he married Gertrude Richardson. They were married on 14 December 1957 in Virginia. Gertrude had been born in Washington, D.C. on 9 April 1907, the daughter of William Augustus Richardson and Sarah Denton Alvis. Gertrude Richardson had previously been married to James Gannon. Gertrude and James had been married on 25 September 1941 in Arlington, Arlington, Virginia. Frank Orin Barden, Jr died on 2 August 1971 in Arlington. Gertrude died in Arlington on 5 January 1995.

Fredrick E. Nisula was born on 29 July 1899 in Calumet, Houghton, Michigan; he died on 15 January 1969 in Baraga, Baraga, Michigan. He was the son of William Nisula and Ida Helberg. Both were born in Finland, but married in Hancock, Houghton, Michigan on 21 January 1893. Before marrying Nellie Eoff on 17 February 1951 in Detroit, he had been married to Saima E. Aalto (or Alto, Aaltonin, or Sayma Aalto). Saima was born in Finland. She immigrated to the Toronto area of Ontario Province, Canada with her family. Her father was Victor Aalto (the Anglicized version of (Victori Abraminoika Aaltonen), born November 1865 in Turku-Pori County, Finland. Her mother was Matilda "Tilda" Wuurinen (or Wourinen or Wuorinen), born 9 October 1876 (or 6 December 1876) in Kulloo, Finland. Victor and Tilda were married in Ulvila, Turku-Pori on 2 September 1896. Victor died on 13 January 1924 in Toronto. Tilda then married Herman Warjula (or Warpula) on 13 November 1924 in Sault Sainte Marie, Chippewa, Michigan. Herman was born in Saarijärvi, Finland. We do not know when he died, but it was after the 1940 census of Drummond, Chiooawa, Michigan. Tilda died on 19 November 1969 in Drummond Island.

Lawrence Nelson Pierce was born on 1 August 1907 in Gettysburg, Darke, Ohio. He died on 31 October 1984 in Big Rapids, Mecosta, Michigan. Lawrence and Nellie Eoff were married on 25 February 1962 in Farmington, Wayne, Michigan. He was the son of William Lonzo Pierce and Eva Elvira Eshelman, both of whom were born in Darke County, Ohio. William Lonzo and Eva Elvira Pierce were married on 23 September 1905 in Pique, Miami, Ohio. Before marrying Nellie, Lawrence Nelson had married Demetries Rose Van Riper. Lawrence and Demetries were married on 12 May 1935 in Lothrop, Shiawassee, Michigan; they were divorced on 15 December 1943 in Wayne County, Michigan. She then married Edgar George Rathbun, on 16 December 1943 in Durand, Shiawassee, Michigan. Demetries Rose Van Riper was the daughter of Frank Van Riper and Temperance R. Van Woert, both of whom were born in Michigan. They had been married on 1 January 1908 in Genesee County, Michigan. Demetries Rose died on 24 February 2005 in Durand, Shiawassee, Michigan.

**Rudolph Heinrich Immanuel Georgii**, son of Heinrich August Georgii

Farmer, Architect

Born 18 May 1830 in Esslingen, Germany; died 9 February 1864 in St. Louis, Missouri, USA. Rudolph arrived in Salem, Ohio with his first cousin Otto in 1848 (**see above**). Rudolph Georgii and Julia Georgii appear in the 1850 census for Salem. He is listed as a farmer. She is born in German and is 22 years old. Also listed is a Ludwig Wolf, age 23. We cannot find either Rudolph or Julia Georgii in any later census. We have assumed that Julia is his wife, but relationships are not noted in the 1850 Census. It is possible that Julia is his sister Julia Luisa Carolina Dorothea Georgii, born 19 Sep 1827 in Esslingen. That Julia married Julius Kohler on 18 April 1852 in Esslingen. It is possible that she visited America and then decided to return to Germany.

Rudolph is listed in a German emigration application index. The application is dated September 1850. The birthplace is listed as Esslingen; the destination is North America. A letter was written on his behalf by an attorney on 15 August 1852 as part of a passport application. The letter states that Rudolph has a certificate of naturalization and that he is planning a trip to Germany for a term of one year. The attorney resides in Ottawa County, Ohio. A passenger manifest dated 28 June 1853 shows Georg and Rudolph Georgii arriving in New York aboard the ship Elise. The Elise departed from Hamburg. Rudolph's occupation is listed as architect; Georg is a clerk. A passenger list dated 18 May 1861 shows Rudolph Georgii, a businessman (kaufmann), departing Hamburg on the ship Borussia. His residence is listed as Ohio, USA. Rudolph Georgii died on 9 February 1861 in Saint Louis, Missouri; he was 33 years old.

**Ernst Alfred "Alfred" Vöttiner**, son of Bertha Julia Georgii and Hermann Friedrich Vöttiner.

Brewer

Born 26 December 1847 in Untertürkheim, Stadtkreis, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. No death information. Probably died in the USA. Used the name Alfred Voettiner. Most of his early information, other than his birth and baptism, comes from ship crew and passenger lists. On 7 July 1866, Alfred is listed among the crew of the German ship Comet, out of Bremen, Germany. His residence is Stuttgart. Similarly, he is listed as crew on the German Ship St Bernard, also out of Bremen.



His residence is Bad Dürkheim, Germany. While in port in New York City on 9 October 1866, Alfred decided to desert from the St Bernard. This is not a Naval ship, so there probably were no consequences. There is a German Emigration index entry for Ernst Alfred Voettiner dated April 1867. His birthdate is given as 26 December 1847 and the birthplace is Stuttgart. His intended destination is North America. On 22 June 1867, Alfred is a passenger on the ship Saxonia departing Hamburg. He is listed as a brewer from Esslingen, age twenty years. On 31 July 1872, Alfred is again departing Germany for New York. He is a 24-year-old passenger on the German ship Cimbria. His occupation is businessman; his home is Iowa, USA.

Alfred Voettiner was naturalized on 5 February 1872 in Cook County, Illinois. A Philadelphia city directory shows an Albert Voettiner, occupation brewer, living there. The 1880 census for Sioux City, Iowa lists an Alfred Voettiner, age 32, living with a family there. His occupation is 'working in a brewery'. His native country is Württemberg (Germany). The last record we have for Alfred Voettiner is as a passenger on the German ship Trave. It arrived in the port of New York on 6 December 1894 after departing Bremen, Germany. Alfred is listed as 47 years old. Because of the bad handwriting, we cannot read his occupation or destination.

**Emil Hermann Eberhard von Georgii-Georgenau, Baron**, son of Emil Wilhelm.

Royal Greek Consul-General for Württemberg; historian and genealogist. Author of *Biographisch Blätter aus und über Schwaben* (Biographical Genealogical Papers from and about Swabia), 1879, Stuttgart.

Born 3 Jun 1848, Stuttgart; died 26 March 1927, Geneva, Switzerland. Married Louise Rosalie Ansermet on 9 March 1869 in Westminster, London, England. She was born on 28 October 1842 in Ormont-Dessus, Aigle, Vaud, Switzerland; she died in Geneva on 19 July 1920. She was the daughter of Jean Samuel Ansermet and Suzanne Marie Parnet. Both were born in Switzerland; they were married on 27 February 1835 in Ormont-Dessus, Aigle, Vaud, Switzerland. Emil Hermann Eberhard and Louise Rosalie von Georgenau had 4 children.

(1) **Sophie Eugenie Flora von Georgii-Georgenau** was born on 17 April 1870 in Bad Boll, Göppingen, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany; she died 29 January 1953 in Chicago, Cook, Illinois, USA. She married Hayden Suffield Barnard on 2 May 1894 in Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He was born on 19 August 1866 in Monroe, Monroe, Michigan, USA; He died on 2 August 1925 in Chicago. Hayden and Sophie Barnard had 6 children (**see below**).

(2) Eugenie Hildegard Adriene von Georgii-Georgenau was born on 1 July 1871 in Stuttgart, Germany; she died on 30 November 1953 in Chicago. Eugenie did not marry. She spent much of her time traveling between the United States and Europe. For example, Sophie Barnard and Eugenie Georgenau were passengers on the ship Berengaria departing Southampton, England and bound for New York. They were transiting through England from Italy. With them were two of Sophie's daughters; Rosalie (age 33) and Sophie (age 25) (see below). Sometime after Sophie's husband died in 1925, Eugenie moved to Chicago and lived with her. The 1940 census

for Chicago shows Eugenie Georgie living with Sophie Barnard and her daughter Rosalie. Eugenie was buried in the Graceland Cemetery, Chicago, along with the rest of the family.

(3) Eberhard Heinrich Friedrich Edgar von Georgii-Georgenau was born on 14 September 1872 in Karlsruhe, Karlsruhe, Baden-Württemberg, Germany; He may have died in 1963 in Baden-Württemberg, but we are not certain. Eberhard Heinrich married Margaret Anna Valentine Melinski on 12 September 1897 in Strasbourg, Bas Rhin, Alsace, France. There is also a reference to the marriage in a July-September British marriage index. The index states that their residence was the Strand District of London. Margaret Anna was born on 8 July 1875 in Colmar, Colmar-Ribeauville, Haut-Rhin, Grand-Est, France. She died on 3 April 1949, possibly in Baden-Württemberg. We have no further information.

(4) Eugen Eberhard von Georgii-Georgenau was born on 29 Jun 1875 in Stuttgart. He died shortly afterward on 8 July 1857.

**Maximilian `Max` Georgii**, son of Julius Friedrich August.

Patent attorney.

Born 24 January 1856 in St. Paul, Hennepin, Minnesota, USA; died 23-December 1928 in München-Pasing, Munich, Bavaria, Germany. On 12 April 1898, he married Phoebe Ann Wagoner in Crawford, Union, New Jersey. She was born in Rouses Point, Clinton, New York, on 31 May 1879; she died on 6 Apr 1936 in Genoa, Liguria, Italy. Phoebe Anne was the daughter of John Harder Wagoner and Josephine Jerusha Fiske. The 1870 census shows that Max and his family have moved from St Paul, Minnesota to Washington DC. Max will grow up and live in Washington, DC. He will make many trips to Germany and back. The last passenger list we have for him is an arrival at the Port of New York on 23 February 1928. His address is Washington, DC. The next record is an American Consular death record stating that he died in München-Pasing on 23 December 1928. The cause of death was bronchial pneumonia. With him at the time of his was his son Dr. Siegfried Georgii. Phoebe was in Washington. Siegfried was living in the apartment where his father died. Phoebe died on 6 April 1936 in Genoa, Italy. She died of chronic myocarditis and other troubles. At the time of his mother's death, Dr. Siegfried Georgii was still living in Pasing, Munich. We note this because Max and Siegfried seem to have extraordinarily strong ties to their homeland. Max and Phoebe Ann Georgii had one child.

(1) **Siegfried Georgii** was born on 2 August 1900 in Washington, DC; he died on 24 June 1966 in Munich, Munich, Bavaria, Germany. He married Abby Wilhelmina Helene Maria Zitzlaff. We have no further information about her or the marriage (**see below**).

**Herman Wilhelm Joseph Weyhardt**, son of Maria Augusta Julia Georgii and Conrad Georg Christian Weyhardt.

Bookkeeper.

Born on 5 April 1861 in Esslingen. He died in Bronx, New York City on 6 September 1917. The cause of death was suffocation by hanging. The death was declared a suicide. He hand-wrote a will on 4 August 1917. The United States had declared war on Germany on 5 April 1917. Perhaps this was a factor, but we will never know. Hermann Wilhelm immigrated to New York On 2 October 1882 and settled in

Brooklyn; he was naturalized on 28 October 1892. In 1906, he was working as a cashier in Brooklyn. By 1910, he was a bookkeeper.

Hermann Wilhelm Weyhardt was married twice. In 1908, he married Carolina Moehringer. Carolina was born in New York City in 1869. She was the daughter of Wilhelm "William" Moehringer (Möhringer) and Catharina Seiler. Both were born in Germany and had several children there before emigrating to Brooklyn. Wilhelm was born on 9 March 1822 in Altdorf, Ortenkreis, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. He was baptized as a Catholic on 10 March 1822 in Altdorf, Freiburg, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. The first Altdorf is a Jewish area. Wilhelm was a cabinet maker who emigrated to Brooklyn on 24 October 1851. Carolina died only two years after marriage on 26 October 1910 in Brooklyn. We have seen no record of children.

Hermann Wilhelm then married Alma Singer. They were married on 7 August 1911 in Brooklyn. Alma was born on 22 June 1870 in Roskow, Beetzsee, Potsdam-Mittelmark, Brandenburg, Germany. We have no further information concerning her birth. Alma died on 3 November 1930 in Brooklyn. We have no information about any children.

**Sophie Eugenie Flora von Georgii-Georgenau, Baroness**, daughter of Baron Emil Hermann Eberhard von Georgii-Georgenau.

She was born on 17 April 1870 in Chicago, Cook, Illinois, USA; she died in Chicago, Cook, Illinois, USA on 29 January 1953. On 2 May 1894, she married Hayden Suffield Barnard in Stuttgart, Stuttgart, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Hayden Suffield served as a physician in Chicago. He was born in Monroe, Monroe County, Michigan on 19 August 1866; he died in Chicago on 2 August 1925. Hayden was the son of Richard Barnard and Marianna Burnett. Richard Barnard was born in London England on 23-April 1832, perhaps in the Spitalfields Christ Church area where he was baptized. Marianna Barnett was born in the Londonderry area of London on 24 August 1830. Richard and Marianna Barnard were married on 16 October 1857 in Chicago. Richard was a merchant.

Sophie von Georgii-Georgenau was a member of Chicago society and used her title of "Baroness", as indicated in her obituary. According to the Chicago Tribune, 31 January 1953, "the former Baroness Sophie von Georgii-Georgenau of Stuttgart Germany" was "widely known as a world traveler, an accomplished linguist, and a musician with an interest in the fine arts. She was a life member of the Art Institute and in recent years took an interest in philanthropies, especially Father Flanagan's Boys Town and the Salvation Army." Hayden Suffield Barnard was a physician in Chicago. According to his obituary in the Chicago Tribune, dated 4 August 1925, "he attended the public schools of Chicago and was graduated from Rush Medical College in 1889. He spent two years abroad and did postgraduate work in hospitals at Vienna, Munich, Heidelberg, and Zurich. Dr. Barnard was a member of the American Medical Association, Chicago Medical Society, and had been vice president of the German Medical Society of Chicago." Hayden and Sophie had 6 children. All but one, Hayden Emil, were born in Chicago.

(1) Rosalie Barnard was born on 2 March 1895 in Chicago; she died on 20 October 1990 in Evanston, Cook Illinois. In 1921, she applied for a passport for the purpose of visiting France, Switzerland, and Belgium to study and visit relatives. Her occupation is High School Teacher. A

passport application filed in 1924 shows similar information. In this case, Rosalie intends to visit relatives in Germany, Switzerland, and Italy. Rosalie did not marry.

(2) Hayden Emil Eberhardt Barnard was born 23 August 1896 in Munich, Munich, Bavaria, Germany; died 28 March 1986 in Chicago. Haden Emil was married twice. His first wife was Alice Loraine Hughes, the daughter of Leslie C. Hughes and Josephine Bielefeld of Chicago. Hayden Emil and Alice Lorraine were married on 13 December 1937 in Chicago. It appears that Alice Lorrain Barnard died shortly after the 1940 census. She was born on 14 August 1918 in Chicago, the daughter of Leslie C. Hughes and Josephine Hatfield. Alice Lorraine had a child with Hayden Emil. Hayden Dorian Barnard, on 1 October 1939 in Chicago. Hayden Dorian married Diane Caroline Mitchell on 11 October 1969 in Manhattan, New York City. She was born on 2 January 1943 in Brooklyn, the daughter of Harold Joseph Mitchell and Estelle Beatrice "Stella" Field.

Hayden Emil's second marriage was to Bettye Jane Cooper. They were married on 1 October 1953 in Chicago. Bettye Jane was born on 17 February 1916 in Decatur, Macon, Illinois. She was the daughter of Alph Franklin Cooper and Henrietta S. Hatfield. Bettye Jane died in Loyalton, Sierra, California in September 1984. Before she married Hayden Emil Barnard, she had been married to James Neill O'Brien. They were married about 1940 in Illinois. James Niell was born on 21 December 1908 in Genoa, DeKalb, Illinois, the son of James Neill "High Pockets" O'Brien and Catherine Phillips. "High Pockets" made a lot of money during prohibition running slot machines in Chicago. Apparently, he was so tall that his pants pockets were at the same level as other people's head. Bettye Jane had a son with James Neill O'Brien. He was adopted by Hayden Emil and was given the surname Barnard. Roger Leslie O'Brien was born on 11 January 1946 in Hinsdale, DuPage, Illinois. On 27 January 1970, Roger Leslie Barnard married Connie Lee Overlin in Evansville, Vanderburgh, Indiana. She was born in Indiana on 25 January 1948.

(3) Richard Edwin Barnard was born on 1 January 1898 in Chicago; he died on 14 November 1946 in Monmouth, Warren, Illinois. Richard Edwin married Okle 'Pansy' Mosley about 1922, probably in Hancock County, Illinois. Okle was born on 3 February 1899 in Carthage, Hancock, Illinois, the daughter of Marion Rufus Mosley and Ora Anne Jones. She died in Chicago on 10 December 1987. Marion Rufus was born 30 October 1871 in Hancock Township, Hancock, Illinois. Ora Anne was born in the same town on 1 September 1872. Richard Edwin and Okle Barnard had one child. Richard Hayden Edwin Barnard was born on 22 November 1922 in Chicago; he died there on 20 January 2007. He married Mary Virginia 'Virginia' Wyatt on 31 October 1948 in Glenview, Cook County, Illinois. She was the daughter of Robert Lyman Wyatt and Allie Sherwood Clay. Richard Lyman was born in Brooklyn, New York on 11 December 1895. He married Allie Sherwood on 5 June 1920 in Tampa, Hillsborough, Florida and died in Glenview, Illinois on 8 August 1962. Allie Sherwood was born in Waycross, Ware, Georgia. She died in Evenston, Cook County, Illinois on 2 February 1997.

(4) Sophie Eugenie 'Jackie' Barnard was born on 12 July 1902 in Chicago. Sophie died in Chicago on 9 March 1929, at the age of 26. She was a secretary.

(5) Harold Suffield 'Bussi' Barnard was born on 5 March 1905 in Chicago; he died there on 2 March 1952. He was married twice.

Harold Suffield Barnard married Kathryn Keller on 12 October 1934, though we are not certain where. Kathryn was born in Dowagiac, Cass, Michigan on 10 September 1908, the daughter of Lawrence Milton Keller and Bessie Mae Reynolds. She died on 20 December 1999 in Normal, McLean, Illinois. Lawrence Milton was born in Bertrand Township, Berrien, Michigan on 6 September 1876. He married Bessie Mae on 16 March 1904 in La Paz, North Township, Marshall, Indiana. She was born in Marshall County, Indiana on 25 May 1883. We have no record of children born to Harold and Kathryn.

Sometime between 1945 and 1949, Harold Suffield married Margaret Irene 'Irene' Block, born Margaret Irene Harris. She had previously been married to Albert William Block; they had been married about 1940 in McLean County, Illinois. Before Irene married Albert William Block, she had been married to William Elmo Truitt. She married Truitt around 1929 in Bloomington, Illinois. Irene's last husband, after Harold Suffield, will be Wilber Harry Benjamin. They were married on 31 August 1965 in Springfield, Sangamon, Illinois.

Margaret Irene Harris was born on 18 April 1910 in Bloomington, McLean, Illinois; she died in Bloomington on 17 August 2004. Her parents were William David Harris and Cornelia R. 'Cornie' Webb. William David Harris was born in Tennessee in October 1902. Cornelia Webb was born in Hawkins County, Tennessee on 14 October 1884. William David married Cornelia on 2 October 1900 in Hawkins County. Irene married William Elmo Truitt around 1929 in Bloomington.

The Bloomington City Directory shows Irene M. Truitt working as a dental technician in the Barnard Dental Laboratory. William E. Truitt is a mechanic at Chevrolet. The 1949 directory shows Mrs. Irene Barnard working as a dental technician at the A.W. Block Dental Laboratory. Hence, the marriage estimates of between 1946 and 1949. Harold S. Barnard is a salesman for Watkins Products in 1949. Note that in 1946, Albert W. Block was a dental technician at the Barnard Dental Laboratory. Irene marries Albert William Block in 1930 in Bloomington. The 1951 directory shows A.W. Block married to Irene M. Block. Albert William dies on 10 September 1969 in Normal, McLean, Illinois. Before marrying Irene, he had been married to Esther Estelle Miller. They were married in 1940 in McLean County. Esther went on to marry George Roe Massey on 5 March 1946 in Guilford County, North Carolina.

Irene finally married Wilber Harry Benjamin on 31 August 1965 in Springfield, Sangamon, Illinois. He was born on 10 April 1920 in Bentown, McLean, Illinois; he died on 14 December 1988 in Danville, Vermilion, Illinois, at the Danville Veterans Administration Medical Center. His last residence was Bloomington. Wilber Harry was the son of Harry J. Benjamin and Bessie Pearl Cornelison. Harry J. Benjamin was born on 6 January 1890 in McLean County. Bessie Pearl was

born on 16 July 1900 in Dawson Township, McLean County. Harry and Bessie were married on 26 November 1919 in Holder, Old Town Township, McLean, Illinois.

(6) Jacqueline Barnard was born on 12 December 1906 in Chicago. We have no further information. She does not appear in the 1910 census and may have died as an infant.

**Siegfried 'Sigfrid' Georgii**, son of Max.

Medical doctor, SS member

Born 2 Aug 1900 in Washington, DC. His father, Max Georgii, was born 24 January 1858 in St. Paul, Minnesota. Max's father was born in Württemberg, Germany. Siegfried's mother, Phoebe Ann Wagner, was born in Rowses Point, Clinton, New York on 31 May 1879. Her parents were born in New York. Max and Phoebe were married on 12 April 1898 in Cranford, Union, New Jersey. Max became a patent attorney in Washington, DC. Max made many trips to Germany. He died in the Pasing district of Munich on 23 December 1928 of bronchial pneumonia. At the time of his death, Phoebe was in Washington and Siegfried was living in the apartment where his father died. Phoebe died on 6 April 1936 in Genoa, Italy. She died of chronic myocarditis and other troubles. At the time of his mother's death, Dr. Siegfried Georgii was still living in Pasing, Munich.

Some genealogies state that Siegfried was married twice. We have no confirmation of this. One spouse was named Abbie Wilhelmina Helena Maria Zitzlaff. The other spouse was named Rudolphine Maria Haas. A 1968 Munich phone directory, two years after Siegfried's death, shows an engineer named Siegfried Georgii and a woman named Rudolphine Georgii living at separate residences. It is possible that this is Siegfried's son and wife. Earlier Munich directories list Siegfried as a medical doctor.

There are two passport applications filed with American consulates in Germany. The first was filed Frankfurt-on-Main on 12 October 1921. The second was filed on 16 November 1923 in Stuttgart. They are similar in content, so we will describe the 1923 application.

The 1923 U.S. passport application, sworn at the American Consulate in Stuttgart, states that his permanent home was now Tübingen, Germany. He left the United States in 1903 or 1904. He arrived in Tübingen in 1921. He was currently studying medicine. He resided in the following countries: Belgium 1904 to 1905), Italy (1905 to 1913), and Germany (1913 to date). Of course, this protracted stay was bound to raise questions concerning the issuance of a passport. In an affidavit to explain the protracted foreign residence, Siegfried states the following:

"I was taken to Europe by my father when four years old and was left here to be educated. I studied in Italy until 1913 and then came to Germany where I have since been studying medicine. During the war, I was recognized as an American citizen by the German officials. My father comes to Europe to visit me nearly every year and I expect to return to the United States as soon as I have completed my studies. This should be in two or three years."

This explanation was accepted, and a new passport was issued on 7 December 1923. We have evidence of one return voyage to the United States. He is listed as a passenger on the SS Columbus, departing Breme, Germany, on 15 January 1929 and arriving at the port of New York on 26 January



1929. His occupation is Physician. His ultimate destination is Munich. His length of stay in the United States will be 6 months. While in the U.S., he will be visiting his mother, Phoebe Georgii, in Washington, DC. Siegfried was an American in name only.

According to a Wikipedia article ( [https://de.wikipedia.org/wiki/Siegfried\\_Georgii](https://de.wikipedia.org/wiki/Siegfried_Georgii) ) Siegfried Georgii received his doctorate degree in 1927 at the University of Tübingen in Germany. In 1932, he was an assistant in the midwifery school at Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität Munich. At this time, he became Untersturmführer (under assault leader) in the SS. In 1933, he was appointed SturmHauptführer (chief assault leader, SS equivalent to captain in the German army) and then Sturmbannführer (assault unit leader, equivalent to major). In 1934, he became Obersturmbannführer (senior assault leader, equivalent to lieutenant colonel) and then Standartenführer (equivalent to full colonel). On 20 April 1935, Siegfried was promoted to Oberführer (equivalent to either brigadier general or a senior colonel).

Siegfried Georgii worked as an SS doctor, head of medical department at the Reichsführer SS in February 1934. He was awarded the SS-Ehrenring (the SS ring with the skull and crossbones). He was a liaison with the Nazi Medical Association.

There are Munich phone directories for this period. They show Dr. Siegfried Georgii only as a medical doctor. Sometimes, as in 1934, his occupation is listed as med., Facharzt f. Frauenleiden u. Geburtshilfe, Chefarzt d. Mütterheims München (medical specialist for woman's ailments and obstetrics head doctor at the Munich mother's home).

The United States Federal Register Volume 12 dated 3 September 1947 designated Siegfried Georgii of Munich as a national of an alien country. The Attorney General of the United States is authorized to confiscate all property.

The phone directory entry closest to the end of the war is for 1949. Siegfried's occupation is Fachartz f. Frauenkrankh (medical specialist for women's disease). This is the same occupation listed in the 1965 Munich directory. It appears that he continued to practice until his death. Siegfried died in Munich, on 24 June 1966.
